Rochester Mayo's Bob Daugherty has lost only two tennis matches in three years yet the 6-foot-5 junior still is looking for his first state title.

As a freshman Bob teamed with his brother Dave, who was 6'2" then. They got to the finals of the state tournament before losing their first match.

Last year the younger Daugherty turned to singles play and went unbeaten until the finals of the state meet where he lost to Robb Jones of Edina.

Daugherty defeated Minnesota's Dick Halverson 4-6, 6-2 today to earn the right to meet Jones again in the final. Daugherty's triumph all but assured Edina of the team title over Minneapolis.

Friday Daugherty won two opening-round matches to advance to the semi-finals against the St. Paul Racquet Club Edina and Minneapolis advanced to the finals in the doubles.

Daugherty has come to losing. He came close again yesterday in the quarter-final against Dave Stearns of St. Cloud Tech.

Daugherty, who was rated third in the final tennis race behind Daugherty and Jones, won the first set 6-2. Daugherty rallied and pulled out two extra-sets victories, 9-7 and 7-5.

Daugherty covers so much of the court with his size, noted Edina coach John Matton. "It's hard to lob the ball over him and when he's at the net he can reach you out. Serving definitely is his big asset, and he keeps his posture better than any younger I've seen."
