not even the amazing Mets could approach Casey's managerial reign.

The Twins led 5-1 after five innings behind nine-game winner Dean Chance.

After 14 Tiger batters had whiffed, Chance, Jim Ollson and Jim Grant for 10 runs in the sixth, Detroit held an 11-5 advantage.

**THE TIGERS'** sixth went like this:

Kaline and Willie Horton strided, Kaline scored on left fielder Bob Allison's error. Norm Cash walked, Bill Freehan singled Horton home, but Cash was thrown out at third on a perfect throw by centerfielder Cesar Tovar for the first out.

Mickey Stanley bounced an infield single over the mound. With a 3-0 count on pinch-hitter Gatts Brown, Chance was relieved by Ollson, who completed the walk. Pinch-hitter Jim Price singled to right for two more runs. McAuliffe walked to finish Ollson.

**GRANT CAME** in to throw five pitches for three hits. With a 2-0 count, Don Wert singled to left to drive home two runs. Kaline singled to left for another run. Horton singled to left for the eighth runs of the inning.

Jim Roland relieved Grant. A wild pitch enabled Kaline to score. A passed ball sent Horton to third base, and he scored on Cash's sacrifice fly.

Now it was the Twins' turn in the swinging sixth.

Left-handed John Podres was pitching for Detroit in relief of Denny McLain, who left for a pinch-hitter and gained his seventh victory in 14 decisions because of the Tigers' comeback.

Podres walked Zoilo Versalles and pinch-hitter Frank Quilici to start the Twins' five-run rally. Pinch-hitter Earl Battey singled to left, and Cesar Tovar to right, each driving in a run.

**THE RIGHT-HANDED** Wickensham stepped in to replace Podres on the mound for Detroit.

Rod Carew popped out. Harmon Killebrew lined out to left field. Oleva was hit by a pitched ball to fill the bases.

Center fielder Stanley, whom the Tigers play for defense, dropped Bob Allison's pop fly to allow three unearned runs, which brought the Twins to 11-10.

But Detroit raked Ron Kline for three runs in the seventh to put it away at 14-10. The Tigers finished with a run in the eighth off Jim Perry for a 15-10 finale.

**TWIN TOPICS:** Jim Kast (2-7) will work for the Twins tonight. Earl Wilson (9-3) for Detroit in an 8 o'clock game at the Met.

Surgery has been delayed on Twins third baseman Ron Clark's right elbow until he returns from a check at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn.

Charlie Murray, 72 at Orlando, will pitch the Twins' exhibition game at Indianapolis of the Pacific Coast League Tuesday night.

The Twins signed pitcher Don Brown of Clarksville, Tenn., and third baseman Larry Agrella of San Jose, Calif., to Sarasota, Fla. contracts.

Mike Sadek, University of Minnesota catcher, worked out with the Twins in infield practice last night and is about ready to sign a St. Cloud contract. Sadek is asking about \$15,000.

Manager Cal Ermer has switched from No. 24, and now is wearing his age on his uniform, No. 43.
