## Billy Martin Gets 2 Hits in Exhibition

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. — Orlando with a 9-2 record. "The kid looked good at second base," said Twins coach Billy Martin Tuesday night.

Martin, 39, entered the exhibition game with the Indianapolis Indians as a pinch-hitter in the sixth inning and doubled. He played the last four innings at second base (handling two chances without an error) and added a bunt single.

The Twins, however, lost 11-10 to the Pacific Coast League team.

Martin played in the major leagues from 1950-1961, the first 7½ seasons with the Yankees. He played second base with the Twins in 1961 (averaging .246), then retired. He scouted for Minnesota from 1962-64, then became a coach in 1965.

**THE TWINS** got bases-empty home runs from Zoilo Versalles (in the first inning) and Frank Kostro (in the sixth) last night and scored seven runs in the eighth inning.

Indianapolis scored six runs in the first two innings off Twins farmhand Charley Murray, who came up from

Orlando with a 9-2 record. The 21-year-old right-hander was wild.

Jim Ollom and Jim Roland finished up for the Twins.

For Indianapolis, Chuck Holle, a hometown boy bidding for a job, checked the
