

NICHOLS SAYS: Tough Greens at Hazeltine

As defending champion in the Minnesota Classic, Bobby Nichols should be a moment's place his hands behind his head and ponder what lies ahead for the 144 entries this weekend.

The 31-year-old Kentuckian, one of the genuinely nice guys on the pro tour, got his first look at Hazeltine in the pro-amateur

event Wednesday and shot 67.3.

Could Nichols compare Keller, where he won the Classic a year ago with a 72-hole score of 270, with Hazeltine?

"Everybody is talking about the length of this course," he said. "It's long all right, and it may take a 5 to 6 to the green instead of the 4 to 5, and I'm sure we were hitting at Keller. But I think the real difference is in the greens. At Keller they were, for the most part, pretty flat. These are much more rolling. Hazeltine's greens remind me of those at the Masters.

"This is not a criticism of Keller's greens, because they were all right. There are inclined to be a little gray. It's a fairly new Classic.

Twins Win 3-2 in 18 for Split

NEW YORK, N.Y. — The fifth-place Twins needed their longest game in Minnesota history—18 innings—to break a seven-game losing streak with a 3-2 victory over the New York Yankees in the second game Wednesday night.

The Yankees won the first game 6-1 on a pair of home runs by Joe Peptonone.

The Twins' previous longest game in history was played at New York, Aug. 6, 1961. The Yankees won that one 5-2 in 15 innings.

"Now that we've got out of that losing ruts," said Twins manager Cal Ermer, "we can start rolling again. Often, it takes the unusual hit that long one to shake a club loose."

The Twins will conclude the Yankee series with a single game this afternoon.

"We don't have anything in the past to go on," Waryan said Wednesday, "because this is the first men's tournament on this course. But I believe anyone shooting a 282 will win."

If the weather conditions were absolutely perfect all four days, I might go a stroke or two lower.

Howie Johnson, who had a 69 in the pro-amateur yesterday, agreed with Waryan.

"Four 90s would give me a 276," he said. "With that I could run away and hole in 14 here. It won by four or five shots."

Onlookers wondered why Bierman penalized the entire squad when the blunder might have been attributable to one or two men.

His theory, he surmised, was that football is a team game and failure anywhere is a team failure.

While taking those long laps, the players had to be thinking. The one or two responsible had their own thoughts. The others puffingly resolved to pay attention and not, themselves, be responsible for the next command to "Take a lap."

U.S. TEAM Gal Swimmers Have Skill, Youth

WINNIPEG, Canada — The short-haired impostor who makes up the United States Pan-American women's swimming team have an average age of just over 16 years.

Claudia Kolb, 17, is the world record holder in the 200 and 400-meter individual medleys. The same distinction is shared by Pam Kruse, 17, in the 400-meter freestyle and Caste Bull, 17, in the 200-meter breast stroke.

And then there is Debbie Meyer, a 14-year-old blonde who astounded enthusiasts of swimming with world records in the 800 and 1,500-meter freestyle in the same historic race July 9.

The girl who finished second to Debbie was Sue Peterson, 15 1/2.

"There are times," said Sherman Chavon, coach of these remarkable young women, "when I wonder if this madness will ever stop."

FIRST GAME- JOE PEPTONE, who hit 31 home runs in 1966, hit his eighth and ninth of 1967 to give the Yankees a 6-1 victory in the opener.

THE TWINS got their usual on-cusp alignment on Bob Allison's 14th homer to open the first inning.

After that, infelicitous Steve Barber and Steve Hamilton combined to blank the Twins on seven hits.

Barber, a Baltimore reject and only a shadow of his former, fan-baiting self, eviscerated his New York record on July 24. He hit four home runs in the fifth inning on Horace Clark's double and outfield fly balls by Roy White and Bill Robinson.

ATLANTA, Ga. — The Cincinnati Reds placed Fred Robinson on the disabled list and reactivated Tommy Harper. Both are outfielders.

Robinson twisted his right knee in the 10th game here Tuesday night. He was removed from the game in the fourth inning.
