John Miller replaced McLain and Mincher, who had homered twice in the opener, hit the reliever's first pitch off the second deck fence in right center for his 25th homer, giving the Angels a 4-3 lead.

California struck for three more runs in the fourth, with Lopez' two-run triple the big blow, and added another run in the fifth to go five runs ahead.

Winner Jim McGlothlin, who took over for starter Rick Clark in the 13th, blanked the Tigers until the seventh, when Dick McAuliffe's two-run single closed the gap. Mincher Rojas, the Angels ace reliever, 18th stumped the door and checked off the Tigers in the eighth before giving way to George Brunet.

Rick Reichardt's second inning homer sent the Angels ahead 1-0, but the Tigers rocked Clark for three runs in the second on Ed Mathew's double, Jim Norbrup's 10th homer, a walk and McAuliffe's triple.

After Mincher's homer sent the Angels in front to stay, they roughed up Hiller and Mike Marshall, another rookie reliever, in the fourth. Two walks, a force out and McGlothlin's infield hit brought one run home before Lopez unloaded his triple to right center.

A double by Reichardt and Bob Rodgers' run-out single completed the California assault in the fifth against Hank Aguirre, the fifth of eight Detroit pitchers.

McGlothlin, 12-4, stopped the Tigers on one hit in the first four innings he worked, then was tagged for singles by Bill Freehan and Don Wert with one out in the seventh. The runners advanced on a ground out before scoring on McAuliffe's single to center. Rojas then came on and got pinch-hitter Guss Brown on a fly to right, ending the rally.

The Tigers mounted a final threat in the ninth when Freehan doubled and Don Wert drew a walk with none out. Brunet then replaced Rojas, retired pinch-hitter Jim Fregent on a fly to left and got McAuliffe to bounce into a game-ending double play.

PORT HURON, Mich. — Jack McCartan, former All-American goalie at the University of Minnesota, turned away 25 successive shots Sunday night to lead the California Seals to a 2-0 pre-season game victory over the Minnesota North Stars.

Playing the first half of the game, McCartan blanked the North Stars with 19 saves in the opening period and six more in the first 10 minutes of the second.

By the time McCartan was replaced by Gary Smith, the Seals had a 2-0 lead on goals by Wally Boyer and Bobby Baun. Baun fired a 40-foot slap shot past Gary Bauman, the first of three Minnesota goalies.

The North Stars pulled within 2-1 on Dave Balon's goal at 14:25 of the second period, but fell behind 3-1 when Kent Douglas scored for California from the point at 8:01 of the third.

Bill Masterton, former U.S. National player bidding for a berth on the Minnesota roster, scored the final goal at 17:31 on a pass from Parker MacDonald.
