Kilebrew Hits 2; Twins Win



Harmon Killebrew After 43rd Home Run

The professionals—Jim Kaat, Harmon Killebrew and Bob Allison—put the Twins back into undisputed possession of first place in the American League with a 7-3 victory over California at Metropolitan Stadium Tuesday.

Kaat, unbeaten in September, reeled off his seventh straight with a five-hit, 15-strike out performance against the Angels yesterday. He now leads the season Saturday and Sunday in Boston.

Killebrew hit home runs No. 42 and No. 43 to tie Boston's Carl Yastrzemski for the American League lead. He hit a two-run homer in the sixth inning off losing pitcher Jim McGlothlin to bring the Twins from a 2-2 deficit to a 3-2 superiority.

Killebrew homered after Cesar Tovar singled in the sixth inning, a 435-footer over the centerfield screen. Harmon did it again in the seventh inning off relief pitcher Per Cima, 430 feet into the left-center pavilion.

"Never," said Twins manager Cal Ermer, "has Killebrew hit a more important home run since I've been managing, and I've wanted to say he's never hit two for greater distance in one game in his career."

Williams Says His Bosox Running Out of Tomorrow's

BOSTON, Mass.—(AP)—"Get 'em tomorrow, that one's gone—but we're running out of tomorrow," Boston manager Dick Williams said Tuesday after Cleveland had joined his team's pennant hopes with a 6-3 victory.

"We last played poorly," Williams said in the quiet Red Sox dressing room. He said starting pitcher Gary Bell, who gave up three runs in three innings, was "just off today," and reliever Joe Satterno, who was tagged for two homers in a three-run Cleveland victory, "happen to have his stuff."

Williams was also unhappy about his team's defensive play in the third inning. Center-fielder Reggie Smith, shortstop Rico Petrocelli and second baseman Jerry Adair allowed Max Alvis' fly ball to fall among them; then Smith compounded the lapse by firing the ball into the outfield.
