#### WILD LIFE:

89-73

The Blue Jays wrapped up the regular season with an 89-73 record, 3rd place in the AL East...Claimed the 3rd AL Wild Card spot, entering the postseason as a Wild Card for the 2nd straight year and the 4th time overall...Have gone 1-4 in Wild Card contests all-time...Lost both games vs. Seattle last season and dropped both contests in Tampa Bay in 2020...Won the one-game playoff vs. Baltimore in 2016.

#### MANAGING EXPECTATIONS:

John Schneider has gone 135-101 since taking over as Toronto's Manager last July...The .572 win% is the highest all-time by a Blue Jays Manager through his first two seasons (2nd: Cito Gaston - .566)...Is the only Manager in team history to reach the playoffs in each of his first two seasons at the helm.

#### GAUS FOR EXCITEMENT:

- Kevin Gausman gets the start for Game 1 today, his 3rd career playoff start (8th game)...Set a career high this season with 237 strikeouts (227 in 2021)...Were the most in the AL, behind only Spencer Strider (281) for the MLB lead, and 4th most in a single season in team history.
- The righty also ranked 1st in the AL in K rate (31.1%) and SO/9 (11.53) while finishing 4th in ERA (3.16), 6th in SO/BB (4.31), 10th in innings pitched (185.0), and 11th in WHIP (1.18)...Topped all AL pitchers with a 5.3 fWAR...Threw 100+ pitches on 18 occasions, tied with Blake Snell for the most in MLB.

#### FEELING GEORGEOUS LATELY:

- George Springer played in 154 games this year, his 2nd-highest total for a single season (162 in 2016)... Over his last 49 games, batted .284 (56-for-197) with 30 runs scored, 11 doubles, eight homers, 30 RBI, and 22 walks (.815 OPS)...His 30 hits in Sept./Oct. tied for 7th most in the AL.
- The outfielder has batted .270 (72-for-267) with 34 extra-base hits, 38 RBI, and 31 walks over his 65 career playoff games (.889 OPS)...His 19 career postseason home runs are tied with Albert Pujols for 5th most all-time.

#### ONE NOTCH AT A TIME:

Brandon Belt homered three times in his last four games of the season, giving him 19 dingers for the year, the 2nd most of his careeer (29 in 2021)...Went 29-for-101 (.287) with 23 runs scored, five doubles, 11 home runs, 17 RBI, and 18 walks over his last 30 contests (.400 OBP, 1.063 OPS)...His 1.063 OPS and .663 SLG from Aug. 1 to the end of the season was the best among AL hitters while he ranked T-8th in OBP (min. 100 PA)...His 4.45 pitches/PA this season topped all MLB batters (min. 300 PA)...His walk rate of 6.62 PA/BB was 5th highest in the AL.

#### **BO KNOWS BASE HITS:**

Bo Bichette recorded 175 hits this season, 4th most among AL batters, despite missing 25 games over two IL stints...**His 77 opposite-field hits led the Majors** (2nd: Luis Arraez - 66)...Finished 3rd in the AL with a .306 batting average...Tied with Julio Rodríguez for the most games with 4+ hits in the AL at six, tied for 3rd with 15 games with 3+ hits, and tied for 4th with 52 multi-hit games this season.

#### ROAD READY:

- The Blue Jays put together a 46-35 road record this season for a .568 win%, tied for 3rd best in the AL (T-5th in MLB)...The 46 road wins were the 2nd most in a season in team history (47 in 1993)...Held a better road record than home record for the first time since 2003.
- Blue Jays hitters ranked 2nd among AL clubs with a .334 road OBP while sitting 3rd in road batting average (.263), road SLG (.431), and road OPS (.765)...The pitching staff finished 2nd in the AL in road ERA (3.88), 9th in road opponents' average (.252), and 10th in road WHIP (1.28).

#### WELCOME TO THE VAR-SHOW:

Daulton Varsho played in a career-high 158 games and reached the 20-homer mark for the 2nd time in his career...Recorded an MLB-high 29 defensive runs saved this season (2nd: Fernando Tatis Jr. - 27)... His 18 DRS in center tied for 2nd most among center fielders while his 11 DRS in left were 3rd most among left fielders.

#### PITCHING IN:

Toronto pitchers combined for a 3.78 ERA in 2023, 2nd best in the AL behind Seattle's 3.74 mark (4th in MLB)...The 3.78 ERA was 7th best in team history and the club's best since 2016 (3.78)...**Recorded a franchise-record 1,528 strikeouts** (1,468 in 2021) which was good for 2nd most in MLB this season (1st: MIN - 1,560)...Ranked 6th in the AL in opponents' batting average (.241) and 7th in WHIP (1.25)...The rotation combined for 70 quality starts, tied for 3rd most in the AL (T-5th in MLB)

#### **BINARY RESULTS:**

The Blue Jays kept opponents to one or no runs on an MLB-high 42 occasions this season (2nd: LAD - 36)...The 42 contests set a club record, besting the 40 such efforts in 1991.

#### THE D-JAYS:

The Blue Jays kept a .988 fielding percentage this season (4th in the AL)...Made just one error over their final 12 contests...Played 107 error-free games in 2023, the most in team history (103 in 1990).

According to Sports Info Solutions, Toronto fielders recorded a total of 82 Defensive Runs Saved, the most in the Majors (2nd: MIL - 68)...The group is led by an MLB-high 36 runs saved in center field, twice as many as any other team (2nd: PHI - 18).

- George Springer went 10-for-22 (.455) with six doubles, an RBI, and three walks while recording hits in all six games vs. Minnesota this season (.520 OBP, .727 SLG)...Has batted .310 (58-for-187) with 15 doubles, 12 home runs, and 35 RBI across 48 career meetings (.993 OPS).
- Bo Bichette went 9-for-27 (.333) with a triple, two homers, and seven RBI in the six games against the Twins this year...Has hit .310 (27-for-87) with 11 extra-base hits and 16 RBI over 20 career contests vs. MIN (.881 OPS).
- Whit Merrifield leads all current Blue Jays with 110 games played vs. the Twins...Has batted .298 (134for-449) with 34 doubles, three triples, five home runs, and 48 RBI along the way (.769 OPS).

## STARTING PITCHER

## Kevin Gausman, RHP #34

#### **TODAY'S GAME:**

- Making his 8th career postseason appearance (3rd start) and his 2nd in a Blue Jays uniform...Started Game 2 of last season's Wild Card Series at Rogers Centre against the Mariners, giving up 4 runs over 5.2 innings with 5 hits, a walk, and 7 strikeouts.
- Named an All-Star for the 2nd time in his career (also: 2021).
- His career-high 237 strikeouts were the most in the AL (2nd: Pablo López 234), and are the 4th most ever by a Blue Jay in a single season (Roger Clemens 292 in 1997, Roger Clemens 271 in 1998, Robbie Page 244 in 2021) Ray - 248 in 2021).
- Also ranked 1st in the AL in K rate (31.1%) and SO/9 (11.53) while finishing 4th in ERA (3.16), 6th in SO/BB (4.31), 10th in innings pitched (185.0), and 11th in WHIP (1.18)...Topped all AL pitchers with a 5.3 fWAR...Threw 100+ pitches on 18 occasions, tied with Blake Snell for the most in MLB.
- Has struck out at least 200 batters in each of the last 3 seasons, one of five Major Leaguers to do so (Burnes, Cease, Cole, Nola).
- Owns a 2.84 FIP since the start of the 2020 season, the best mark among qualified hurlers (2nd: Corbin Burnes 2.85).

#### 2023 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Picked up his 11th win of the year on 9/9 vs. KC, throwing 8.0 frames of one-run ball with 2 hits, a walk, and 10 strikeouts...Was his AL-leading 8th start with double-digit strikeouts.
- Earned his 10th win of the year on 8/28 vs. WAS, giving up 3 runs over 5.0 innings (7H, 2BB, 7K)...Became the 3rd pitcher in team history with back-to-back 200-strikeout seasons, joining Roger Clemens (1997-1998) and Roy Halladay (2008-2009).
- Took the loss on 6/27 vs. SF, tossing 6.0 frames of one-run ball with 3 hits, a walk, and 12 strikeouts...Fanned LaMonte Wade Jr. in the 4th inning to reach 1,500 career strikeouts, becoming the 21st active player to reach the mark...Was his MLB-leading 7th double-digit strikeout game of 2023.
- Pitched 7.0 frames of one-run ball on 6/6 vs. HOU, scattering 4 hits with no walks and a career-high-tying 13 strikeouts (also: 13K on 4/29/23 vs. SEA)...Became the 4th player (8th time) in franchise history to punch out at least 13 batters without any walks in a single game (last: José Berríos on 7/12/22 vs. PHI).
- Tossed 7.0 shutout innings on 4/29 vs. SEA, giving up 5 hits with a walk and a career-high 13 strikeouts...Threw a then season-high 108 pitches (74 strikes) while inducing a career-high 28 swing-and-misses...Got 20 whiffs on his splitter alone, the most on a single pitch in the Majors this season, and the most on a splitter in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008).

#### **VS. THE TWINS:**

Facing the Twins for the 3rd time this season and the 12th time in his career...In his last 3 trips to Target Field, has posted a 2.20 ERA (4 ER/16.1 IP) with 18 strikeouts, giving up no more than 3 runs in any start.


