THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game, eight-day roadtrip with a record of 3-4 (2-2 at Yankee Stadium and 1-2 at Fenway Park), the Twins began their 10-game homestand with consecutive losses to the Nationals...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale against the Nats...they will continue the homestand tomorrow night with the first of three games against the Yankees, followed by four games against the Royals (April 27-30)...the Twins have gone 4-4 at Target Field and 7-6 on the road.
* Twins are looking to avoid falling to .500 today for the first time this season.

NOT KUHLL, TWINS LOSE GAME TWO TO NATS: The Twins lost to Chad Kuhl and the Nationals yesterday afternoon by a score of 10-4, securing a series defeat, their third this season and first at home...Pablo López (1-2) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs on eight hits in 4.0 innings pitched...Simeon Woods Richardson made his second career appearance and 2023 debut with 4.2 innings of relief, throwing 97 pitches...it marked the most pitches thrown by a Twins reliever since Andrew Albers threw 108 pitches in 6.0 innings in the second game of a doubleheader on August 11, 2016 vs. Houston...the offense recorded nine hits as Carlos Correa reached four times, going 3-for-4 with a walk...Byron Buxton added a home run, his third of the season.

IT'S OVERTIME: The Twins announced today that they have recalled right-handed pitcher Bailey Ober from Triple-A St. Paul...Ober has made four starts for the Saints this season, going 2-1, 2.55 ERA (17.2 IP, 5 ER), six walks, 22 strikeouts and a .197 (13-for-66) opponent batting average...he has pitched 11.0-straight scoreless innings over his last two starts with the Saints and was named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week earlier today...to make room for Ober on the 26-man roster, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Simeon Woods Richardson to Triple-A St. Paul.

* Ober made four starts in spring training for the Twins, going 0-0, 2.70 ERA (10.0 IP, 3 ER) with three walks and nine strikeouts...he was the odd man out of the five-man rotation and optioned to Triple-A St. Paul on March 26, just four days prior to Opening Day.

NATIONAL NEWS: The Twins have gone 1-4 in Interleague Play this season, going 1-2 in Miami from April 3-5, followed by two losses against the Nationals...the Twins' next IL series will be May 9-11 vs. San Diego at Target Field.

* The Twins are 9-11 all-time against the Montreal/Washington franchise...the Twins have gone just 1-9 in their last 10 vs. the Nats, dating back to 2013...excluding a three-game series sweep in Montreal in 2004, the Twins are 6-11 all-time against Washington (since 2007).

* Jose Miranda is hitting .319 (23-for-72) with three doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI, a .486 slugging percentage and an .828 OPS in 20 career Interleague games.

* Byron Buxton is hitting .297 (11-for-37) with two doubles, five home runs, six RBI and a 1.123 OPS in his last 10 IL games.

BUCK TRUCK SWITCHING GEARS: After an 0-for-15 stretch from April 13-18, Byron Buxton has hit safely in three straight, hitting .333 (4-for-12) with two doubles, one home run, three runs scored, two walks and just two strikeouts in that span with a .750 slugging percentage and a 1.179 OPS...his average exit velocity in that span is 94.0 mph (league avg in that span — 89.0 mph).

RISPY BUSINESS: The Twins are hitting .321 (45-for-140) with runners in scoring position this season, ranking third in all of baseball, trailing Texas (.372) and Tampa Bay (.333)... additionally, they are hitting .304 (21-for-69) with RISP and two outs, fourth best in baseball.
* Notable individuals with RISP: Ryan Jeffers is 2-for-6 (.333), Joey Gallo is 3-for-6 (.500), Donovan Solano is 5-for-9 (.556), Christian Vázquez is 5-for-7 (.714), Trevor Larnach is 7-for-17 (.412), Jose Miranda is 7-for-19 (.368) and Michael A. Taylor is 4-for-11 (.364).

LEAVE THE BROOMS ALONE: Twins are looking to avoid being swept today for the first time this season...last time they were swept was in three games at Kansas City from September 20-22, 2022...last time they were swept at Target Field was August 20-22, 2022 vs. Texas (3 games)...Minnesota was swept seven times in 2022.

SOUTHPAW STORIES: The Twins are facing a left-handed starter for just the fourth time this season, the previous two being Jesus Luzardo on April 5 at Miami (5-2 loss), Nestor Cortes on April 14 at New York-AL (4-3 win) and Chris Sale on April 18 at Boston (5-4 loss)...the Twins have the fewest at-bats against left-handed pitchers in the league with just 117.

* Twins are slashing just .197/.267/.333 with four home runs vs. lefties (Correa, Gallo, Garlick and Larnach)...against right-handers, the Twins are .235/.304/.388.

* Carlos Correa is hitting .373 (22-for-59) with a 1.198 OPS against left-handed pitching in his last 31 games, since August 9, 2022.

SOLANO SMOKING: Donovan Solano is leading off for the fourth time this season, first since April 18 at Boston...he has hit safely in 11 of his last 14 games, since April 5...in that span, he is hitting .326 (15-for-46) with four doubles, three walks and a .404 on-base percentage.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Triple-A St. Paul right-handed pitcher Bailey Ober and Low-A Fort Myers catcher Andrew Cossetti have been named Twins minor league Pitcher and Player of the Week.

* Ober, who was recalled this morning, made the start on Tuesday vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, earning the win after pitching 5.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts.

* Cossetti, 23, recorded nine hits and walked three times, hitting three home runs, while posting a 2.134 OPS in 17 plate appearances...the Eagleville, Pennsylvania native was selected by the Twins in the 11th round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia.

SPRING RECAP: Ober started four Grapefruit League games, going 0-0, 2.70 ERA (10.0 IP, 3 ER) with three walks and nine strikeouts...logged three consecutive scoreless outings to start the spring against Philadelphia, Toronto and Pittsburgh on March 1, 8 and 14, for a total of 6.0 innings...pitched 4.0 innings and allowed three runs, including two home runs, on March 25 against Atlanta in a 9-5 Twins loss...did not factor into the decision...was optioned to Triple-A Saint Paul on March 26.

LAST MLB OUTING: Finished his 2022 campaign with a no-decision at the Chicago White Sox on October 3, 2022 at Guaranteed Rate Field...pitched 5.0 innings, allowing two hits and two earned runs with one walk and four strikeouts...surrendered a two-run home run to infielder Josh Harrison in the bottom of the second inning, only the fourth home run against him in 2022...left with the score tied 2-2; Twins eventually lost 3-2...completed 5.0 innings for the fifth consecutive start and the ninth time in 11 starts last season, after only logging 5.0 innings in 10 of 20 starts in 2021, his rookie season.

ACROSS THE RIVER: In his four starts with Triple-A Saint Paul this year, Ober went 2-1, 2.55 ERA (17.2 IP, 5 ER) with six walks and 22 strikeouts...leads the Saints (among qualifying pitchers) in ERA and strikeouts...ranked second in WHIP (1.08) and opponent batting average (.197)...he is tied for fourth in strikeouts in the International League...in his last start on April 18, Ober earned the win in the Saints' 6-0 victory against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre after pitching 5.0 scoreless innings, allowing three hits, walking one batter and fanning six...was named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week for last week.

AGAINST WASHINGTON: Facing the Nationals for the first time in his career...Washington will be the 12th team that he has faced...is 0-2, 4.41 ERA (49.0 IP, 24 ER) with 11 walks and 50 strikeouts when facing an opponent for the first time...has only faced two National League teams previously, pitching vs. Cincinnati on June 22, 2021 and at St. Louis on July 31, 2021...combined to go 0-0, 5.40 ERA (8.1 IP, 5 ER) with three walks and eight strikeouts in those two Interleague starts (Twins went 1-1).

BACK ON TARGET: Ober went 2-0, 3.38 ERA (24.0 IP, 9 ER) with six walks and 28 strikeouts in five 2022 home starts...pitched slightly better on the road last season, going 0-3, 3.09 ERA (32.0 IP, 11 ER) with five walks and 23 strikeouts in six starts away from Target Field...he ranked ninth in home strikeouts among Twins pitchers.

Ober is 4-1, 3.88 ERA (72.0 IP, 32 ER) with 17 walks and 77 strikeouts in 15 career starts at home...Twins went 10-5 in his home starts...despite having a better career ERA on the road (3.77) than at home (3.88), he has only won one of his 16 career road starts, going 1-5, 3.77 ERA (76.1 IP, 32 ER) with 13 walks and 70 strikeouts (Twins are 8-8 in his road starts).

LEFT AND RIGHT: In the 2022 season, righties posted a .205/.228/.328 slash line (25-for-122) with four doubles, three home runs and 34 strikeouts against Ober...lefties slashed .258/.323/.382 (23-for-89) with six doubles, one home run, eight walks and 17 strikeouts.

In his career, right handed hitters are batting .223/.244/.425 with 11 doubles and 89 strikeouts against Ober...lefties are slashing .277/.337/.454 with 15 doubles and 58 strikeouts off Ober in his career.

ARSENAL: In his 11 starts last season Ober used a four-pitch mix, per Baseball Savant...primarily relied on his four-seam fastball and slider...here's a look at his repertoire:

- Made Twins Opening Day roster for first time in career and was club's number three starter April 10 vs. Seattle, allowing four runs on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with two walks and four strikeouts, earning the win in a Twins 10-4 victory.
Made four starts for Twins from April 10-28, going 1-1, 2.75 ERA (19.2 IP, 6 ER), with five walks and 16 strikeouts before being placed on 10-day Injured List with a right groin strain on April 30.
Made one start on rehab assignment with Triple-A St. Paul May 15...returned from rehab assignment and reinstated from IL May 21.
Made three more starts for Twins from May 22-June 1, going 0-1, 5.79 ERA (14.0 IP, 9 ER) and was placed on 15-day Injured List with a right groin strain on June 6...transferred to 60-day IL on July 30.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP SONNY GRAY (2023: 2-0, 0.82 ERA // CAREER: 92-77, 3.52 ERA)

Right-hander Sonny Gray is set to start the first game of a three-game series vs. the New York Yankees at Target Field tomorrow...faced the Boston Red Sox in his last start on April 18 at Fenway Park, tossing 5.0 innings with seven hits and one run allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts in a no-decision...Twins lost 5-4...facing New York-AL for the first time this season and the seventh time in his career, going 1-2, 4.04 ERA (35.2 IP, 16 ER) with 14 walks and 33 strikeouts in six previous starts vs. the Yankees...pitched for New York-AL from 2017-18.

CAREER NOTES

- Began the 2023 season with Triple-A Saint Paul...recalled by Twins on April 22, 2023.
In 2022, made 11 starts for the Twins along with four rehab starts in the minors, going 2-3, 3.21 ERA (56.0 IP, 20 ER) with 11 walks and 51 strikeouts for Minnesota.
Set career-highs in innings pitched (7.1) and strikeouts (10) in 4-0 win over Chicago-AL on September 27, 2022.
Made his MLB debut on May 18, 2021, starting for the Twins against Chicago-AL.
Finished the 2021 season with a record of 4-3, 3.99 ERA (10.1 IP, 48 ER), 24 walks and 117 strikeouts in 24 starts between St. Paul and Minnesota.
In 2020, spent spring training on minor league side of Lee County Sports Complex in Fort Myers, FL...was not part of Twins' 60-man Player Pool for season.
Added to Twins 40-man roster on November 20, 2020.
Split the 2019 season between three levels of Twins organization, combining to go 8-0, 0.69 ERA (78.2 IP, 6 ER) with nine walks, 100 strikeouts and a .194 opponent batting average in 14 games (13 starts) for GCL Twins, High-A Fort Myers and Double-A Pensacola.
Led all minor league pitchers (min. 75.0 IP) with a 0.69 ERA in 2019 and ranked second in the minors with a 0.81 WHIP...also became the first Twins minor league pitcher to allow six-or-fewer earned runs in 78.2-or-more innings pitched since at least 1961.
Named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week twice during the 2019 season: once for Fort Myers on August 4 (6.1 IP, 0 ER, 6 H in 1 start) and again on August 25 with Pensacola (1-0, 7.0 IP, 0 ER, 3 H, 0 BB, 12 K).
In 2018, was named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week in consecutive weeks: July 7, going 1-0 with 7.0 shutout innings and 12 strikeouts vs. Wisconsin for Low-A Cedar Rapids Kernels, and again July 14, going 1-0 with two runs allowed in 7.0 innings and 10 strikeouts vs. Fort Wayne...became first ever Twin to win the award twice in a season.
Selected by Twins in 12th round of 2017 First-Year Player Draft; signed by scout Seth Moir...originally selected by Los Angeles-NL in the 23rd round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, but elected to return to the College of Charleston.
Attended College of Charleston from 2014-17, missing the 2015 season recovering from Tommy John surgery on right elbow...compiled a 24-9 record with a 2.91 ERA and 254 strikeouts in 259.2 innings over the course of his collegiate career.
