THE TWINS: Have gone 3-2 through five games on their current 10-game homestand, going 1-2 against the Nationals over the weekend, followed by consecutive wins over the Yankees the last two nights...today the Twins will play their final game of 2023 against New York...starting tomorrow night, Minnesota will host the Royals for four games through Sunday...the Twins have gone 7-4 at Target Field and 7-6 on the road.

⊕ The Twins are looking to win their fourth-straight today, which would match a season-high, done twice previously: March 30-April 3 and April 11-14.

TWINS TAKE ANOTHER FROM THE YANKEES: The Twins beat the Yankees last night at Target Field by a score of 6-2...Joe Ryan (5-0) was the starter and winner, becoming the first five-game winner in baseball...Ryan allowed two runs (1 earned) on seven hits in 7.0 innings pitched, with no walks and seven strikeouts...Jorge López and Jhoan Duran each pitched 1.0 scoreless inning of relief...the offense recorded eight hits, two from both Byron Buxton and Jorge Polanco...Buxton hit his fourth home run while Trevor Larnach hit his third homer.

⊕ Ryan has won each of his first five starts this season, becoming the fifth pitcher in Twins/Senators history (1901-present) to go 5-0 in his first five starts of the season, joining: Sad Sam Jones (5-0 from April 27-May 21-1, 1930), Bill McAfee (5-0 from August 19-2-September 4, 1932), Connie Marrero (5-0 from April 17-May 17, 1951) and Jerry Koonsman (5-0 from April 10-May 1, 1979).

⊕ The win secured the series victory for the Twins, marking their first series win over the Yankees since taking two out of three September 10-12, 2018 at Target Field.

START SPREADING THE NEWS: The Twins have gone 4-2 against the Yankees this season, going 2-2 in New York from April 13-16 and 2-0 at Target Field this week.

⊕ A win today would give the Twins five wins in a season against the Yankees for the first time since going 5-5 in 2000.

⊕ Twins have outscored the Yankees 28-16 this season (+12)...it marks their highest run differential vs. NY since 1991 when they posted a +18 (64-46)...the last time they were in the + was in 2014 at +3, outscoring the Yankees 32-29.

⊕ Jorge Polanco is hitting .298 (31-for-104) with eight doubles, seven home runs, 22 RBI and a .910 OPS in 26 career games against the Yankees...in his last 15 vs. NYY, he is hitting .349 (22-for-63) with six doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI and a 1.160 OPS...he has nine RBI in his last seven games vs. New York.

⊕ Joey Gallo has two hits in four at-bats vs. his former club this season, including one double, one home run, one RBI and one walk.

WAY BACK WEDNESDAY: Last night's win secured the season series for Minnesota, their first over the Yankees since going 4-2 in 2001...below are the lineups from May 10, 2001 at old Yankee Stadium when the Twins clinched the 2001 season series with a 5-4 10-inning win:

WHAT WAS HAPPENING THEN: The oldest player on the Twins' current roster, Caleb Thielbar, was 14 years old...the youngest player on the current active roster, Jose Miranda, was two years old.

⊕ 19 year old Rocco Baldelli was playing for Single-A Charleston, his second season in the Devil Rays minor league system.

⊕ The number one song in America was All For You by Janet Jackson.

⊕ The number one album in the U.S. was All For You by Janet, edging out Now That's What I Call Music! Vol. 6, which held the top spot for three weeks.

⊕ The Nokia 3310 was the most popular cellphone on the market. A relatively new form of communication called "text messaging" began to boom in popularity as people texted using T9. The phone included a game called "Snake" and the Nokia allowed people to customize its cover.

⊕ The highest paid celebrities in 2001 were Tom Cruise, Tiger Woods, The Beatles, Britney Spears, Bruce Willis, Michael Jordan, The Backstreet Boys, *NSYNC, Oprah Winfrey and Mel Gibson.

⊕ Top movies in 2001 were Shrek, Ocean's Eleven, Pearl Harbor, Jurassic Park III, Planet of the Apes, Hannibal, Moulin Rouge!, Spy Kids and The Mummy Returns.

⊕ Around this time, many people were using MSN Messenger to chat online with their friends.

⊕ PlayStation 2 was the most played video game console and Game Boy Color was the go-to handheld device for gamers...Grand Theft Auto 3 was the best-selling video game of 2001.

⊕ DVDs began to replace VCR tapes as Shrek was the best-selling DVD of 2001.

SWEPTS WEEK: The Twins are seeking their second sweep of the season today...their other sweep came in the series opener in Kansas City from March 30-April 2 (3 games)...last season, they swept opponents eight times, all in three games...the Twins' second sweep of 2022 came from April 26-28 vs. Detroit...the Twins are seeking a sweep of the Yankees for the first time since a three-gamer at the HHH Metrodome from September 6-8, 1991...the Twins swept the Yankees in 1993, '94 and '98, but they were all in just two games.

JOEY JACKS: Joey Gallo hit his sixth home run of the season Monday night and now has an at-bat-per-home run ratio of 6.33, the highest in baseball (minimum 40 plate appearances)...despite missing 10 games (right intercostal strain — April 11-19), he still leads the club in homers and ranks tied for fourth in the American League and tied for 10th in baseball.

⊕ Additionally, he leads all of baseball in slugging percentage (min. 40 PA) at .789 and ranks third in OPS (1.167).

THIS AND THAT: The Twins are hitting .308 (42-for-169) with runners in scoring position this season, ranking fourth in all of baseball, trailing Texas (.366), Tampa Bay (.316) and Chicago-NL (.315).

⊕ Trevor Larnach recorded two RBI last night giving him a team-leading 17 on the season...he already is just one away from matching his 2022 RBI total of 18...17 RBI ranks tied for 11th most in the American League.
