THE TWINS: Have gone 2-3 through five games on their current six-game roadtrip, going 1-2 at Chicago-AL, followed by a split of the first two games in Cleveland Friday and Saturday... today, Minnesota will complete the trip with the three-game series finale at Progressive Field against the Guardians...after today's game, the Twins will travel to Minneapolis to enjoy an off-day tomorrow, then begin a six-game Interleague homestand with three against the San Diego Padres (May 9-11) and three against the Chicago Cubs (May 12-14)...the Twins have gone 10-6 at Target Field and 9-9 on the road.

GUARDS GET TO GRAY: The Twins lost to the Guardians last night at Progressive Field by a score of 4-3, evening the series at 1-1...Sonny Gray was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with three walks and six strikeouts...the offense recorded eight hits, including two from Jose Miranda...Max Kepler and Carlos Correa each hit their fifth home runs of the season, as Kepler drove in two of the club's three runs on the night...Minnesota also went 0-for-7 with runners in scoring position.

TWINS-GUARDS: The Twins are playing the Guardians for the third of 13 times in 2023...since the start of 2022, 16 of the 21 games have been decided by three runs-or-less and 10 by one run...the next meeting between these two will come at Target Field for four games from June 1-4...the next time the Twins will visit Cleveland will come in three games from September 4-6...A win today would give the Twins their first series victory vs. the Guardians since taking two of three games from May 13-15, 2022 at Target Field...Twins have gone 0-4-0 in head-to-head series play against them since...their last series win at Progressive Field came September 6-9, 2021, taking three of four.

DANKE SCHOEN, CLEVELAND!: For his career, Max Kepler has 45 hits, 16 home runs, 32 runs scored and 36 RBI at Progressive Field (49 games), all his most in any opposing ballpark...below are Progressive Field's all-time home run leaders for opponents (left) and Kepler's top home run totals by opposing ballpark (right):

LAND OF 10,000 RAKES: The Twins have homered in a franchise record 18-straight games, since April 18...since that date, they have hit 29 home runs, the third most in baseball in that span, trailing Atlanta (33) and Tampa Bay (32)...the current streak is the second longest of 2023, trailing the Rays' stretch of 22 straight to begin the season (March 30-April 23). Prior to the streak, the Twins ranked tied for 21st in baseball in home runs (16) on the morning of April 18...today they rank tied for sixth.

SHINING STARTS: Twins starters have combined to go 14-8, 3.19 ERA (191.2 IP, 68 ER) with 48 walks, 216 strikeouts and a .220 opponent batting average...below are Twins starting pitching ranks in all of baseball:

CENTRAL OF ATTENTION: The Twins are playing a series against an AL Central opponent for the fifth time this season, going 10-5 against their division in 2023...in their previous four AL Central series, they swept the Royals in three games (March 30-April 2), took two of three from Chicago (April 10-12), took three of four from KC (April 27-30), then went 1-2 vs. Chicago (May 2-4)...after today's game, they will not play another team within the division until hosting the Guardians for four games from June 1-4...below are the Twins pitching numbers compared to other AL divisions/National League:

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Double-A Wichita infielder Brooks Lee and High-A Cedar Rapids right-handed pitcher Alejandro Hidalgo have been named Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week. Lee, 22, hit 5/71 (8-for-14) with four doubles, three walks and a 1.504 OPS in four games for the Wind Surge...the San Luis Obispo, California native was the eighth overall pick in last June's First-Year Player Draft out of California Polytechnic State University. Hidalgo, 19, made one start for the Kernels on Wednesday at South Bend, pitching 5.1 scoreless innings, with three hits allowed, one walk and nine strikeouts...the Maracaib, Venezuela native acquired by the Twins in a trade with Los Angeles-AL, in exchange for infielder Gio Urshela on November 18, 2022.

AND I WAS LIKE, EMILIOOOOOOO!: Twins reliever Emilio Pagán is celebrating his 32nd birthday today...he has appeared in one game in his career on his birthday, coming in 2019, pitching 1.0 perfect inning with three strikeouts against Arizona (with Tampa Bay).

- Making his seventh start and appearance of 2023 and his fifth road start of the year...also his 39th career start and appearance. Has won a career-best eight consecutive decisions, since September 13, 2022; is 8-0, 1.87 ERA (62.2 IP, 13 ER) with 14 walks, 70 strikeouts and a .160 opponent batting average in that 10-start span. Facing Cleveland for the first time this year and the sixth time in his career...is 3-0, 1.42 ERA (31.2 IP, 5 ER) with four walks and 26 strikeouts in five previous starts vs. the Guardians.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor into the decision in the Twins 3-2 defeat in 10 innings at the Chicago White Sox on May 2, opposite right-hander Michael Kopech...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings, allowed just one hit, issued two walks and struck out seven...his only hit allowed was a second-inning single to Gavin Sheets...Sheets reached second on a wild pitch and was the only runner to reach scoring position against Ryan...retired 12 of the final 13 batters he faced, inducing an inning-ending double play from outfielder Andrew Benintendi in the bottom of the sixth inning to complete his outing...left with Minnesota leading 1-0, but the Twins bullpen allowed three runs (2 earned) in 3.2 innings to drop the series opener.

Marked his fourth career start allowing one-or-fewer hits, also doing so on September 13, 2022 vs. Kansas City (7.0 IP, 0 H), April 27, 2022 vs. Detroit (7.0 IP, 1 H) and September 8, 2021 at Cleveland (7.0 IP, 1 H).

TWO STARTS AGO: Won his fifth-straight start of the 2023 season and his eighth-consecutive decision in the Twins 6-2 victory vs. the New York Yankees at Target Field on April 25...went 7.0 innings for the second time this year, allowing a season-high seven hits but only two runs (1 earned) with no walks and seven strikeouts...opposed left-hander Nestor Cortes, who took his first loss of the season...Ryan yielded a RBI single to infielder DJ LeMahieu in the top of the first inning, his first run allowed in the first inning in 2023 and marking the first time he pitched with the Twins trailing this year...allowed an unearned run in the fifth inning when first baseman Donovan Solano committed an error on a potential inning-ending double play...recorded seven strikeouts without issuing a walk in a start of at least 7.0 innings for the second time in his career...received six runs of support and led baseball with 38 runs of support through his first five starts...became the first five-game winner in baseball this year.

WIN STREAK BY THE NUMBERS: In his last ten starts dating back to September 13, 2022, Ryan is 8-0, 1.87 ERA (62.2 IP, 13 ER) with 14 walks and 70 strikeouts...opponents are slashing .160/.217/.237 (35-for-219) against Ryan during the win streak, and his .454 opponent OPS is the second lowest in baseball in that stretch among pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched (Shohei Ohtani - .453)...the span marks the longest win streak of Ryan's career and is the longest win streak by a Twins starter since Michael Pineda went 8-0 in a 16-start stretch from July 21, 2019-April 15, 2021.

ROCKIN' IN CLEVELAND: Today is Ryan's sixth career start vs. Cleveland and third at Progressive Field...he is 3-0, 1.42 ERA (31.2 IP, 5 ER) with four walks and 26 strikeouts in five previous starts vs. the Guardians...earned the win in both of his previous starts at Cleveland, combining to pitch 14.2 scoreless innings with four hits allowed, two walks and nine strikeouts...last faced the Guardians in Cleveland on September 18, 2022, earning the win in the Twins 3-0 victory...pitched 7.2 shutout innings, allowing three hits and issuing two walks while striking out five batters.

Ryan's other outing in Cleveland came on September 8, 2021, his second career start and a 3-0 Twins win...yielded one hit over 7.0 shutout innings, with four strikeouts...retired the first 19 batters he faced, becoming the first Twins pitcher to retire 19 in a row to start a game since Francisco Liriano on June 12, 2011 (Elías)...also became the first pitcher in American League history to toss 7.0-plus shutout innings while allowing no more than one baserunner in either his first or second career start (STATS LLC).

ROLLING ON THE ROAD: This season, Ryan is 3-0 away from Target Field with a 1.80 ERA (25.0 IP, 5 ER), five walks, 26 strikeouts and a .151 (13-for-86) opponent batting average...his .207 opponent on-base percentage in road starts ranks third best in baseball among qualifiers (Anthony DeSclafani - .164, Tyler Wells - .206)...in 18 career road starts, Ryan is 11-4 with a 3.30 ERA (101.0 IP, 37 ER), 24 walks and 102 strikeouts...has similar numbers in 20 home starts, going 9-5, 3.50 ERA (110.2 IP, 43 ER) with 34 walks and 122 strikeouts.

Since his debut in 2021, Ryan has held opposing batters to a .208 (77-for-371) batting average in road starts, the seventh-lowest opponent batting average on the road in the American League during that span (min. 75.0 IP).

LEFT (AND RIGHT) OUT IN THE COLD: Left-handed hitters are batting only .156 (10-for-64) with a .487 OPS against Ryan this year...right-handed hitters are hitting .181 (13-for-72) with 29 strikeouts...all seven of his strikeouts in his last start on May 2 at Chicago-AL were against right-handed hitters...his .169 opponent batting average ranks fourth among all qualified pitchers this season, trailing LAA's Shohei Ohtani (.125), ATL's Spencer Strider (.162) and LAD's Dustin May (.164)...over his career, Ryan has slightly better splits against left-handed hitters than righties, with lefties batting just .188 with a .607 OPS since his debut in 2021...right-handed hitters are hitting .208 with a .635 OPS off Ryan.

THE ARSENAL: Ryan has utilized a four-pitch mix in his first six starts of the 2023 season...has leaned on his four-seam fastball and split finger, combining to throw the two pitches 85.3 percent of the time...opponents are batting just .165 (20-for-121) with 38 strikeouts against Ryan's four-seamer and split finger...here's a look at Ryan's repertoire, per Baseball Savant:

Ryan's four-seam fastball has accumulated a run value of -.6, which ranks tied for third in baseball (min. 50 PA) with Seattle's George Kirby, behind New York-AL's Gerrit Cole (-11) and Chicago-NL's Justin Steele (-7).

BACK IN THE DAY: After four-straight night starts, Ryan is making his first daytime start since April 8 vs. Houston at Target Field...has gone 2-0 in two daytime starts this season with a 3.75 ERA (12.0 IP, 5 ER), three walks and 16 strikeouts...in his career, Ryan is 8-3, 2.71 ERA (76.1 IP, 23 ER) with 23 walks, 72 strikeouts and a .178 (48-for-270) opponent batting average in 14 daytime starts...his .178 opponent batting average in day starts ranks fourth in baseball since the start of 2021 among pitchers with at least 75.0 inning pitched during the day...in 24 career nighttime starts, he is 12-6, 3.79 ERA (135.1 IP, 57 ER) with 35 walks and 152 strikeouts.

CENTRAL DOMINANCE: Ryan remains unbeaten in 17 career starts vs. the American League Central division...in those 17 starts, he is 12-0, 1.71 ERA (100.0 IP, 19 ER) with 106 strikeouts and a .168 opponent batting average, all of which are his best numbers against any division in his career...among active pitchers who have thrown at least 100.0 innings vs. the AL Central, Ryan's 1.71 ERA and .168 opponent batting average are tops.

TUESDAY'S STARTER - RHP LOUIE VARLAND (2023: 0-0, 5.91 ERA // CAREER: 1-2, 4.42 ERA)

Right-hander Louie Varland is scheduled to start the three-game series opener vs. the San Diego Padres at Target Field on Tuesday night, following tomorrow's off-day...is in his second stint with the Twins this season (also, April 14-15)...did not factor into the decision in his last start on May 3 at Chicago-AL, after being recalled from Triple-A St. Paul earlier that day; allowed four runs on seven hits (1 home run), with two walks and six strikeouts in a 6-4 Twins loss...is due to face a Senior Circuit for the first time in his career on Tuesday.

CAREER NOTES

- 2023 marks his sixth professional season, including 2020. In 2022, his first full major-league season, was Twins Opening Day starter and led both the club and all AL rookies in wins (13), innings pitched (147.0) and strikeouts (151). Made his major league debut for the Twins on September 1, 2021 vs. Chicago-NL (L, 5.0 IP, 3 H, 3 R/3 ER, 1 HR, 1 BB, 5 K). Helped Team USA win the silver medal in baseball at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics...went 1-0, 1.74 ERA (10.1 IP, 2 ER), one walk and eight strikeouts in two starts. Acquired by the Twins on July 22, 2021 from the Tampa Bay Rays, alongside right-handed pitcher Drew Strotman, in exchange for designated hitter Nelson Cruz...learned about the trade while in Japan with Team USA. In 2020, was part of the Rays 60-man player pool and spent the summer at the alternate training site in Port Charlotte, Florida...ranked by Baseball America as the No. 12 prospect in the Rays system following the season. In 2019, was named Rays minor league Pitcher of the Year after going 9-4, 1.96 ERA (123.2 IP, 27 ER) in his first full professional season...divided the year between Low-A Bowling Green (6 starts), High-A Charlotte (15 games, 13 starts) and Double-A Montgomery (3 starts). Garnered several other awards in 2019, including: MiLB.com organization All-Star honors, Baseball America High Class A All-Star, two-time Florida State League Pitcher of the Week (June 17-23 and August 5-11) and Rays minor league Pitcher of the Month for July and August. Made professional debut in 2018 for Short-A Hudson Valley...went 2-1, 3.72 ERA (36.1 IP, 15 ER) in 12 games (7 starts) for the Renegades, with 14 walks and 51 strikeouts. Selected by the Rays in the seventh round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Division II California State University, Stanislaus. Went 8-1, 1.65 ERA (98.1 IP, 18 ER) in 14 starts as a senior at Stanislaus and led all divisions of college baseball with 127 strikeouts...earned three selections to All-America teams...pitched three seasons at California State University, Northridge before transferring to Stanislaus.

- Made Twins Opening Day roster, the first of career...spent nearly all season with Minnesota, starting 27 games for the Twins and making one rehab start with Triple-A St. Paul. Was club's Opening Day starter April 8 vs. Seattle, allowing two runs in 4.0 innings pitched with four walks and four strikeouts and was dealt the loss in a Twins 2-1 defeat...became second rookie in franchise history (since 1901) to start on Opening Day, joining Tom Hall on April 8, 1969. Posted 20.0-scoreless inning streak from April 15-May 3, longest for a Twins pitcher on season. Went 3-0, 1.09 ERA (24.2 IP, 3 ER) with eight walks and 27 strikeouts in final four starts from September 13-20. Led Twins staff in wins (13), innings pitched (147.0) and strikeouts (151).
