THE TWINS: Have gone 4-5 through nine games on their 10-game homestand, going 2-0 vs. Milwaukee, 1-3 vs. Detroit and 1-2 vs. Boston...today, Minnesota will complete the homestand with the four-game series finale against the Red Sox...after today's game, the Twins will travel to Detroit to begin a nine-game, 10-day roadtrip with three games against the Tigers over the weekend, three games against the Braves (June 26-28) and three games against the Orioles (June 30-July 2)...the Twins have gone 22-19 at home and 15-19 on the road.

NEEDED THAT ONE: The Twins beat the Red Sox last night at Target Field by a score of 5-4 in 10 innings, marking their seventh extra-inning win this season (7-3)...Sonny Gray was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Jovani Moran (1-2) was the winner, pitching a scoreless 10th inning, holding a 4-4 tie...Kyle Farmer drove in the winning run in the bottom of the 10th inning with a single, his second walk-off plate appearance of the season and third of his career...the offense recorded nine hits and were led by Max Kepler, who went 2-for-4 with a home run, his ninth of the season.

SEEING RED AGAIN: The Twins and Red Sox are playing for the seventh and final time in 2023...the Twins are 2-4 against Boston this season, going 1-2 at Fenway Park from April 18-20 and 1-2 this week. Carlos Correa is hitting .300 (57-for-190) with eight doubles, 10 home runs, 28 RBI, 36 runs scored, 33 walks, a .402 on-base percentage, a .500 slugging percentage and a .902 OPS in 51 career regular season games against the Red Sox. Max Kepler has hit safely in six-straight games against the Red Sox, hitting .409 (9-for-22) with three doubles, three home runs, five RBI, two walks, a .500 on-base percentage and a 1.455 OPS in that span.

RYAN EXPRESS: Through 14 starts, Joe Ryan has gone 7-4, 3.30 ERA (84.2 IP, 31 ER) with 15 walks, 91 strikeouts and a 0.97 WHIP...below are a few of his rankings among all AL starters: OPS, SLG, WHIP, FIP, WAR, K/BB. Valdez - .580, Ohtani - .324, Ryan - 0.97, Gray - 2.67, Gausman - 3.2, Ryan - 6.07, Ohtani - .609, S. Gray - .329, Eovaldi - 0.99, Valdez - 2.68, Eovaldi - 2.8, Eflin - 5.92, Eflin - .612, Ryan - .330, Eflin - 1.00, Ryan - 2.92, S. Gray - 2.6, Greinke - 5.80, Cole - .613, Cole - .331, Valdez - 1.00, Eovaldi - 3.08, Ryan - 2.5, Gilbert - 5.25. ADDITIONALLY: Ryan has a .211 opponent batting average on his fastball this season, the eighth lowest in the AL...also, he has the 10th-lowest BAA on offspeed at .170.

MAX POWER: Max Kepler has homered in two-straight games and in three of his last nine...last night's home run was his ninth of the season, matching his total from 2022...last night marked the 138th home run of his career, moving within three of tying Michael Cuddyer for 13th on the Twins all-time list (since 1961): TWIN HR, TWIN HR, TWIN HR. 1) Harmon Killebrew...475, 8) Gary Gaetti...201, 15) Jacques Jones...132, 2) Kent Hrbek...293, 9) Brian Dozier...167, 16) Eddie Rosario...119, 3) Justin Morneau...221, 10) Tom Brunansky...163, 17) Roy Smalley...110, 4) Tony Oliva...220, 11) Miguel Sanó...162, 18) Byron Buxton...109, 5) Torii Hunter...214, 12) Joe Mauer...143, 19) Jason Kubel...105, 6) Bob Allison...211, 13) Michael Cuddyer...141, 20) Jorge Polanco...103, 7) Kirby Puckett...207, 14) Max Kepler...138, 21) Corey Koskie...101.

ROYCE OF SUMMER: Royce Lewis has reached base safely in six-straight games...in 18 games for the Twins this season, he is hitting .308 (20-for-65) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, eight runs scored and an .805 OPS...he's also hitting .438 (14-for-32) with a .471 OBP and 1.033 OPS in his last 10 games.

STEAL AWAY: Twins have stolen 35 bases in 41 attempts this season for a 85.4 success rate, best in the AL and third best in baseball, trailing New York-NL (90.3%) and Arizona (86.0%)...since May 15, they have successfully stolen a club-record 25 consecutive bases, their last caught stealing being Ryan Jeffers on May 13 vs. Chicago-NL (Barnhart/Wesneski).

LAND OF 10,000 RAKES: The Twins have homered 95 times this season, fifth most in the AL and eighth most in baseball...Twins are 29-23 when they homer at least once in a game, 20-7 when they homer at least twice and 9-2 when homering at least thrice. The Twins have 19 different players with a home run this season, the most in baseball...next are the Yankees and Brewers, both with 18. Five more home runs and the Twins will reach 100...through games of June 22, 2022, they had 82, not reaching their 100th homer until July 5.

EDDIE, MONEY: Since being recalled from Triple-A St. Paul on June 10, Edouard Julien is hitting .314 (11-for-35) with five doubles, five walks, a .400 on-base percentage and an .857 OPS in 10 games...in his last 17 major league games (dating back to May 24), he is hitting .295 (18-for-61) with seven doubles, two home runs, four RBI, 10 walks, a .389 on-base percentage, a .508 slugging percentage and an .897 OPS. Julien has posted a .400 on-base percentage this month, third best among MLB rookies, trailing St. Louis' Jordan Walker (.418) and Seattle's Jose Caballero (.408).

THE MOR YOU NEAU: Bally Sports North analyst, Justin Morneau, hit .338 (74-for-219) with 16 doubles, six home runs, 34 RBI, 28 runs scored, 21 walks and an .883 OPS in 57 career games vs. the Red Sox...one of Morneau's two career-high five hit games came against the Sox on September 19, 2006 at Fenway Park (his other, 7/10/08 at DET)...his .338 average was his highest against an AL opponent.

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss on June 16 vs. Detroit at Target Field in the Twins 7-1 defeat; pitched 7.0 innings, allowing a season-high six runs on seven hits (2 HR), with no walks and seven strikeouts...allowed five runs in the top of the third inning on four singles, a sacrifice fly by designated hitter Kerry Carpenter and a three-run homer by shortstop Javier Báez...allowed a solo home run to centerfielder Matt Vierling in the top of the fourth...needed only 35 pitches to toss 3.0 scoreless innings from the fifth through the seventh innings...was relieved by Josh Winder to start the top of the eighth with Minnesota trailing 6-1...Twins scored only one run as Detroit took the second game of the four-game series.

- ☞ Marked the most runs he has allowed in a start since August 9, 2022 at Los Angeles-NL, when he also yielded six runs.
- ☞ Ryan's current three-game losing streak is the longest of his career...last won on May 24 vs. San Francisco; his current four-start span without a win (3 L, 1 ND) is also the longest of his career.
- ☞ Allowed multiple homers for the second time this season (also, 2 on May 30 at Houston) and sixth time in his career; Twins have gone 0-6 when Ryan allows multiple homers in his career.
- ☞ Marked his eighth career start without issuing a walk; after winning each of his first six career starts without issuing a walk, he has since lost his last two such starts (also, May 7 at Cleveland).

TWO STARTS AGO: Recorded his team-leading 10th quality start of the season but took a no-decision on June 10 at Toronto as the Twins won 9-4 at Rogers Centre; went 6.0 innings, allowing three runs on six hits, with one walk and four strikeouts...opposed Trevor Richards who tossed 3.0 shutout innings as an opener...allowed an RBI single to leftfielder Whit Merrifield in the second inning and first baseman Vladimir Guerrero Jr. in the third inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to pinch hitter Nathan Lukes in the fifth then retired the final four batters he faced, including recording his only 1-2-3 inning of his outing in the sixth inning...was relieved by Jorge López in the bottom of the seventh with Minnesota trailing 3-1; Twins rallied for seven runs in the top of the eighth, winning the game and the series.

RED SOX REDUX: Facing Boston for the second time this season after earning the win on April 19 in the Twins' 10-4 victory over the Red Sox at Fenway Park; pitched 6.0 innings, allowing three runs on six hits (1 HR), with one walk and a season-low three strikeouts...in three career starts against Boston, he is 2-1, 4.76 ERA (17.0 IP, 9 ER) with two walks and 18 strikeouts...last faced the Red Sox at Target Field on August 31, 2022, taking the loss in a 6-5 Twins' defeat (5.0 IP, 8 H, 5 R/ER, 2 HR, 1 BB, 8 K).

☞ In nine career starts against the American League East division (BOS - 3, NYY - 3, BAL - 2, TOR - 1), he is 4-2, 3.59 ERA (52.2 IP, 21 ER) with nine walks and 52 strikeouts; Twins have gone 7-2 in those games.

WRAPPING UP THE HOMESTAND: Making his seventh start at Target Field this season; he is 4-2, 3.35 ERA (37.2 IP, 14 ER) with five walks and 42 strikeouts in his six home starts...Twins have gone 12-4 in his last 16 home starts dating back to June 26, 2022, with Ryan going 9-4, 3.07 ERA (93.2 IP, 32 ER) with 23 walks and 104 strikeouts in that span...is 3-2, 3.26 ERA (47.0 IP, 17 ER) with 10 walks and 49 strikeouts in eight road starts in 2023.

☞ Ryan has gone 11-7 with a 3.46 ERA (135.1 IP, 52 ER), 38 walks and 147 strikeouts in 24 career home starts...has similar numbers in 22 career road starts, going 11-6 with a 3.59 ERA (123.0 IP, 49 ER), 29 walks and 125 strikeouts.

LEFT/RIGHT: Left-handed hitters are batting just .199 (29-for-146) with a .523 OPS and 33 strikeouts against Ryan this year...his .523 opponent OPS against lefties ranks fifth in the American League this season...right-handed hitters are hitting .225 (38-for-169) with a .630 OPS and 58 strikeouts...his .213 (67-for-315) overall opponent batting average in 2023 ranks fifth in the American League and tied for ninth in baseball, among qualified pitchers.

☞ Over his career, Ryan has slightly better splits against left-handed hitters than righties, with lefties batting just .196 (90-for-460) with a .597 OPS since his debut in 2021...right-handed hitters are hitting .218 (108-for-496) with a .654 OPS off Ryan.

THE ARSENAL: Ryan has utilized a four-pitch mix in his first 14 starts of the 2023 season...has leaned on his four-seam fastball and split finger, combining to throw the two pitches 86.1 percent of the time this year...threw 66 four-seam fastballs in his last start on June 16 vs. Detroit, the second-most fastballs he has thrown in a start this year (68 on May 24 vs. San Francisco)...also allowed his first career home run off a split-finger in his last outing (Javier Báez, 3rd inning)...here's a look at Ryan's repertoire, per Baseball Savant:

☞ Ryan's four-seam fastball has accumulated a run value of -13 this season, tied with ARI's Zac Gallen for the second-best run value on a four-seam fastball in the majors according to Baseball Savant, trailing only NYY's Gerrit Cole (-16)...also has a run value of -6 on his splitter, the sixth-best run value on a splitter in baseball.

IN THE ZONE: In 14 starts this year, Ryan's first-pitch strike percent is 68.8 percent, the fourth-highest first-pitch strike percent among qualified American League pitchers this season...teammate Pablo López is the AL leader at 72.0 percent...opponents have swung at the first pitch 39.9 percent of the time against Ryan in 2023, the highest first-pitch swing percent in the AL this year.

THIRD INNING TROUBLES: Ryan allowed five runs in the third inning in his last start on June 16 vs. Detroit and has allowed 14 of his 33 runs (42.4 percent) and 20 of his 67 hits (29.9 percent) in the third inning this season...opponents are slashing .339/.382/.475 against him in the third inning, while Ryan has held opponents to a .184 (47-for-256) average in all other innings combined.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP KENTA MAEDA (2023: 0-4, 9.00 ERA // CAREER: 59-45, 3.98 ERA)

Kenta Maeda is set to make his return from the 15-day Injured List and start the three-game series opener against the Detroit Tigers at Comerica Park tomorrow night...missed the Twins' last 50 games with a right triceps strain...made four rehab starts for Triple-A St. Paul from May 30-June 16, posting a 2.03 ERA (13.1 IP, 3 ER), five walks, 17 strikeouts and a .200 (10-for-50) opponent batting average...last pitched for the Twins on April 26 vs. New York-AL, allowing a career-high 10 runs on 11 hits in 3.0-plus innings, with two walks and two strikeouts...facing the Tigers for the ninth time in his career and first time since July 27, 2021; has recorded five quality starts in eight career games vs. Detroit, going 2-2, 3.69 ERA (46.1 IP, 19 ER) with seven walks and 58 strikeouts.

- 2023 marks his sixth professional season, including 2020.
- In 2022, his first full major-league season, was Twins Opening Day starter and led both the club and all AL rookies in wins (13), innings pitched (147.0) and strikeouts (151).
- Made his major league debut for the Twins on September 1, 2021 vs. Chicago-NL (L, 5.0 IP, 3 H, 3 R/3 ER, 1 HR, 1 BB, 5 K).
- Helped Team USA win the silver medal in baseball at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics...went 1-0, 1.74 ERA (10.1 IP, 2 ER), one walk and eight strikeouts in two starts.
