THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game, West Coast roadtrip with a record of 5-2 (3-0 at Oakland and 2-2 at Seattle), the Twins began their six-game homestand with consecutive victories over the White Sox...today, they will play the three-game series finale with the Sox... Minnesota will continue the homestand tomorrow night with the first of three against the Mariners, through Wednesday...the Twins have gone 28-22 at home and 24-26 on the road. In 15 games since July 3, the Twins have scored 5.4 runs-per-game... additionally, they have scored at least five runs in seven of their last nine games. Of the Twins' 62 remaining games, they have an opponent winning percentage of .477, the second-lowest strength of schedule, trailing only the White Sox (.467).

CHRISTIAN ROCKS THE SOX: The Twins beat the White Sox last night at Target Field by a score of 3-2, securing the series win, their 15th this season and ninth at home...Sonny Gray was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched, with one walk and four strikeouts...Jordan Balazovic earned his first major league win, pitching a scoreless seventh inning...the offense recorded six hits and were led by Christian Vazquez, who went 2-for-3 with two doubles and a game-tying RBI...Carlos Correa also had two hits, one double and an RBI on the night...Minnesota finished 4-for-9 with RISP.

MIDWEST MASH-UP: Twins and White Sox are playing the ninth of 13 meetings this season... Minnesota has gone 5-3 against the Sox this season, going 4-1 at Target Field and 1-2 at Guaranteed Rate Field...they will meet for a final time this season for a four-game series at Guaranteed Rate Field from September 14-17.

Since 2015, the Twins have gone 83-68 against the Sox, their most wins against any opponent in that span. Four of the eight games between these two teams this season have been decided by one run and six have been decided by two runs. The Twins have beat the Sox 69 times (53 losses) at Target Field (since 2010), second most against any opponent (Kansas City - 72). Christian Vazquez is hitting .342 (40-for-117) with seven doubles, one home run, 17 RBI, nine walks, a .389 on-base percentage and an .816 OPS in 37 career games vs. the Sox.

BYRON SOX-TON: Byron Buxton is hitting .269 (7-for-26) with one double, four home runs, eight RBI, six walks, a .406 on-base percentage, a .769 slugging percentage and a 1.175 OPS in eight games vs. the White Sox this season...for his career, Buxton is hitting .279 (72-for-258) with 21 doubles, one triple, 19 home runs, 45 RBI, 50 runs scored and a .925 OPS in 75 games vs. the White Sox...below are his first 48 career games vs. the Sox (June 22, 2015-June 29, 2019), compared to his last 27 (June 30, 2019-present):

THE BOYS OF SUMMER: Since the All-Star break, the Twins have gone 7-2, leading baseball in wins in that span...below are the offensive numbers and MLB ranks pre-All-Star break vs. post-All-Star break:

BROOM BREAKDOWN: The Twins are seeking their fifth sweep of the season today...their previous four sweeps were March 30-April 2 at Kansas City (3 games), June 13-14 vs. Milwaukee (2 games), July 3-5 vs. Kansas City (3 games) and July 14-16 at Oakland (3 games)...last season, they swept opponents eight times, all in three games. The last time the Twins swept the Sox was in three games here from April 22-24, 2022. Minnesota is 4-4 in series finales when there's an opportunity to sweep. Since 2017, the Twins have swept the White Sox six times...the only teams they have swept more in that time frame are the Royals (9 times) and the Tigers (8 times).

FOLLOW THE LEADER: Carlos Correa has led off in 17 of the club's last 18 games, since June 30...since that date, he has reached safely in 15 of 17 games, hitting .309 (21-for-68) with a .390 on-base percentage and an .831 OPS, while leading the team in hits and times on base (30). Post-All-Star break over the last two seasons combined, he is hitting .303 (87-for-287) with an .868 OPS in 74 games.

EXCELLENT 'PENMANSHIP: In nine games since the All-Star break, the Twins bullpen has combined to go 5-0, 2.40 ERA (30.0 IP, 8 ER), with eight walks, 30 strikeouts, an opponent batting average of .179 (19-for-106) and an opponent OPS of .590.

Notable individuals since the break: Jordan Balazovic has pitched 3.0 scoreless innings with three hits allowed...Jovani Moran has pitched 4.0 no-hit innings...Emilio Pagan has pitched 6.0 shutout innings with one hit, two walks and five strikeouts...Jhoan Duran has posted a 1.80 ERA (5.0 IP, 1 ER) with five saves (5 chances), no walks and seven strikeouts.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Twins have named Double-A Wichita right-handed pitcher David Festa and High-A Cedar Rapids outfielder Emmanuel Rodriguez as minor league Pitcher and Player of the Week.

Festa, 23, made one start for the Wind Surge on Thursday at Amarillo, pitching 3.0 shutout innings, with two hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts...he appeared for the AL Team in the SiriusXM Futures Game in Seattle over the Major League Baseball All-Star break and pitched 1.0 inning...the Verona, New Jersey native was selected by the Twins in the 13th round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of seton Hall University.

Rodriguez, 20, played in five games for the Kernels, hitting .375 (6-for-16) with one double, one triple, one home run, five walks and a 1.316 OPS...the Santiago, Dominican Republic native was signed by the Twins as an international free agent in July of 2019.

- Making his 16th start of the season and 10th home start...also his 47th career start and appearance.
Facing the White Sox for the first time this season and the ninth time in his career...is 2-1, 3.38 ERA (40.0 IP, 15 ER) with 10 walks and 44 strikeouts in his eight previous starts.
Began the season with Triple-A St. Paul and was recalled when Kenta Maeda landed on the Injured List on April 29...since being inserted into the rotation, the Twins have gone 9-6 in his 15 starts.
Selected by the Twins in the 12th round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the College of Charleston.

LAST START: Earned the win in his 10th quality start of the season on July 18 at Seattle, a 10-3 Twins' victory...pitched 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on seven hits (1 HR), issued no walks and struck out five batters...allowed all three runs in the first inning off six hits (a leadoff single by J.P. Crawford, a two-run home run by Eugenio Suárez, a single by Jarred Kelenic, a single by Teoscar Hernández, an RBI double from Ty France and a single by Mike Ford)...

Among American League pitchers with at least 15 games started in 2023, Ober ranks first in WHIP (0.98), second in ERA (2.74), sixth in walks-per-9.0 innings (1.83), sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.67) and eighth in opponent batting average (.214).

Currently owns a nine-game streak with three-or-fewer earned runs allowed...tied for the third-longest active streak among American League starters this season.

Has recorded a quality start in six-straight outings, the second-longest active quality start streak among all starters in the majors, trailing only San Diego's Joe Musgrove (7).

TWO STARTS AGO: Did not factor into the decision despite recording his fifth-consecutive quality start on July 7 vs. Baltimore, a 10-inning, 3-1 Twins' defeat...pitched 6.0 innings and allowed one run on four hits, issued a career-high-tying three walks and struck out five batters...marked the fourth time in his career Ober has walked three batters (also, July 5, 2021 vs. Chicago-AL; April 23 vs. Washington; and May 22 vs. San Francisco)...

THERE'S A LIGHT ON IN CHICAGO: Ober is facing the White Sox for the first time this season and the ninth time in his career, going 2-1, 3.38 ERA (40.0 IP, 15 ER) with 10 walks and 44 strikeouts in his eight previous starts...last faced the White Sox on October 3, 2022 at Guaranteed Rate Field in his final start of the season...

His eight starts and 44 strikeouts against the White Sox are his most against any opponent in his career.

Owens the lowest opponent batting average against the White Sox (.205) since 2021 (min. 6 GS).

Made his major league debut against the White Sox at Target Field on May 18, 2021...did not factor into 5-4 Twins' victory after pitching 4.0 innings and allowing four runs on five hits (2 HR), with one walk and four strikeouts.

BULLSEYE: Ober is making his 10th home start of the season today...is 2-3, 2.98 ERA (51.1 IP, 17 ER) with 13 walks and 44 strikeouts in nine home starts in 2023; earned home victories on April 23 vs. Washington and June 14 vs. Milwaukee...is 4-1, 2.41 ERA (37.1 IP, 10 ER) with five walks and 40 strikeouts in six road starts this season...

Is 2-0, 1.69 ERA (26.2 IP, 5 ER) with six walks and 33 strikeouts in five career starts against the White Sox at Target Field.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Left-handed hitters are batting .205 (35-for-171) with 40 strikeouts and 13 walks against Ober after 15 starts this season...right-handed hitters are hitting .225 (34-for-151) with 44 strikeouts and five walks...lefties went 3-for-11 with two strikeouts against him in his last start on July 18 at Seattle while righties went 4-for-12 (1 HR) with three RBI and three strikeouts...

ARSENAL: Ober has used a four-pitch mix in his 15 starts of the 2023 season, per Baseball Savant...mostly uses his slider against righties while relying on his changeup and curveball against lefties...tossed 43 fastballs in his last start on July 18 at Seattle; allowed three hits (1 HR) on the pitch and also struck out three batters...here's a look at his repertoire:

His .186 opponent batting average against his changeup is the lowest on the Twins and is the sixth lowest in baseball (min. 100 plate appearances)...his .120 opponent batting average on his curveball is the lowest on the Twins and tied for the 12th lowest in baseball (min. 20 plate appearances).

His .201 opponent batting average across all of his secondary pitches (changeup, slider and curveball) is the seventh lowest in the American League and 17th lowest in baseball (min. 150 plate appearances).

Currently has a run value of 10 on his changeup, tied for the fourth highest in all of baseball.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP KENTA MAEDA (2023: 2-5, 5.10 ERA // CAREER: 61-46, 3.94 ERA)

Kenta Maeda is set to start in the three-game series opener against the Seattle Mariners tomorrow night at Target Field...took a no-decision in his last outing on July 19 at Seattle in a 6-3 Twins' victory; pitched 6.1 innings, allowing two runs on three hits (1 HR), with no walks and a season-high-tying nine strikeouts...facing the Mariners for just the third time in his career and is looking for his first win against Seattle; owns a 2.61 ERA (10.1 IP, 3 ER) with three walks and 16 strikeouts in his previous two starts...is 5-5, 5.06 ERA (80.0 IP, 45 ER) with 30 walks and 86 strikeouts in 18 career appearances (16 starts) against the American League West...is 1-2, 8.44 ERA (16.0 IP, 15 ER) with three walks and 14 strikeouts in three starts at Target Field this season.

- In 2022, made 11 starts for the Twins along with four rehab starts in the minors, going 2-3, 3.21 ERA (56.0 IP, 20 ER) with 11 walks and 51 strikeouts for Minnesota.
Set career-highs in innings pitched (7.1) and strikeouts (10) in 4-0 win over Chicago-AL on September 27, 2022.
Made his MLB debut on May 18, 2021, starting for the Twins against Chicago-AL.
Finished the 2021 season with a record of 4-3, 3.99 ERA (10.1 IP, 48 ER), 24 walks and 117 strikeouts in 24 starts between St. Paul and Minnesota.
In 2020, spent spring training on minor league side of Lee County Sports Complex in Fort Myers, FL...was not part of Twins' 60-man Player Pool for season.
Added to Twins 40-man roster on November 20, 2020.
Split the 2019 season between three levels of Twins organization, combining to go 8-0, 0.69 ERA (78.2 IP, 6 ER) with nine walks, 100 strikeouts and a .194 opponent batting average in 14 games (13 starts) for GCL Twins, High-A Fort Myers and Double-A Pensacola.
Led all minor league pitchers (min. 75.0 IP) with a 0.69 ERA in 2019 and ranked second in the minors with a 0.81 WHIP...also became the first Twins minor league pitcher to allow six-or-fewer earned runs in 78.2-or-more innings pitched since at least 1961.
Named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week twice during the 2019 season: once for Fort Myers on August 4 (6.1 IP, 0 ER, 6 H in 1 start) and again on August 25 with Pensacola (1-0, 7.0 IP, 0 ER, 3 H, 0 BB, 12 K).
In 2018, was named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week in consecutive weeks: July 7, going 1-0 with 7.0 shutout innings and 12 strikeouts vs. Wisconsin for Low-A Cedar Rapids Kernels, and again July 14, going 1-0 with two runs allowed in 7.0 innings and 10 strikeouts vs. Fort Wayne...became first ever Twin to win the award twice in a season.
Selected by Twins in 12th round of 2017 First-Year Player Draft; signed by scout Seth Moir...originally selected by Los Angeles-NL in the 23rd round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, but elected to return to the College of Charleston.
Attended College of Charleston from 2014-17, missing the 2015 season recovering from Tommy John surgery on right elbow...compiled a 24-9 record with a 2.91 ERA and 254 strikeouts in 259.2 innings over the course of his collegiate career.
