Sons of Eight Ex-Big Timers Picked Up in Free-Agent Draft

NEW YORK, N. Y.

The sons of eight former major league players, the brothers of two present big leaguers and the cousin and nephew of two others, were among the athletes chosen in the first free-agent draft.

Other relatives of former and present big leaguers may have been selected, but club officials were uncertain of this until they had time to gather more information on the backgrounds of youngsters who were picked.

Heading the list of sons of ex-Big Timers was Joe Coleman, Jr., 17-year-old pitcher taken by Washington.

His father pitched for the Philadelphia Athletics (1942 and '46-53), the Baltimore Orioles ('54-55) and Detroit Tigers (1955).

Unser's Son Chosen

Del Unser, whose dad Al currently is scouting for Milwaukee and played with Detroit ('42-44) and Cincinnati (1945), was selected by Minnesota for its Denver affiliate. Young Del is an outfielder from Mississippi State University.

Hal Jeffcoat, Jr., son of the former National League outfielder and pitcher, was chosen by San Francisco for its Springfield farm. Young Hal, only 17, graduated from high school in Tampa, Fla., this spring.

His boy, Ken, an 18-year-old lefty from San Francisco, was grabbed by Houston for Amarillo.

The first pick in the Class A selections was the son of another well-known former Big Time performer. He was Del Wilber, Jr., 19-year-old Purdue shortstop tabbed by Philadelphia for Bakersfield. His dad, a former catcher, is now a super scout for Minnesota.

The sixth son of an ex-major leaguer was Bill Seinoth, an 18-year-old lefty pitcher-first baseman from Arcadia, Calif. Houston selected him on behalf of Cocoa. His father, also Bill, pitched for the St. Louis Browns in the early '40s.

Another son of a former major leaguer is Louis Howell, drafted by

the Yankees for their Columbus, Ga., club. Louis is the son of Homer (Dixie) Howell, who caught for Pittsburgh, Cincinnati and Brooklyn in the late '40s and '50s.

The eighth son of a former major leaguer to be chosen was Vic Sorrell, Jr., whose dad pitched for the Tigers 30 years ago.

Another Conigliaro in Hub

The two brothers of current performers who were drafted are Billy Conigliaro, picked by Boston, which already has Tony, and Joseph Keough, 19-year-old first baseman from Pomona, Calif., who was picked by Kansas City for Vancouver. His brother, Marty, is with Cincinnati.

The White Sox, selecting for Clinton, laid claim to negotiation rights to Ronald Lolich, cousin of Tiger southpaw Mickey Lolich. Ron is an infielder from Portland, Ore.

Another name with a familiar ring was Gil Torres, Jr., 17-year-old outfielder chosen by Washington for Geneva. However, he is not related to the former Washington infielder of the same name, who was from Cuba. Young Gil, a Puerto Rican native, moved to New York only about nine months ago. He completed high school in Puerto Rico, but is now attending night classes at New York's Morris High.

Pitcher Ralph Foytack, a pitcher drafted by Detroit through Rocky Mount, is a nephew of Paul Foytack, former Tiger hurler.

Athletics Had Told Monday He'd Be Their Top Selection

OMAHA, Neb.—Arizona State outfielder Rick Monday said Kansas City, which selected him in baseball's new free-agent draft, told him "some time ago I would be their No. 1 draft choice."

The A's are "a good club to go with as far as an opportunity to play in the majors goes, and that's the reason anyone signs in pro ball," Monday said.

Monday said the fact that Kansas City drafted him does not mean a quick signing. He explained that no one knows "how the draft will affect the size of the bonuses."

Monday said he doesn't believe the major league clubs can afford to lose a top draft choice because it's a long wait until they get a chance to make another such selection.

The big outfielder said he has no plans for the summer and said he has been contacted by every major league club.

Monday, who has completed two years at Arizona State, said he definitely would continue his education at the University during the off season.

The Dodgers offered him \$20,000 to sign when he got out of high school. But Monday said, "I'm glad I waited."
