FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE MLB DRAFT



Question: How is the selection order determined?

Answer: Major League Clubs select in reverse order of their records at the close of the preceding season, without regard to League. Some transfers of selection rights from one Club to another are made as compensation to Clubs that lost certain types of Major League free agent players after the previous season. Additional selections are also awarded to Clubs that lost certain types of Major League free agent players after the previous seasons.

Question: How many rounds are there?

Answer: Up to 40 rounds. Each Club continues to select until it makes its selection in the 40th round. A Club has the right to “pass” instead of making a selection in a round.

Question: Who is eligible for the draft?

Answer: A player who is a resident of the United States or Canada and who has not previously contracted with a Major League or Minor League Club, so long as the player is eligible to sign under the High School, College or Junior College Rules contained in Major League Rule 3. For purposes of Rule 4, the term “United States” means the 50 states of the United States of America, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and any other Commonwealth, Territory or Possession of the United States of America. Players attending high school, college or junior college in the United States or Canada are considered residents of the United States or Canada for purposes of draft eligibility.

Question: What are the basic eligibility rules contained in the High School, College or Junior College Rules in Major League Rule 3?

Answer: High School — Generally, only those high school students in the United States or Canada who have completed their fourth school year following the date that the student’s class entered its freshman year of high school (i.e. ninth grade).

College — Generally, a student at a four-year college is eligible after completion of their junior year or if the student is at least 21 years old.

Junior College — All junior college students are eligible for selection.

The applicable Major League Rules are more specific than this general answer. Players with specific questions about eligibility should consult a Major League scout or Office of the Commissioner of Baseball.

Question: When may a selected player sign?

Answer: Generally, a selected player with college eligibility remaining may sign with the Club that selected the player from the time of the selection until the second or third Friday of July. For the 2016 signing season, the deadline is Friday, July 15th at 5:00 p.m. (ET).

Question: When may a selected player who has utilized all of his potential college eligibility sign?

Answer: A selected player with no college eligibility remaining may sign up until the start of the Closed Period. The Closed Period begins at 12:01 a.m. (ET) on the seventh day prior to the start of the MLB Draft.

The applicable Major League Rules are more specific than this general answer. Players with specific questions about eligibility should consult a Major League scout or Office of the Commissioner of Baseball.

Question: May a player who was not selected in the MLB Draft still sign?

Answer: Generally, yes, so long as the player is eligible under the High School, College, or Junior College Rules in Major League Rule 3. Such a player may sign with any Club until the start of the Closed Period. The Closed Period begins at 12:01 a.m. (ET) on the seventh day prior to the start of the MLB Draft.

Question: How do I search the MLB.com Draft Tracker for a college?

Answer: The schools are listed in the fashion they were submitted to the Major League Scouting Bureau. If you can't find your school under its alphabetical listing, try searching under the letter "U", for "University of."

Question: How many rounds are held each day during the three-day Draft?

Answer: There are 77 selections on day one of the Draft, which includes 34 selections in round one, seven selections in Competitive Balance Lottery Round A, 29 selections in round two and seven selections in Competitive Balance Lottery Round B. Day two of the Draft begins with round three and continues through round 10 for a total of 239 selections. Day three begins with round 11 and continues until the completion of the Draft in round 40. (Number of selections subject to change due to remaining free agents tied to draft pick compensation.)

FIRST-YEAR PLAYER DRAFT OFFICIAL RULES

The Major League Baseball Draft is held every year in June. Day one of the Draft is broadcast live while days two and three are conducted by conference call among the 30 Major League Clubs. The Clubs take turns selecting in reverse order of their won-lost record at the close of the previous regular season. The order of selection is without regard to League.

The Major League Rules govern which players are eligible for selection in the Draft. These Rules are detailed, but the basic eligibility criteria can be described as follows: Generally, a player is eligible for selection if the player is a resident of the United States or Canada and the player has never before signed a Major League or Minor League contract. Residents of Puerto Rico and other territories of the United States are eligible for the Draft. Also considered residents are players who enroll in a high school or college in the United States, regardless of where they are from originally.

Certain groups of players are ineligible for selection, generally because they are still in school. The basic categories of players eligible to be drafted are:

- High school players, if they have graduated from high school and have not yet attended college or junior college;
- College players, from four-year colleges who have either completed their junior or senior years or are at least 21 years old; and
- Junior college players, regardless of how many years of school they have completed.

A Club generally retains the rights to sign a selected player until the signing deadline, or until the player enters, or returns to, a four-year college or junior college on a full-time basis. A player who is drafted and does not sign with the selecting Club that may be drafted again at a future year's Draft, so long as the player is eligible for that year's Draft. A Club may not select a player again in a subsequent year, unless the player has consented to the re-selection.

A player who is eligible to be selected and is passed over by every Club becomes a free agent and may sign with any Club until the player enters, or returns to, a four-year college full-time or enters, or returns to, a junior college.

This description is a general one and the Major League Rules themselves, not this summary, govern eligibility issues. Players and coaches with questions about particular players are referred to the Baseball Operations Department at the Office of the Commissioner of Baseball.

REACHING THE BIG LEAGUES

According to an estimate by the Elias Sports Bureau, over 18,000 players have appeared in at least one Major League Baseball game all-time. According to Elias, the approximate average length of a career for a Major League player is five years. (This includes all players who appeared in at least one game.)

There are 750 roster slots in Major League Baseball for most of the year at a given time. A total of 1,348 players appeared in at least one Major League game in 2015.

A total of 65,312 players have been drafted since 1965. During that time, a total of 9,374 players, which includes drafted players, non-drafted players and foreign-born players, have appeared in at least one Major League game.

In Major League Baseball's first Free Agent Amateur Draft, the Kansas City Athletics selected Arizona State sophomore Rick Monday as the number one pick. Kansas City also chose 10 future Major Leaguers, including Sal Bando (6th round) and Gene Tenace (20th round), building the base for the Athletics' championship teams of the early 1970s.

A total of 813 players were selected. Some of the more significant picks were catcher Johnny Bench by the Cincinnati Reds, infielder Graig Nettles by Minnesota in the fourth round and pitcher Nolan Ryan by the New York Mets in the 12th round

The first player to reach the majors was pitcher Joe Coleman, the Washington Senators' first pick and third pick overall.

Two players fall in the category of the ones who got away -- Los Angeles selected pitcher Tom Seaver in the 10th round only to have him return to the University of Southern California campus. In fact, of the 70 players the Orioles selected, only six eventually played in the big leagues.

1966

A January Free Agent Amateur Draft was added for the first time in 1966. Ninety-five prospects were selected in the regular phase and 102 in the secondary phase of the January draft, which featured only players previously drafted who did not sign. With the number one pick in the regular phase of the June draft, the New York Mets passed on Arizona State slugger Reggie Jackson and instead chose high school catcher Steve Chilcott. He spent six seasons in the minors before injuries ended his career.

Although the Mets will be remembered for choosing Chilcott over Jackson, many forget they landed Tom Seaver that year. Seaver, who was declared ineligible by the NCAA to play college baseball and who also was ineligible to be selected in the winter draft, was signed by the Mets for \$50,000 in a special draft.

The Yankees tabbed left-handed pitcher Ken Stabler in the 10th round. Stabler went on to star in the NFL as a quarterback during the Oakland Raiders' championship years. Steve Garvey was the one who got away in 1966. Selected by the Minnesota Twins, Garvey elected to enroll at Michigan State.

The Dodgers didn't grab all the talent. Other draftees included Al Bumbry (Baltimore), Thurman Munson (Yankees), Greg Luzinski (Philadelphia) and Gary Matthews (San Francisco). The biggest steal of the June draft was Cecil Cooper, chosen in the 6th round by the Boston Red Sox.

The 1968 June draft also included the four expansion teams that began play in 1969. Montreal, San Diego, Kansas City and Seattle began the selection process at the end of the fourth round of the regular phase.

Roberts went directly to the Padres starting third base position from the University of Oregon campus.

The biggest steal was pulled off by the Texas Rangers when they selected infielder Mike Hargrove from Northwestern Oklahoma State University in the 25th round.

1973

Four dominating players of the late '70s and '80s were selected in the June regular phase. Infielder Robin Yount (Milwaukee) and outfielder Dave Winfield (San Diego) were first-rounders, while outfielder Fred Lynn (Boston) and infielder Eddie Murray (Baltimore) were second and third-round selections, respectively.

Winfield stepped off the University of Minnesota campus -- where he lettered in three sports -- and into the Padres' outfield. He was one of three players from this draft to go directly into the bigs. Highly-touted David Clyde was chosen by Texas as the nation's number one pick. He jumped from high school to the majors and won his first game as a Ranger shortly thereafter. But the hard-throwing lefthander developed arm problems and had a short-lived career. Besides Clyde and Winfield, Arizona State's Eddie Bane (Minnesota, 11th overall) went directly to the majors.

Other selections of interest included Mike Flanagan (Baltimore), Jack Clark (San Francisco), who was drafted as a pitcher, and Lee Mazzilli (New York Mets). In the January secondary phase, Dick Ruthven (Philadelphia), Jim Sundberg (Texas) and Donnie Moore (Chicago Cubs), who was drafted as an outfielder, were chosen.

Catcher Danny Goodwin became the only player ever drafted first in two June drafts, as the Angels tabbed him as their top selection. Four years earlier, Goodwin had been picked by the White Sox, but chose to attend Southern University instead.

None of the four players picked after Goodwin made it to the big leagues. In fact, only 12 of the 24 first round picks did. Andre Dawson was probably the biggest name in the 1975 draft, although he was overlooked until the Expos picked him in the 10th round. Other players included Rick Cerone (New York Yankees), Lou Whitaker (Detroit), Bump Wills (Texas), Clint Hurdle (Kansas City), Dale Berra (Pittsburgh) and Lee Smith (Chicago Cubs).

Surprisingly, the January draft yielded more future big leaguers than the June draft. The top two picks, Gene Richards and Willie Aikens, were chosen after their school, South Carolina State, dropped its baseball program.

The White Sox raised some brows when they passed on right-handed pitcher Bill Gullickson, a native of nearby Orland Park, IL, and selected outfielder Harold Baines as the number one pick in the country.

White Sox owner Bill Veeck had seen Baines play little league baseball in Maryland and had followed his progress through the years. After spending three seasons in the minors, Baines was a fixture in the White Sox lineup for 10 seasons.

Montreal had perhaps the best draft, choosing Gullickson second, pitcher Scott Sanderson in the third round and outfielder Tim Raines in the fifth. Other picks of interest included infielder Paul Molitor (Milwaukee), pitcher Richard Dotson (California), and catcher Terry Kennedy (St. Louis).

Shortstop Tom Goffena from Sidney, Ohio became the Toronto Blue Jays' first draft pick as he was chosen 25th in the first round. The Seattle Mariners picked 26th and took outfielder Dave Henderson from Dos Palos, CA as their first draft pick.

The Blue Jays also picked Danny Ainge out of Brigham Young University in the 15th round. Ainge, who was also drafted by the NBA's Boston Celtics, later left baseball for a career in basketball.

The 1979 draft may long be remembered as the year of the football player. Among future NFL players drafted by baseball teams were Dan Marino and John Elway (Kansas City), Jack Thompson (Seattle), Curt Warner (Philadelphia), Kevin House (St. Louis) and Jay Schroeder (Toronto). Michigan quarterback Rick Leach was drafted by the Tigers in the first round and went on to a major league career.

The number one pick in the June draft went to Seattle, which selected high school outfielder Al Chambers. Perhaps the biggest steal in the draft was the Yankees' selection of Don Mattingly in the 19th round.

Other significant selections in the draft were Tim Wallach (Montreal), Steve Howe (Los Angeles), Atlee Hammaker (Kansas City), Andy Van Slyke (St. Louis), Brett Butler (Atlanta), Pete O'Brien (Texas), Von Hayes (Cleveland), Marty Barrett (Boston) and Gary Gaetti (Minnesota).

1980

The 1980 June draft was marked by controversy. The Yankees had to forfeit their selection of Billy Cannon, Jr. after Commissioner Bowie Kuhn ruled that the club was guilty of tampering. Other major league clubs accused Cannon's father, former Heisman Trophy winner and NFL star Billy Sr., who had written 25 teams explaining that his son had planned to attend college and there was no reason to waste a draft pick on him.

Those clubs agreed and when it came time for the Yankees to pick in the third round, Cannon, who under normal circumstances would have been a first round selection, was available. After the selection was ruled void, Cannon chose to attend Texas A&M and was later a draft pick of the Dallas Cowboys.

The Yankees' cross-town rival fared much better in the draft. The Mets had three first round selections and picked Darryl Strawberry (number one overall), Billy Beane and John Gibbons with those picks.

Three years later, Strawberry was the National League's Rookie of the Year. Beane is now the General Manager of the Oakland Athletics, while Gibbons is the field Manager of the Toronto Blue Jays.

Other selections of note included Darnell Coles (Seattle), Terry Francona (Montreal), Dion James (Milwaukee), Glenn Wilson (Detroit) and Walt Terrell and Tom Henke (Texas). Francona would go on to manage the Boston Red Sox to their first World Series Championship since 1918 in the 2004 campaign.

1981

The 1981 draft illustrated a shift from the drafting of high school players to collegiate players. Of the first 50 players selected in June, 34 were from college programs, more than double the previous highest total.

Seventeen first round picks were from colleges. The previous high was nine in 1979 and 1980. It was also the first draft in which college players went 1-2, as the Mariners selected Oral Roberts pitcher Mike Moore and the Cubs followed with Wichita State outfielder Joe Carter.

Other prominent picks in the June draft included Kevin McReynolds and Tony Gwynn (San Diego), Ron Darling (Texas), Dick Schofield (California), Frank Viola (Minnesota), Mike Pagliarulo (New York Yankees), Phil Bradley (Seattle) and Sid Fernandez (Los Angeles). The Astros selected Glenn Davis in the secondary phase of the January draft.

The Yankees chose John Elway, who did not play in the Yankee farm system in 1981, but signed a contract that allowed him to play minor league ball for New York in 1982. After a few games with Oneonta in 1982, Elway decided to pursue a career in football.

1982

The New York Mets had a banner draft in 1982. Their top pick, Dwight Gooden, would earn National League Rookie of the Year honors two years later and each of their first five selections - Gooden, Floyd Youmans (2nd round), Roger McDowell (3rd round), Tracy Jones (4th round) and Gerald Young (5th round) - went on to play in the big leagues. Jones was the only one not to sign with the Mets.

The Cardinals also had an outstanding draft, picking up pitcher Todd Worrell (1st round), third baseman Terry Pendleton (7th round) and outfielder Vince Coleman (10th round), one of the draft's biggest steals. The most interesting pick was once again made by the Yankees, who selected Bo Jackson in the second round.

Other picks of note were Shawon Dunston (Chicago Cubs), Franklin Stubbs (Los Angeles), Sam Horn (Boston), Bret Saberhagen (Kansas City), Dale Sveum (Milwaukee) and Spike Owen (Seattle). The Twins selected Kirby Puckett in the January draft.

Hard-throwing Tim Belcher, selected by the Twins, became the second number one pick in the history of the draft not to sign a contract. The other number one pick who didn't sign was high school catcher Danny Goodwin, picked by the White Sox in 1971.

The Milwaukee Brewers had a very productive draft, choosing future major leaguers Dan Plesac (1st round), Glenn Braggs (2nd round), Mike Birkbeck (4th round) and Joey Meyer (5th round).

The Mets also drafted well, taking Stan Jefferson (1st round, compensation), Calvin Schiraldi (1st round, compensation), Dave Magadan (2nd round) and Rick Aguilera (3rd round).

The best pick of the draft was Boston's selection of Roger Clemens in the first round, 19th overall. Others selected in the 1983 June draft included Kurt Stillwell (Cincinnati), Jeff Klunkel (Texas), Joel Davis (Chicago White Sox) and Wally Joyner (California). San Francisco chose Robby Thompson in the secondary phase of the June draft.

1984

Of the 25 first round selections in the 1984 draft, 17 had played Major League Baseball by the start of the 1988 season. Sixteen of those players were on the original 30-man Olympic roster and a June draft record 18 were from colleges. Even the Cincinnati Reds, who had never selected a college player as their first pick, chose Seton Hall's Pat Pacillo in the first round.

The New York Mets made Shawn Abner, a high school outfielder from Pennsylvania, the number one pick. There had been speculation that for the first time ever, brothers would be chosen in the first round. But Abner's older brother, Ben, was not selected until the 5th round by the Expos.

Among the first round draft choices in 1984 were Cory Snyder (Cleveland), Mike Dunne (St. Louis), Mark McGwire (Oakland), Oddibe McDowell (Texas) and Scott Bankhead (Kansas City).

Surhoff (Milwaukee), the draft's number one pick, Will Clark (San Francisco), Bobby Witt (Texas), Barry Larkin (Cincinnati), Pete Incaviglia (Montreal) and Barry Bonds (Pittsburgh).

Incaviglia was selected eighth overall by the Expos, but was unable to reach a contract and was traded to Texas. He made his Major League debut on Opening Day 1986 as the Rangers' left fielder, becoming just the 15th drafted player to go directly to the majors.

1986

The final year of the January Free Agent Draft was in 1986. Since 1966, the January draft had been held for junior college players and those whose eligibility had expired. It also marked the final year of the draft being conducted in two phases, regular and secondary. Beginning in 1987, the Rule 4 draft would be conducted in June only, consisting of just one phase.

A total of 436 selections were made in the January draft and 1,004 in the June draft. Philadelphia led the way with 29 selections in January's regular phase, while the 48 selections each by Houston and Baltimore were tops in the June regular phase. Draftees with college baseball experience continued to outnumber high school draftees by a 2-1 margin. Selections from the June regular phase included 662 college players compared to 334 high school prospects. Sixty-four percent of the total selections (646) signed professional contracts, including 76 percent (504) of the college draftees and 43 percent (142) of the high school draftees.

1987

A record 1,263 selections were made in 75 rounds. The previous record was established in 1967 when 1,162 draftees were chosen. Kansas City led the way with 74 selections, followed by Toronto with 71 and the New York Mets and Cincinnati Reds with 61 each.

Of the 832 players chosen from two and four-year schools, 630 (76 percent) signed contracts. Only 160 (39 percent) of the 415 high school draftees reached agreements.

The Mariners made Ken Griffey, Jr., the son of major league Ken, Sr., the nation's number one pick. Others selected in the first round included Jack McDowell (Chicago White Sox), Derek Lilliquist (Atlanta), Delino DeShields (Montreal), Mike Remlinger (San Francisco), Jack Armstrong (Cincinnati) and Craig Biggio (Houston).

1988

For the second consecutive year, a record number of selections were made. There were 1,432 picks in 74 rounds, and Toronto led the way with 73 selections.

The San Diego Padres made University of Evansville right-hander Andy Benes the nation's top draft pick. Benes, who also played football and basketball in college, became the first pitcher selected number one since the Twins picked Tim Belcher in 1983. In all, 14 of the first 26 first round selections were pitchers, including four of the top five. University of Michigan pitcher Jim Abbott became the 16th drafted player to go directly to the majors. Abbott was the Angels' number one pick (8th overall) and made his major league debut against the Seattle Mariners on April 8, 1989.

The Chicago White Sox selected Oklahoma State's Robin Ventura with their number one pick (10th overall). Ventura set an NCAA record in 1988 with a 58-game hitting streak. The Montreal Expos tabbed Canadian David Wainhouse of Washington State with their number one pick (19th overall) while Pete Rose, Jr. was selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 12th round.

A draftee that falls into the one that got away category is catcher Mike Piazza, who was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers as their final pick of the draft in the 62nd round.

1989

The draft produced a record number of selections (1,483) for the third year in a row and a record number of rounds (88).

The Astros led all teams with 88 selections. Three of the top five players were drafted out of high school. Overall there were 597 high school players selected, the highest total since 1970, when 646 were chosen. Atlanta signed its first 14 selections, the most of any team.

The Baltimore Orioles, the first team since the draft began in 1965 to have the first pick and be in first place at the same time, made Louisiana State right-handed pitcher Ben McDonald, a two-time All-American and Olympic Gold Medalist, the draft's top pick.

The Toronto Blue Jays selected John Olerud, Baseball America's NCAA Player of the Year for 1987-88, as their third round pick and signed him on August 26th. Olerud went straight to the majors, the 17th player to do so, and went 2-for-4 against the Orioles in his first major league game.

Right-handed pitcher Scott Burrell from Hamden (CT) High School was the Mariners' number one pick (26th overall), but he opted for the University of Connecticut, where he led the Huskies' basketball team to the NCAA Tournament.

1990

The draft went a record 101 rounds, surpassing 1989's total of 88, and included a record 1,487 selections. The Astros led all clubs with 100 selections. Seattle was second with 75, followed by the Yankees (74), Montreal (71) and Atlanta (67).

The 1990 draft included two Class AA clubs, the Erie Sailors of the New York-Penn League and the Miami Miracle of the Florida State League. Rule 4 draft regulations permitted minor league clubs to participate. Erie made one selection, 24-year-old Brigham Young outfielder Gary Daniels. Miami made 16 selections, signing 15 of them, including All-American outfielder Paul Carey of Stanford in the fourth round.

Atlanta made Chipper Jones, a high school shortstop from the Bolles School in Jacksonville, FL, the draft's top pick. Detroit followed by picking outfielder Tony Clark out of Christian High School in El Cajon, CA. The top three picks and seven of the top 10 choices were out of high school.

Todd Van Poppel, a 6-5 right-handed pitcher from Martin High School in Arlington, Texas, was singled out as one of the top prospects prior to the draft, but he complicated the picture by stating his desire to attend the University of Texas. Thirteen clubs passed on Van Poppel until Oakland selected him. On July 16th, Van Poppel signed with the Athletics.

1992

A rule change made earlier in the year limited the 1992 draft to 50 rounds.

The Houston Astros made Phil Nevin, a 21-year-old junior at Cal-State Fullerton, the number one pick. Nevin, a third baseman, was named 1992 Collegiate Player of the Year by Baseball America while leading the Titans to an appearance in the College World Series.

The 1992 draft also marked the first time that Colorado and Florida, the National League's 1993 expansion teams, were allowed to participate in the amateur draft. The Rockies selected University of Florida right-hander John Burke with the 27th pick in the first round, while the Marlins chose Charles Johnson, a catcher from the University of Miami, as the 28th and final first round pick.

The first high school player selected was SS Derek Jeter from Kalamazoo, MI, by the New York Yankees. Jeter, who won A.L. Rookie of the Year honors in 1996, was a key component of New York's World Championship clubs in 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2009. Jeter was MVP of the 2000 World Series and in 2003 he was named the captain of the Yankees.

The Seattle Mariners made Alex Rodriguez, a 17-year-old shortstop from Westminster Christian High School in Miami, the top selection in the 1993 draft. Rodriguez batted .419 with 17 home runs, 70 RBI and 98 stolen bases in 100 games over three seasons, helping Westminster Christian to an 83-13-1 record during those years. Rodriguez was called up to the majors for the first time in 1994 and made an immediate impact as he became the third-youngest American League batting champion in 1996.

Right-handed pitcher Paul Wilson of Florida State University was the Mets' top draft choice and the number one selection overall in the 1994 draft.

Wilson, who was ranked as the number one draft prospect by Baseball America, was 11-5 with a 2.16 ERA in 17 games during the 1994 college season. He walked only 29 batters while striking out 144 in 125 innings pitched.

Ben Grieve, son of then-Texas Rangers general manager Tom Grieve, was the top high school draft pick, going to the Oakland Athletics as the second choice overall. Grieve went on to win the AL Rookie of the Year Award in 1998.

Nomar Garciaparra, the 12th pick by the Boston Red Sox, would go on to win the AL Rookie of the Year in 1997 and consecutive AL batting titles in 1999 and 2000.

1995

Outfielder Darin Erstad of the University of Nebraska was the first pick in the 1995 Rule 4 Draft. Erstad compiled a career .356 average in three seasons with the Cornhuskers, including 41 runs and 182 RBI in 176 games. He was the first Big Eight player to be selected as the top overall pick in MLB's Rule 4 Draft.

Among the first round selections were Kerry Wood, fourth overall by the Cubs, and Todd Helton, eighth overall by the Rockies. Wood made it to the majors in 1998 and won NL Rookie of the Year honors later that season. In just his fifth major league start, he tied the major league record of 20 strikeouts in a single game. Helton, who also played quarterback for the University of Tennessee with Peyton Manning, won his first NL batting title in 2000.

1996

Kris Benson and Billy Koch from Clemson University were selected first and fourth overall in the 1996 draft, marking the first time since 1978 and only the second time in history that two players from the same school were drafted in the top four selections. Benson — Baseball America's College Player of the Year and a member of the 1996 U.S. Olympic Team — was chosen by the Pittsburgh Pirates, who made just their second number one pick ever, and Koch was selected by the Toronto Blue Jays.

Four players drafted in the first round did not sign with their selecting clubs and were declared free agents according to Major League Rule 4. Travis Lee, chosen second overall by the Minnesota Twins, and John Patterson, selected fifth by the Montreal Expos, both signed with the expansion Arizona Diamondbacks. Matt White, the seventh pick by the San Francisco Giants, and Bobby Seay, the 12th selection by the Chicago White Sox, inked deals with the other expansion club, the Tampa Bay Devil Rays.

This draft marked the first-ever June Draft for Arizona and Tampa Bay, who would begin play in the 1998 season. With their first pick, 29th overall, the Devil Rays chose outfielder Paul Wilder from Raleigh, NC, while the Diamondbacks tabbed pitcher Nick Bierbrodt from Long Beach, CA with the 30th pick.

The Detroit Tigers made Rice University's Matt Anderson the first overall selection in the 1997 First-Year Player Draft. Rated as the top pitching prospect in college baseball by Baseball America, Anderson posted a 10-1 record with a 1.82 ERA.

The 1997 draft marked the first time in history that two brothers were selected in the first round. J.D. Drew was taken second overall by Philadelphia and his brother, Tim, was chosen 28th by Cleveland.

Stetson University's Kevin Nicholson of Surrey, British Columbia was selected 27th by San Diego, becoming the first player from Canada to be taken in the first round.

For the first time since 1972, two players from the same high school were chosen in the first round, Michael Cuddyer (9th by Minnesota) and John Curtice (17th by Boston) from Great Bridge HS in Chesapeake, Va.

1998

A rule change earlier in the year once again limited the draft to 50 rounds.

The Philadelphia Phillies made Pat Burrell of the University of Miami (FL) the first overall selection in the 1998 First-Year Player Draft. Rated as the best pure hitter and the best power hitter in college baseball by Baseball America, Burrell hit .432 with 17 homers and 47 RBI in 35 games.

Among the high school players chosen was Sean Burroughs, son of former major leaguer Jeff Burroughs, by San Diego with the ninth selection.

The St. Louis Cardinals used the fifth selection on Florida State star J.D. Drew, who was chosen second overall in 1997 but did not sign with the Phillies. Drew signed with the Cardinals in July and made his Major League debut on September 8, 1998.

1999

The Tampa Bay Devil Rays, with their first No. 1 selection in franchise history, made Josh Hamilton of Athens Drive High School in Raleigh, NC the first overall selection in the 1999 First-Year Player Draft. Hamilton was the first high school player taken first overall since Seattle chose Alex Rodriguez in 1993. In his senior year, Hamilton hit .529 with a school record 13 home runs and 35 RBI.

Among the first round picks was Ben Sheets, chosen 10th by the Brewers. Sheets, who made his Major League debut in 2001, was a key member of the USA Olympic Baseball Team that captured the gold medal at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Australia.

Like Sheets, several fellow pitchers chosen in the first round found success in the Major Leagues. Three-time All-Star Barry Zito won the 2002 Cy Young Award with the Oakland A's. Red Sox hurler Josh Beckett was named MVP of the 2003 World Series for the Marlins, blanking the Yankees in a Game Six five-hit shutout at Yankee Stadium.

Other notable picks were Astros right-hander Brett Myers (Phillies), Jason Jennings (Rockies) and Dodgers reliever Mike MacDougal (Royals).

The most prominent player taken in the 1999 draft was Albert Pujols, the 2005, 2008 and 2009 NL MVP. The 10-time All-Star was picked in the 13th round.

2000

The Florida Marlins made Adrian Gonzalez of Eastlake High School in Chula Vista, CA the first overall selection in the 2000 First-Year Player Draft. Gonzalez, who was rated as the best pure high school hitter in the draft by Baseball America, was the first high school first baseman taken first overall since the New York Yankees chose Ron Blomberg in 1967. In his senior year, Gonzalez hit .645 with 13 home runs and 34 RBI. After a stint with the Texas Rangers, Gonzalez would become the first baseman of his hometown San Diego Padres, for whom he hit .304 with 24 home runs and 82 RBI in 2006, before being traded to the Boston Red Sox prior to the 2011 season.

Among the college players chosen were David Parrish, son of former Major Leaguer Lance Parrish, by the New York Yankees with the 28th pick. In addition, David Espinosa (Reds), a high school shortstop from Miami, FL, became the first RBI (Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities) alumnus ever selected in the first round of the draft.

Outfielder Xavier Nady, a second round pick of the San Diego Padres out of the University of California, went straight to the Major Leagues in 2000. He became the 19th player to do so since the draft started in 1965.

In 2006, Chase Utley (Phillies) would make his first National League All-Star Team, while Adam Wainwright (Braves) would record the final out of the 2006 World Series for the victorious Cardinals by striking out Detroit's Brandon Inge.

2001

The Minnesota Twins selected St. Paul, MN native Joe Mauer with the number one pick in the 2001 draft. The 18-year-old Mauer, a catcher from Cretin-Derham H.S. in St. Paul, became the seventh Minnesotan to be selected in the first round and the first to be chosen number one overall. The left-handed hitting backstop was a member of the USA Junior National Team and won a gold medal at the world tournament in Taiwan in 1999. He was also a high school football standout as a quarterback and signed a letter of intent to play football at Florida State University before being drafted. In 2006, Mauer would become the first AL catcher to win the batting title with a .347 clip (won AL batting title in 2008 and 2009 as well). At age 23, he was the youngest A.L. batting champion since Seattle's Alex Rodriguez, 21, in 1996. In 2009, Mauer was crowned the AL Most Valuable Player.

Right-hander Mark Prior of the University of Southern California was selected by the Chicago Cubs with the second overall pick. Prior was previously selected in the supplemental first round of the 1998 draft by the Yankees. Prior won numerous National Player of the Year awards after going 15-1 with a 1.69 ERA and 202 strikeouts to lead the Trojans to a College World Series berth in his junior year. Prior went 18-6 with a 2.43 ERA in 2003 as the Cubs reached the National League Championship Series.

Other first round picks included two-time AL All-Star Mark Teixeira, 2004 AL Rookie of the Year Bobby Crosby, 2006 National League MVP Ryan Howard and five-time NL All-Star David Wright.

2002

The Pittsburgh Pirates selected 21-year-old right-handed pitcher Bryan Bullington with the first overall pick in the 2002 MLB Draft. The 6'5", 225-pound hurler was ranked by Baseball America as having the best breaking ball and best command among all college pitchers. In his three-year career at Ball State, Bullington posted a 29-11 record, 13 complete games and a 3.36 ERA in 46 games (42 starts). He is the university's all-time leader in strikeouts (357) and was a member of the 2001 USA National team. As a freshman, Bullington garnered all-conference honors and led the MAC in strikeouts. He was also named MAC Pitcher-of-the-Year for 2001 and 2002.

Other notable selections in the first round included Prince Fielder (Brewers), son of former Major Leaguer Cecil Fielder; and John Mayberry Jr. (Mariners), son of former Major Leaguer John Mayberry.

Greene was the first player from the 2002 Draft to make the Majors.

The Tampa Bay Devil Rays selected Camarillo High School outfielder Delmon Young with the first overall pick

As a senior in high school, Young (6-3, 205 pounds) batted .541 (33-for-61) with seven home runs, 28 RBI in 22 games. He was named Baseball America's High School Player of the Year in 2002 and was one of only three juniors selected as first team 2002 All-Americans. He became the first junior to be named California State Player of the Year since Eric Chavez in 1995.

At the World Junior Championships in Sherbrooke, Quebec, he helped lead Team USA to a bronze medal while batting .513 with a tournament-record eight home runs and 19 RBI in 38 at-bats.

Delmon is the younger brother of Dmitri Young, who was an expansion draft pick of the Rays, but never played in the organization. They became the first set of brothers to be taken within the first five selections of the draft. Dmitri was selected fourth overall by the Cardinals in the 1991 draft.

Pitchers Ryan Wagner (Cincinnati), Chad Cordero (Montreal), David Aardsma (San Francisco) and infielder Rickie Weeks (Milwaukee) all reached the Major League level in less than a year.

2004

The San Diego Padres stayed close to home with the first overall pick of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft, tabbing high school shortstop Matthew Bush from Mission Bay (CA) High School. Bush, the first high school shortstop taken first overall since the Seattle Mariners chose Alex Rodriguez in 1993, batted .450 with 11 home runs, 35 RBI and 12 stolen bases during his senior year. The 18-year-old helped lead the Buccaneers to two San Diego Section Division III championships in three years, setting state records for career hits (211) and runs scored (188) in the process.

Pitchers from Rice University were the most popular choices in the early going of the draft. Three Owl hurlers went among the top eight selections. Wolfson Senior High School teammates Billy Butler (KC) and Eric Hurley (TEX) were both picked in the first round.

The 2004 amateur draft saw 31 players drafted whose fathers played professional baseball at some point in their career. Two younger brothers of Major Leaguers went in the first round. The Angels selected Jered Weaver, brother of Dodgers right-hander Jeff. The Arizona Diamondbacks went with Stephen Drew, brother of J.D. and Tim.

Oakland's Huston Street was the first player from the 2004 Draft to reach the Majors (2005). He was named the 2005 A.L. Rookie of the Year. Justin Verlander would go on to become the 2006 A.L. Rookie of the Year and was an integral part of Detroit's pennant-winning 2006 campaign.

The Diamondbacks used the top overall pick on high school shortstop Justin Upton, thus making him and his older brother B.J. the highest selected pair of brothers in the history of the draft. The Devil Rays selected B.J. with the second overall pick of the 2002 draft. Justin Upton made his ML debut in 2007 and hitting .221. With the fourth overall pick, the Nationals chose third baseman Ryan Zimmerman of the University of Virginia. Zimmerman and B.J. Upton played in the same Virginia AAU program as New York Mets third baseman David Wright in their youth.

Three 2005 first round selections saw action before the conclusion of the Major League season. Atlanta's Joey Devine became the first Brave since Bob Horner in 1978 to appear in the Majors the same year he was drafted. Zimmerman and Boston's Craig Hansen joined their Major League clubs in September 2005.

In 2007 Ryan Braun and Troy Tulowitzki finished 1 and 2 in the voting for NL Rookie of the Year. Ryan Braun won the award by two points marking the closest race in the NL since the current system was adopted in 1980.

Clay Buchholz made his ML debut in 2007, throwing a no-hitter against Baltimore on September 1st, and becoming only the third pitcher since 1900 to throw a no-hitter in his first or second Major League start. Buchholz finished the 2007 season with a 3-1 record and an ERA of 1.59.

Pitching accounted for 18 of the 30 selections in the first round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft, including the top choice, righthander Luke Hochevar, who was chosen by the Kansas City Royals. The University of Tennessee product pitched for the Fort Worth Cats of the Independent League after not reaching terms with the Los Angeles Dodgers, who selected him in the sandwich round (40th overall) of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft.

Six of the first seven picks and nine of the first 12 selections were pitchers. In addition to the 18 hurlers, seven outfielders, three third basemen and two catchers made up the rest of the first round.

The first six picks were from the college ranks. University of North Carolina pitchers Andrew Miller (6th overall, Tigers) and Daniel Bard (28th, Red Sox) and University of Texas teammates Drew Stubbs (8th overall, Reds) and Kyle McCulloch (29th, White Sox) went in the first round.

Detroit's Miller would become the first player from the 2006 Draft to reach the Major Leagues. He debuted in relief during a doubleheader at Yankee Stadium on August 30. He would make eight relief appearances for the Tigers during their pennant-winning season.

Kyle Drabek, the son of longtime Major League pitcher Doug Drabek, was chosen by the Philadelphia Phillies with the 18th pick.

Pitching accounted for 16 of the 30 selections in the first round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft, including the top choice, lefthander David Price, who was chosen by the Tampa Bay Devil Rays. In his last season at Vanderbilt, Price led the nation with a school-record 194 strikeouts (in 133.1 inning pitched), the second most in SEC history behind another number one overall pick, Ben McDonald (202 with LSU in 1989). His 11 victories led the SEC and were second most in school history. That same season Price won the Collegiate Baseball Co-Player of the Year Award and was named SEC Pitcher of the Year. In 2008, Price helped lead the Tampa Bay Rays to the franchise's first American League pennant and World Series as they defeated the Boston Red Sox in seven games in the ALCS.

Washington's Ross Detwiler (6th overall) made his Major League debut on September 7th at Atlanta, becoming the first member of the 2007 draft class to appear in a big league game. Detwiler tossed one inning of perfect ball along with one strikeout.

The Detroit Tigers selected Seton Hall Prep's Rick Porcello with the 27th overall selection. Porcello went 14-9 with a 3.96 ERA as a rookie for Detroit in 2009. At 21-years-old, Rick started a one-game playoff on October 6, 2009 against the Minnesota Twins to determine the A.L. Central Division Champion. He tossed 5.2 innings, allowing one earned run with eight strikeouts in the no-decision as the Tigers fell 6-5.

The four catchers selected was the most in the First-Year Player Draft since four were selected in 1994 and the last time three catchers were chosen in the top 10 was 1975.

Outfielder Aaron Hicks, who was in attendance at the Milk House, was selected by the Minnesota Twins with the 14th overall selection in the first round. The Woodrow Wilson High School (Los Angeles, CA) senior is an alumnus of MLB's Urban Youth Academy in Compton, California.

The 2008 First-Year Player Draft had the fewest amount of outfielders ever chosen in the first round as the 18-year-old Hicks was the sole outfielder selected.

Catcher Buster Posey, who was selected fifth overall by the San Francisco Giants out of Florida State University, was crowned the 2010 National League Rookie of the Year as he led the Giants to their first World Series title since 1954.

The Washington Nationals, who had the first overall pick for the second consecutive year, selected Bryce Harper from Southern Nevada Junior College. Harper hit .443 with 23 doubles, four triples, 31 home runs, 98 RBI, 39 walks and 20 stolen bases in 66 games for College of Southern Nevada in the Scenic West Athletic Conference. Despite being 17 years old and the youngest player in the SWAC, Harper posted .526 and .987 on-base and slugging percentages, respectively. He led his conference and team in virtually every primary offensive category and was named 2010 SWAC Player of the Year in addition to earning First-Team SWAC All-Conference status. Harper's 31 home runs in 2010 set a College of Southern Nevada single-season mark, easily besting the former record of 12.

Delino DeShields Jr., son of 1987 first round selection Delino DeShields (12th overall by Montreal), was selected eighth overall by the Houston Astros. Cam Bedrosian, son of 1987 N.L. Cy Young Award winner Steve Bedrosian, was the 29th overall selection by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim.

The Pittsburgh Pirates selected UCLA right-handed pitcher Gerrit Cole with the first overall selection in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft. In 16 games as a junior with UCLA, Cole went 6-8 with a 3.31 ERA, four complete games, a shutout and 119 strikeouts. During his three years at UCLA, Cole ranked second in school history in strikeouts (376), third in starts (49) and fifth in innings pitched (322.1). Cole also finished third on UCLA's single-season strikeouts list (153 in 2010) and sixth on the Pac-10's career strikeouts list (376). Cole was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round of the 2008 Draft out of Orange Lutheran (CA) High School.

Pitchers were the most frequently chosen players, with 793 being chosen (575 RHP, 218 LHP). The rest of the 2011 pool was comprised of 343 infielders (including 82 third basemen), 260 outfielders and 134 catchers. Vanderbilt University had 12 players selected, the most in the Draft, while Arizona State, the University of Florida, the University of Oklahoma and the University of South Carolina at Columbia each produced 11 players.

Three clubs selected the son of their manager: the Oakland Athletics picked Bob Geren's son Brett in the 42nd round; the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim selected Mike Scioscia's son Matthew in the 45th round; and the Toronto Blue Jays chose John Farrell's son Shane in the 46th round.

The Houston Astros selected shortstop Carlos Correa with the first pick in the 2012 First-Year Player Draft. Correa played amateur baseball at the Puerto Rico Baseball Academy in Gurabo, P.R. He became the highest-drafted player ever out of Puerto Rico, a title that previously belonged to catcher Ramon Castro, who was picked 17th overall by Houston in 1994. Correa would later be named 2015 AL Rookie of the Year.

Five players who were in attendance at MLB Network's Studio 42, including Correa were all selected in the opening round. The others included Oklahoma State left-handed pitcher Andrew Heaney (9th overall, MIA); Barbe H.S. (LA) shortstop Gavin Cecchini (12th overall, NYM); Carroll H.S. (TX) outfielder Courtney Hawkins (13th overall, CWS); and Union H.S. (WA) catcher Clint Coulter (27th overall, MIL).

Pitchers were the most frequently chosen players, with 630 being selected (461 RHP, 169 LHP). The rest of the 2012 pool was comprised of 270 infielders (including 121 shortstops), 211 outfielders and 127 catchers. Arizona State University had 10 players selected, the most in the Draft, while Texas Tech University, the University of Florida and the University of Kentucky each produced nine players. Rice University, Texas A&M and the University of Arkansas each had eight.

Four Clubs selected the son of their current manager: the St. Louis Cardinals picked Mike Matheny's son Tate in the 23rd round; the Milwaukee Brewers selected Ron Roenicke's son Lance in the 25th round; the Arizona Diamondbacks selected Kirk Gibson's son Cameron in the 38th round; and the Chicago Cubs picked Dale Sveum's son Rustin in the 39th round. 2013

The Houston Astros selected right-handed pitcher Mark Appel with the first pick in the 2013 Draft. Appel went 10-4 with four complete games and a 2.12 ERA as a senior at Stanford University. He recorded 130 strikeouts in his 106.1 innings pitched and allowed just a .203 opponent's batting average.

Eight players who were in attendance at MLB Network's Studio 42 were selected in the opening round, including outfielder Clint Frazier, who was drafted out of Loganville High School in Georgia by the Cleveland Indians with the fifth overall selection. The others included Junipero Serra H.S. (CA) first baseman Dominic Smith (11th overall, NYM); Lakewood H.S. (CA) shortstop J.P. Crawford (16th overall, PHI); East Central Community College shortstop Tim Anderson (17th overall, CWS); Lexington H.S. (SC) catcher Nick Ciuffo (21st overall, TB); Plano West H.S. (TX) outfielder Billy McKinney (24th overall, OAK); Fresno State University outfielder Aaron Judge (32nd overall, NYY); and James Madison H.S. (CA) left-handed pitcher Ian Clarkin (33rd overall, NYY).

Pitchers were the most frequently chosen players, with 657 being selected (475 RHP, 182 LHP). The rest of the 2013 pool was comprised of 276 infielders (including 122 shortstops, 56 third basemen, 55 first basemen and 43 second basemen), 184 outfielders and 99 catchers. The University of Arkansas had 11 players selected, the most in the Draft, while Louisiana State University had nine and the University of San Diego had seven. Ten schools produced seven players apiece.

The Colorado Rockies selected Brody Weiss, the son of their current manager, Walt Weiss, in the 22nd round. In addition, Luke Farrell, the son of Boston Red Sox manager John Farrell, was selected in the sixth round by the Kansas City Royals. The Atlanta Braves drafted Kyle Wren, the son of their current general manager, Frank Wren, in the eighth round.

2014

The Houston Astros selected left-handed pitcher Brady Aiken with the first pick in the 2014 Draft. Aiken went 7-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 11 starts in his senior season at Cathedral Catholic High School in San Diego, CA. He was just the fifth left-handed pitcher ever selected first overall in the Draft and the first since David Price was selected by Tampa Bay first overall in 2007.

Five players who were in attendance at Studio 42 were selected in the opening round, including shortstop Nick Gordon, who was drafted out of Olympia High School in Florida by the Minnesota Twins with the fifth overall selection. The others included Waiakea H.S. (HI) left-handed pitcher Kodi Medeiros (12th overall, MIL); Conway H.S. (SC) right-handed pitcher Grant Holmes (22nd overall, LAD); Elk Grove H.S. (CA) outfielder Derek Hill (23rd overall, DET); and Sprayberry Senior H.S. (GA) shortstop Michael Chavis (26th overall, BOS).

Gordon followed in the footsteps of his father, Tom, who was drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the sixth round of the 1986 Draft, and his brother, Dee, who was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the fourth round of the 2008 Draft.

Medeiros became the third player from Hawaii, and the first high schooler, to be drafted in the first round of the June Draft. The others include right-handed pitcher Mike Campbell (7th overall, 1985, SEA), right-handed pitcher Mark Johnson (19th overall, 1996, HOU) and second baseman Kolten Wong (22nd overall, 2011, STL), all of whom attended the University of Hawaii at Manoa.

A record-tying 20 pitchers, including 12 right-handers and eight left-handers, were selected in the first round of the Draft, the most among all positions. Other players taken in the opening round featured five outfielders, five shortstops, two catchers, one first baseman and one third baseman. This year marked the fourth time that at least 20 pitchers were selected in the first round, joining 1993, 1999 and 2001. It was also the fourth consecutive Draft that at least five shortstops were selected in the opening round.

2015

The Arizona Diamondbacks selected Vanderbilt University shortstop Dansby Swanson with the first overall pick in the Draft. Swanson became the 10th shortstop chosen with the top selection, and the first since the Houston Astros selected Carlos Correa in 2012.

Four players who were in attendance at Studio 42 were selected in the opening round, including the third overall selection by the Colorado Rockies, Brendan Rodgers; Niskayuna H.S. (NY) outfielder Garrett Whitley (13th overall, TB); Cathedral H.S. (IN) right-handed pitcher Ashe Russell (21st overall, KC); and Stroudsburg H.S. (PA) right-handed pitcher Mike Nikorak (27th, COL).

A record-tying eight shortstops were selected in the first round of the Draft, matching the total number of shortstops selected in the opening round in 2002 and 1971. Other players taken in the first round featured 15 pitchers, including 12 right-handers and three left-handers; eight outfielders; two catchers; two first basemen; and one third baseman.

A total of 19 players in the first round were chosen from college, while 16 were selected from the high school ranks. Left-handed pitcher Brady Aiken (17th overall, CLE), who was the top overall selection in the 2014 Draft, was the lone player selected in the opening round without ties to a school.

The states of California and Florida each produced seven players in the first round, followed by Georgia (4) and Texas (3). For the 13th time in the last 14 years, at least one pair of teammates (college or high school) were selected in the first round when Swanson (1st overall, ARI), right-handed pitcher Carson Fulmer (8th overall, CWS) and right-handed pitcher Walker Buehler (24th overall, LAD) were selected out of Vanderbilt University.
