CHICAGO, Ill. — Shortstop Zoilo Versalles was not concerned about whether Chicago's Ron Hansen got a hit or he drew on error for the White Sox' 2-1 victory over the Twins Friday night, but he was inclined to think he was playing out of position — on manager's orders.

Manager Cal Ermer of the Twins said, "We had Zoilo playing in the hole, shading to third base on the right-handed Hansen because we were pitching him inside, and he pulls to left."

But Zoilo said, "I've played in this league seven years now and Hansen doesn't pull everything, particularly not with two strikes."

batting against right-handed relief pitcher Al Worthington.
