In Boston Tast week, Stange beat Boswell 3-0 on a threehitter. Dave won 3-2 over Stange at the Met, June 28.

"I know I've had some control problems lately," said Boswell, "but I honestly don't think I should lose my starting spot to any pitcher. My hits per innings pitched have always been the best on the staff (106 hits in 147 innings this year).

"I said I'd go to the bullpen if they wanted, but it would be full time. I want to start because I've always been a starter. But if I relieve, I want to relieve, not both."
