BAUMORE, Md.—THINGS are happening on opposite sides of the Potomac these days, and they are bringing joy to football fans.

On the Maryland shore, Baltimore's Johnny Unitas is competing against Jim Brown of the Washington, D.C. side. Sonny Jurgensen is bringing an if-anything counts but winning.

You will guess immediately that coach Vince Lombardi has much to do with this change in attitude in the Redskins' gifted quarterback.

Coach Norm Van Brocklin of the Atlanta Falcons has said, "Jurgensen is the finest passer in professional football; he only needs one more year to greatness."

Jurgensen succeeded Van Brocklin as quarterback for the Philadelphia Eagles and Van Brocklin has been trying to get his even since.

Other good football players find a better teacher than Lombardi is the lightest and quickest he has been in years.

The greatest change in the Washington scene has been between the former coach, underachiever Otto Graham, and the new coach, dynamo Lombardi. The greatest effect of the change will be seen in the performance of quarterback Jurgensen and his use of a meeting corps involved in another.

Lombardi has this one element of strength and the knowledge of how to exploit it. When he compared Jurgensen to Horning, his most loved player, he let the world know what means he intended to put the Redskins on the move.

The question used to be did Lombardi make Bart Starr or did Starr make Lombardi?

The answer must be that there was a union of talents, mostly Lombardi's. Now Lombardi has Jurgensen and Jurgensen has already declared that his new coach has his fire in him.

When Lombardi went to Green Bay he transformed a squad which had not seen a game year before into a winner within two years and without much change in personnel.

He merely moved the parts to their proper places—horning from quarterback to halfback, for example. Perhaps he can do the same thing at Washington.

Does it bother him that he has Redskins but to the American Football League Buffalo Bills has Patrick? Well, the league season starts you play to win. In the preseason you play to get ready for the regular season. We made progress in that, and that is what we were there for, said Lombardi.

The Baltimore Colts are moving into by custom step in returning command of their team to Johnny Unitas. He was the hero of last year's Super Bowl when he led the Colts to the league championship but disaster in the Super Bowl game with the New York Jets.

Unitas has been passing well. The Colts say it was a typical Unitas performance with a few exceptions. He threw only the second quarter last Saturday, he carried his team on 17 passes against the Oakland Raiders, probably the best team in the American Football League unless you want to call the Kansas City Chiefs the best.

The Colts with Unitas in command, must be among the strongest teams in the NFL. This will be their last season in the league. They have volunteered for a realignment.

The Colts have a record of near misses. In 1964 they lost to Cleveland in a championship game. In 1965 they lost to Green Bay in a sudden death thriller. In 1967 only one defeat, by the Rams, cost them the title. In 1968 they lost to the NY Jets then suffered a humiliating defeat to the Jets in the Super Bowl.

The Colts have the year of greatest strength—if Unitas survives.

Their defensive unit is superb in every segment, further fortified by rapid improvement of big defensive end Bubba Smith, now in his third year. John Williams, Minnesota has been moved from the offensive line to defensive end and is much improved there.

More offensive punch, which has been needed, may come from Terry Cole, the 225-pound fullback. He is two years out of the Indiana backfield.

There, in his last game, he tipped Purdue's defense apart and pointed the Hoosiers toward the Rose Bowl.

Satterstrom Wins Title

ALEXANDRIA, Minn.—Steve Satterstrom of North Branch, Minn., clinched the caliber of his golf with each match, was the champion of the 48th Resorters' tournament Sunday by shooting four under par to win. Dick Blossom in the final.

After competing on the 1965 and 1966 state high school championship golf teams at North Branch, he declined a scholarship from the University of Minnesota to enroll at New Mexico State and got his own tuition. He got a scholarship there after winning the first freshman tournament in the 1966 NCAA tournament at La Crosse, Wis., by being the driving force with an average of 296 yards and completing 130 holes in 130 holes, 18 strokes under par, and 18 strokes under par, with a 10-hole bogey.

He needed a 10-hole putt on the 36th hole of the medal play qualifying to make it with a 10 hole, but from that point on he was 18 strokes under par, with a 10-hole bogey.

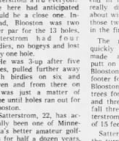
He finished the tournament with a 5 and 3 in the five matches.

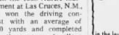
