Vikings' Warwick Suffers Knee Injury; Hargrove Moves In

MANKATO, Minn.—The Minnesota Vikings' defensive line was stopped by an asterisk as player Brad Rowden was injured when middle linebacker Lonnie Warwick was hit by a knee injury.

That loss, the fifth of major consequence suffered by the defense since shortly before coach Bud Grant announced assignment of quarterbacks for the Vikings' first exhibition game.

Warwick was injured on the first play of a pass-back drill yesterday afternoon. It was the same knee on which Warwick had had surgery.

Now four of last year's defensive starters—Warwick, linebacker Don Hayes, defensive back Dale Haskbark and end Carl Eller—will miss Saturday night's exhibition opener against Philadelphia at Tulsa, Okla.
