Twins set rules for playoff, World Series ticket orders

The Twins announced Sunday that mail-order ticket applications for possible postseason play will be accepted through Sept. 8.

Vice president of operations Dave Moore said the club was given permission by the American League and National League Championship Series or one ticket for each of the four possible home World Series games.

Playoff ticket strips (four games) are priced at \$100 for lower deck reserved seats (\$25 per game) \$30 for upper deck reserved and lower left field seats, and \$60 for seats in the upper pavilion.

For the World Series, lower deck reserved seats are \$140 (\$40 per game), upper deck reserved and left or left field seats are \$120 and seats in the upper pavilion are \$80.

Money for games not played will be refunded. Complete refund information is on the back of each ticket.

Only applications received before Sept. 8 will be accepted, and they must be mailed in a legible envelope, with only one application per envelope.

If the Twins win the Western Division, they will host games Oct. 7 and 8. If sixth and seventh games are needed, they will be played at the Metrodome Oct. 24 and 25.
