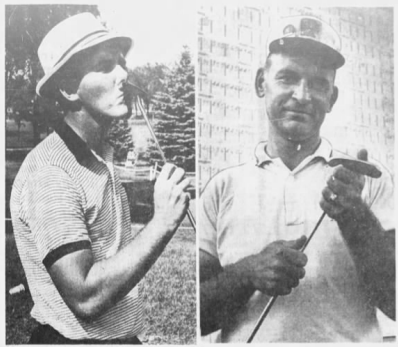


# 13 One-Putts Take Publinx Lead

## NFL Team Needs 2 Top Quarterbacks

AS TRENDS DEVELOP IN NATIONAL LEAGUE football two first-year quarterbacks are not too many. Fortunate is the team, such as the Minnesota Vikings, which has two such similar quarterbacks as Fran Tarkenton and Ron VanderKelen.

The time of the deep-back quarterback who works out of a pocket and is amply protected against harm is passing.

Since the pro went to the three-end system of attack—two ends and an eligible flanker—offenses have been gradually creeping up on the running attack which has only two ball carriers. Two are not enough.

Therefore, the quarterback, precious though he may be, must carry the ball—by design or in emergency—some part of the time.

“Either that,” said coach Norm Van Brocklin, “or the halfback must be able to pass—such as Paul Hornung of Green Bay—enough to make the running game a threat.”

Free are the passing halfbacks in the NFL. Therefore, the quarterback may have to do more and more running. That is why the San Francisco 49ers are happy to have drafted George Mira of Miami. He is that type of quarterback. The 49ers think Mira may move them up a few notches.

WHEN TARKENTON JOINED THE VIKINGS his ascending was spectacular but was considered unsteady. However, rather than Tarkenton dropping back into the pocket passing style of the pros, other quarterbacks who can assemble an winning reception.

Couch Vince Lombardi of Green Bay recognized the problem when he drafted Nebraska quarterback Dennis Claidner. Having a non-scrambling quarterback in Bert Starr, Lombardi took the alternative of passing halfback.

To solidify this threat he will make Claidner, who is big and can run, a halfback, ostensibly a passing halfback. The Packers may not pass much from this position, but the opponents will never be allowed to forget that the action pass is in their hands.

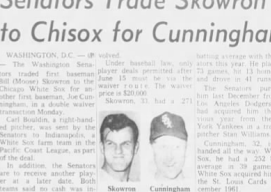
Commercialization of amateur sports by an enlightened public relations and advertising group may or may not be the American answer to Communism.
