**COMPLAINANT**

The Complainant, being duly sworn, makes complaint to the above-named Court and states that there is probable cause to believe that the Defendant committed the following offense: The complainant states that the following facts establish PROBABLE CAUSE:

Your complainant, Sgt. Al Larson, is an investigator for the Eden Prairie Police Department. In that capacity, he has investigated the facts and circumstances of this matter.

Complainant has learned that on September 6, 2002, Eden Prairie police received a complaint from K.L., a known adult female, regarding a person later identified as Kirby NMN Puckett, Defendant herein. K.L. states that on that date, she went with friends to the Redstone American Grill located at 8000 Eden Road, Eden Prairie, Hennepin County, Minnesota. She arrived at about 9:45 p.m. on September 5, 2002. She stated that at about 12:30 a.m. on September 6, 2002, while standing near the entrance to the restrooms, the Defendant grabbed her left arm below the elbow, dragged her into the men's restroom and then touched her breast. K.L. did not consent to Defendant's actions. K.L. had no contact with the Defendant prior to 12:30 a.m. when Defendant grabbed her and she did not recognize him at the time she was grabbed. She reported the incident to Redstone employees shortly after it happened. Redstone employees informed her that the person she had pointed out as the perpetrator was Kirby Puckett.

Detective James Lindgren formally interviewed K.L. later that day. She stated that she was waiting to use the restroom that day at approximately 12:30 a.m. when the Defendant suddenly grabbed her by the arm and began dragging her towards the men's restroom. She stated that she was shocked by this and resisted the Defendant's efforts to drag her into the men's restroom by trying to deaden her body weight and by grabbing at the doorframe around the men's restroom door. K.L. stated that once inside the men's restroom, the Defendant pushed her into a stall and reached from behind her and placed his hand on one of her breasts for several seconds. K.L. said that a female friend of hers yelled into the men's restroom at which time the Defendant let go of her and she left the men's restroom. K.L. also reported that she had bruises on her left forearm where Defendant had grabbed her. She also had a bruise and swelling on her

ankle which had struck the doorframe as she was being dragged into the men's restroom. Detective Lindgren observed these bruises. A physician who examined K.L. on September 7, 2002 also documented the bruises. In addition, K.L. reported that she had a bruise on her right breast. A female Eden Prairie officer has confirmed the presence of a faint bruise on K.L.'s right breast.

A.A. is a known adult male who was identified as a witness to this incident. Detective Lindgren has interviewed A.A. who states that he does not know K.L. and he did not recognize the Defendant, stating that he did not see the perpetrator's face during the incident. A.A. states that at approximately 12:30 a.m., he was standing outside the men's restroom when he saw a man grab K.L. and drag her into the men's restroom. A.A. states that K.L. was resisting the man, later identified as Defendant, pulling her into the men's restroom by dragging her feet and grabbing at the door. He stated that the man was African American and that he had a stocky build and a bald or shaved head. A.A. also noted the man was wearing a distinctive blue shirt that was untucked. A.A. stated that he heard K.L.'s friend yell into the men's restroom and that K.L. came out of the men's restroom shortly thereafter. A.A. stated that K.L. looked terrified as she came out. A.A. asked her if she was all right and she said no.

T.M. is a known adult female who was with K.L. at the time of the incident described above. T.M. states that the Defendant dragged K.L. into the men's restroom against her will. She states that after a short time, T.M. pushed open the door to the men's restroom and called K.L.'s name, shortly after which K.L. emerged from the men's restroom. T.M. states that when she looked into the restroom, the Defendant appeared to be pushing K.L. around in the men's restroom near the toilet stalls.

D.H., a known adult male in Defendant's party, was interviewed and states that he saw Defendant go into the men's restroom with K.L., but that he did not notice anything strange about their behavior. D.H. also stated that he was not in the bathroom when Defendant and K.L. were inside.

K.L. states that when she returned to her group after being dragged into the men's restroom, others suggested she report the man to restaurant management. K.L. and others then looked for the man who had done this. When K.L. saw Defendant, she recognized him as the man who had dragged her into the restroom and touched her breast. K.L. pointed out Defendant to a Redstone employee and told the employee what Defendant had done. The employee told K.L. that the man was Kirby Puckett and she would have to call police if she wanted someone to deal with the situation. K.L. then called 911 and described the incident, remaining on the phone with the 911 operator as Defendant left the scene.

Defendant is not currently in custody.

The victim, Tonya Puckett, stated that on 12-15-2001 at approximately 1900 hours, her husband Kirby Puckett threatened her and caused her fear, anger, alarm and disturbed her at West Trail, Edina, Hennepin, MN.

I spoke with Tonya Puckett by telephone at the Edina Police Department. She told me she and her husband Kirby Puckett had been arguing throughout the recent months regarding alleged infidelity on the behalf of Kirby Puckett.

Tonya Puckett told me that Kirby Puckett had gone to Atlantic City, New Jersey on 12-15-01. Tonya Puckett told me that she and Kirby Puckett were talking on the telephone on 12-15-2001 @ 1900 hours (she was in the home at West Trail) when the issue turned to his infidelity. Tonya Puckett told me Kirby Puckett screamed at her, over the telephone, that he was going to kill her. Tonya Puckett was fearful, upset and angry by the threat. Tonya Puckett told me she realized Kirby Puckett was in Atlantic City and could not immediately carry out the threats. However, she was scared by his threat due to what she described as a history or domestic assault and violence. Tonya Puckett told me that 9 years ago, in their home in Brooklyn Park, Minnesota, Kirby Puckett had assaulted her and placed her in fear of death and immediate bodily harm several times including when he choked her with a clock electrical cord, when he placed a pistol in her face as she held their then 2 year old daughter and cocked the hammer of the pistol and locked her in the

basement after an argument. She told me once, to get to her and assault her, Kirby Puckett used a power saw to cut through a door in their home.

She qualified that none of the violence had occurred recently. She told me the only act of threats was the recent 12-15-2001 death threat.

It appeared the recent threat could not be carried out. It appeared to me the threat was a product of transient anger spawned from the argument at hand. Although he had threatened to commit a crime of violence obviously with intent to terrorize her, I found he was incapable of immediately carrying out the threats and was not in her presence. I do believe the conduct was disorderly enough, given the history of events as alleged by Tonya Puckett, to warrant a request that the City Attorney inspect this report for consideration of charges v. Kirby Puckett.

Tonya Puckett will seek and order for protection and is arranging for divorce. I advised her of her rights as a victim of domestic assault.

On December 21, 2001, at 1932 hours, I contacted Tonya Puckett via phone. I told her that I would be contacting her husband Kirby about the incidents that she had spoken with Det. Kleinberg about. I also gave her the phone number to Cornerstone.

At approximately 1940 hours, I contacted Kirby Puckett on his cell phone. [REDACTED] I informed Mr. Puckett of why I was calling him. Mr. Puckett told me that he and his wife have been having some problems. I asked him if he had ever threatened his wife. He told me that he had not. I asked him if he threatened his wife during a phone conversation he had with her on December 15, 2001, when he was in Atlantic City NJ. He denied threatening his wife during the call. He said that his wife told him that he would never be able to see his kids again. He explained to me that this upset him because he wants to see his kids and that wasn't fair. He further stated that an argument ensued and they were arguing back and forth. I asked him if he owned any firearms and he said he did. I asked him if he ever threatened his wife with a gun 9 or 10 years ago. Mr. Puckett said, "not that I recall." He told me that he maybe picking his kids up sometime this weekend for the holiday. His attorney and his wife's attorney are in contact with each other to make arrangements. He told me that he would not bother his wife. I told him that if needed Edina Officers would stand by when he picked up the kids to make sure that nothing happened. Mr. Puckett said he was not in Edina, he was going to the lake place in [REDACTED] I told Mr. Puckett to contact Edina PD if he had any further questions.

I contacted Mrs. Puckett and told her about me conversation with her husband. I also told her that Edina Officers could come out to stand by if she desired. She said she would call if she thought that was necessary.
