THE TWINS: In 2019, the Twins will open with a three-game, four-day series vs. Cleveland from today through Sunday...today marks the fourth time in Twins history (since 1961) that they have opened against Cleveland (1963, 1964 and 2004)...following this series, the Twins will travel to Kansas City for two April 2-3, an off-day in Philadelphia on the 4th, then three against the Phillies next weekend, an off-day in New York on April 8, then two against the Met April 9-10...the five days off in the first 12 days is the most in baseball.

SPRING WRAP: The Twins finished spring training with a record of 14-14-3...Tyler Austin led the club in hits (17) while C.J. Croon led in runs (14), Byron Buxton led the club in RBI (15), Buxton, Eddie Rosario and Adam Rosales tied in homers (4)...José Berríos and Michael Pined led the club in innings (20.1), with Pineda leading in strikeouts (20).. .additionally, the Twins drew 121,798 in attendance, surpassing the 100,000 mark for the 18th consecutive year.
$\Phi$ The Twins finished fourth in baseball in home runs (48), fifth in total bases (521), and had the third fewest strikeouts (227), only Oakland and Seattle had fewer (also fewer spring games).

DO YOU SMELL WHAT THE ROC' IS COOKIN'?: Rocco Baldelli became the 14th manager of the Twins on October 25 after spending parts of six years with the Tampa Bay Rays as a player and splitting eight seasons between their front office and coaching staff, most recently as their Major League Field Coordinator....he is the first managerial hire for the Twins outside the organization since Ray Miller in 1985, who was a coach with the Orioles prior...at 37 years, six months and three days, Baldelli is the youngest manager in baseball...he is roughly 15 months younger than Nelson Cruz.
$\mp$ The Twins added five new coaches over the off-season: Third Base Coach Tony Diaz enters his 20th season at some capacity at the professional level, spending the last two seasons as Colorado's bench coach...Major League Coach Bill Ever begins his 44th season at the professional level, spending the last nine as Tampa Bay's minor league field coordinator...former Mes pitcher Jeremy Hefner begins his first season as a professional coach, filling the Assistant Pitching position...Pitching Coach Wee Johnson joins from the University of Arkansas and becomes the first ever major league pitching coach to jump straight from the collegiate ranks...former Twins third baseman and First Base Coach Tommy Watkins begins his first at the major league level after coaching and managing in the Twins minor league system since 2010.
GRAND OPENING: The Twins opened last season at Baltimore on March 29, losing by a score of 3-2, getting walked off on an Adam Jones 11th inning home run....Minnesota is 25-33 all-time in season openers and 32-26 in Home Openers...this marks the third time the Twins have opened at Target Field, also 2013 vs. Detroit and 2017 vs. Kansas City, losing to the Tigers and beating the Royals.
TWINS AND TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the first of 19 scheduled meetings this season...last season, they went 9-10 against the Tribe, going 4-3 at Target Field, 1-1 in Puerto Rico (both Twins home games) and 4-6 at Progressive Field....verall, the Twins are just 2-7 in their last nine against Cleveland.
$\Phi$ Eddie Rosario is hitting . 344 ( 87 -for-253) with 13 doubles, three triples, 15 home runs, 35 RBI and 41 runs scored in 67 career games vs. Cleveland; the homers, hits and RBI all being his personal most vs. any opponent...his 87 hits vs. CLE since 2015 lead baseball.

A LOOK AT THE ROSTER: The Twins open the 2019 season with 14 players on their 25 -man roster who were not on the 2018 Opening Day roster: pitchers (6) - Ryne Harper, Trevor May, Adalberto Mejía, Blake Parker, Martin Pérez and Michael Pineda; catcher (1) - Willians As-
tudillo; infielders (5) - Tyler Austin, C.J. Croon, Marvin Gonzalez, Jorge Polanco and Jonathan tudillo; infielders (5) - Tyler Austin, C.J. Croon, Marvin Gonzalez, Jorge Polanco and Jonathan Schoop; outfielder (1): Jake Cave; designated hitter (1): Nelson Cruz....of the 25 players on the Twins active roster, nine began their professional careers in the Twins organization... Rune Harper is the only player looking to make his major league debut...the oldest on the club is Nelson Cruz ( 38 years, 8 months, 27 days) and the youngest is Jose Berríos (24 years,

## 10 months, 1 day).

OPENING DAY SOLD OUT: Twins announced yesterday that today's opener vs. the Indians at Target Field, is a sellout...since the opening of Target Field in 2010, the Twins have drawn 351,982 fans on nine home opener dates for an average crowd of $39,109 . .$. today's opener, which is the earliest ever for Minnesota, is the 162 nd sellout in Target Field history.

THERE'S A FIRST FOR EVERYTHING: José Berríos (24) will make his first career Opening Day start March 28 vs. the Cleveland Indians...becomes the second youngest Opening Day starter for the Twins...Brad Radke (23), who made the start in 1996 home opener, is club's youngest Opening Day starter...Berríos was named the team's Opening Day starter on March 4.

SPRING RECAP: Berríos made six appearances (6 starts) in spring training, going 3-0, 4.43 ERA (21.1 IP, 10 ER) with eight walks and 17 strikeouts...tied for the club lead for innings, matching Pineda.

## 2018 RECAP:

- Made first career Opening Day roster and was club's number two starter.
- 2018 American League All-Star led Twins in wins (12), complete games (2) and strikeouts (202), tied for first in starts (32) and second in innings pitched (192.1).
- Finished with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Finished tied for first in the AL in complete games, tied for sixth in starts, eighth in innings pitched, 11th in strikeouts, 13th in opponent batting average (.222), and tied for 15 th in wins

$E R)$ in 14 day starts.
- Recorded double-digit strikeouts four times on season: 11 on April 12 vs. Chicago-AL, 10 on May 15 vs. St. Louis, 10 on June 7 vs. Chicago-AL and career-high of 12 on June 24 vs. Texas.

AGAINST THE INDIANS: Berríos is making his eighth career start against the Indians...is 3-2, 4.82 ERA (37.1 IP, 20 ER ) with 14 walks and 32 strikeouts in his career...last start against Cleveland was August 9, 2018...received a no-decision after allowing four runs on four hits and a career-high six walks with five strikeouts over 4.0 innings...in 2018, was 1-0, 4.24 ERA (17.0 IP, 8 ER ) with seven walks and 17 strikeouts...last win against Cleveland was June 1, 2018, allowed four runs on five hits with seven strikeouts over 6.0 innings.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Over his 31 starts against AL Central opponents, Berríos holds a 15-6 record, 2.30 ERA (177.2 IP, 82 ER ) while posting a 168-64 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

COUNT ON ME: In his first start of 2018 season, Berríos earned the win tossing his first career complete game shutout...he holds a 2-1 career record and owns a 2.61 ERA in his first start of each season.

JOSÉ AT HOME: José struck out a total of 118 batters and allowed only six home runs at Target Field in 2018...he went 9-4, 3.03 ERA (107.0 IP, 36 ER) in 17 appearances ( 17 starts)...conversely, Berríos was 3-7, 4.85 ERA (85.1 IP, 46 ER) on the road...in 33 career starts at home, Berríos is 18-10, 3.64 ERA (198 IP, 80 ER) with 209 strikeouts...compared to 11-16, 5.31 ERA (198.1 IP, 117 ER) with 181 strikeouts on the road.

CAREER YEAR: After his last start on September 28, 2018 vs. Chicago-AL, Berríos set a career high for starts in a season with 32, his previous career high being 25 in 2017...the righty also set career highs in innings pitched (192.1) and strikeouts (202).
