THE TWINS: The Twins began their 59th campaign in Minnesota with a win over the Indians on Thursday afternoon...today the Twins will play the second of three with the Tribe...following tomorrow's series finale, the Twins will travel to Kansas City for two April 2-3, an off-day in Philadelphia on the 4th, then three against the Phillies next weekend, an off-day in New York on April 8, then two against the Mets April 9-10...the five days off in the first 12 days is the most in baseball.

THAT'S HOW YOU WRITE IT UP: The Twins opened their season with a 2-0 victory over the Indians on Thursday afternoon....José Berríos (1-0) was the starter and winner, pitching 7.2 shutout innings with 10 strikeouts, two hits allowed and one walk.... Taylor Rogers earned his third career save, getting the final four outs...the offense recorded four hits as Byron Buxton broke-up Corey Kluber's no-hitter with a sixth inning double...the Twins scored both runs on singles from Nelson Cruz and C.J. Cron, followed by a Marwin Gonzalez bases clearing double...the Twins drew 39,519 fans, their 162nd sellout in Target Field's history.
© The 2:18 time of game was the eighth fastest in Twins history, and quickest since 2003, playing that opener vs. the Tigers in 2:10...the fastest Twins opener ever came in 1966, playing the Kansas City Athletics in 1:45.

YES WAY, JOSÉ!: The 10 strikeouts from José Berríos on Thursday set a club record for strikeouts from an Opening Day starter:

TWINS AND TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the second of 19 scheduled meetings this season...last season, they went 9-10 against the Tribe, going 4-3 at Target Field, 1-1 in Puerto Rico (both Twins home games) and 4-6 at Progressive Field...overall, the Twins are just 3-7 in their last 10 against Cleveland.
$\Phi$ Eddie Rosario is hitting .339 ( 87 -for-257) with 13 doubles, three triples, 15 home runs 35 RBI and 41 runs scored in 68 career games vs. Cleveland; the homers, hits and RBI all being his personal most vs. any opponent...his 87 hits vs. CLE since 2015 lead baseball. $\Phi$ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .324 (12-for-37) with three doubles, three home runs and nine RBI in his last 13 games vs. Cleveland.
$\Phi$ Derek Shelton was Cleveland's minor league hitting coordinator from 2003-05 and Cleveland's hitting coach from 2005-09.

ROGER THAT: Thursday afternoon Taylor Rogers extended his scoreless inning streak to 27.1, passing Juan Berenguer and moving into fourth on the Twins all-time scoreless inning streak list...additionally it's the longest active streak in baseball...below are the all-time streaks in club history (since 1961):

CRUZIN' MINNESOTA: Nelson Cruz is hitting . 322 (39-for-121) with 10 doubles, 10 home runs, 25 RBI and a 1.004 OPS in 31 career games at Target Field...in his last 12 in Minnesota, he is hitting .408 (20-for-49) with five doubles, seven home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.383 OPS... according to Statcast, Cruz has the longest home run in Target Field history, hitting a 493foot homer off Tyler Duffey on September 24, 2016
A LOOK AT THE ROSTER: The Twins open the 2019 season with 14 players on their 25 -man roster who were not on the 2018 Opening Day roster: pitchers (6) - Ryne Harper, Trevor May, Adalberto Mejía, Blake Parker, Martín Pérez and Michael Pineda; catcher (1) - Willians Astudillo; infielders (5) - Tyler Austin, C.J. Cron, Marwin Gonzalez, Jorge Polanco and Jonathan Schoop; outfielder (1): Jake Cave; designated hitter (1): Nelson Cruz...of the 25 players on the Twins active roster, nine began their professional careers in the Twins organization. Ryne Harper is the only player looking to make his major league debut...the oldest on the club is Nelson Cruz (38 years, 8 months, 27 days) and the youngest is José Berríos ( 24 years, 10 months, 1 day).

SPRING WRAP: The Twins finished spring training with a record of 14-14-3...Tyler Austin led the club in hits (17) while C.J. Cron led in runs (14), Byron Buxton led the club in RBI (15), Buxton, Eddie Rosario and Adam Rosales tied in homers (4)...José Berríos and Michael Pineda led the club in innings (20.1), with Pineda leading in strikeouts (20)...additionally, the Twins drew 121,798 in attendance, surpassing the 100,000 mark for the 18th consecutive year.
$\Phi$ The Twins finished fourth in baseball in home runs (48), fifth in total bases (521), and had the third fewest strikeouts (227), only Oakland and Seattle had fewer (also fewer spring games).

NEW BLUES: The Twins are debuting their new Navy uniforms today...they are replacing the throwback pinstripes that the Twins wore from 1961-71 and brought back from 2010-18 as a home alternate.

SPRING RECAP: Odorizzi made two Spring Training starts, going 1-1, 13.50 ERA (3.1 IP, 5 ER) with three walks and four strikeouts.

## 2018 RECAP:

- Twins 2018 Opening Day starter finished with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Made 30 starts for the third time in career.
- Ranked tied for first on Twins staff in starts (32), and third in innings pitched (164.1) and strikeouts (162).
- Finished with a strikeout-per-9.0 innings pitched ratio of 8.87 , the second highest of career (9.32-2014).
- Recorded 800th career strikeout September 18 at Detroit.
- Made first career Opening Day start March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts.
Set a season-high with 10 strikeouts May 20 vs. Milwaukee, fourth double-digit strikeout total of career.

AGAINST THE INDIANS: Odorizzi is making his 10th career start, and first of the season, against Cleveland...is 1-4, 5.79 ERA (42.0 IP, 27 ER) with 19 walks and 38 strikeouts in previous nine starts...both 2018 starts against the Indians came at Target Field, going 0-1, 11.42 ERA (8.2 IP, 11 ER).

STAYING IN STRIDE: Odorizzi ended the 2018 season on a two-game winning streak, going 2-0, 3.78 ERA (16.2 IP, 7 ER) over his final three starts...took a no-hitter into the eighth inning of a 3-1 win on September 12 vs. the New York Yankees, and worked 6.1 frames in a 5-3 victory at Detroit on September 26.

HAVE A DAY: Odorizzi shined under the sun in 2018, leading Twins starters with a 3.30 ERA ( 62.2 IP, 23 ER ) in 12 day game starts...limited opponents to .206 batting average in day games, 12th-best by an American League starter.

ON TARGET, ON THE MOUND AND WITH THE BATS: In his first season in a Twins uniform, Odorizzi went 5-4, 4.69 ERA ( 80.2 IP, 42 ER) in 16 home starts, with 30 walks and 81 strikeouts...Twins went 10-6 in his 16 starts at Target Field last year, supporting 0do with an average 5.24 runs per game at home ( 47 total).

- By contrast, Odorizzi was tied for the least-supported American League starter on the road (minimum 15 starts), as the Twins scored just 33 runs in his 16 starts...he finished 2-6, 4.30 ERA (83.2 IP, 40 ER) away from home in 2018.

QUALITY NOT QUANTITY: Over his 32 starts in 2018, Odorizzi averaged just over 5.1 innings/ start...of starters with at least 30 starts, his 164.1 innings ranked as the fewest in the American League...his 18.7 pitches/inning and 4.33 pitches/batter faced both ranked as the highest in baseball...though his starts were on the short side, his 82 earned runs allowed ranked tied-13th fewest in the American League among those with 30+ starts.

- His start on August 24, 2018 snapped his MLB record stretch of 26 games started without recording an out in the 7th inning.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 152 starts since 2014...he is also seventh in that span with a .236 opponents batting average.

Only Corey Kluber (161), Rick Porcello (158) and Justin Verlander (154) have made more
starts than Odorizzi over the last $5+$ seasons

Pineda makes his Twins debut with the start in tomorrow afternoon's series finale...marks his first Major League appearance since July, 5, 2007, a 3.0-inning start (and no-decision) for the New York Yankees in a 7-6 loss at Toronto...underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow July 18, 2017 in Cincinnati (performed by Dr. Timothy Kremchek)...signed with the Twins on December 13, 2017 and spent entire 2018 season on disabled list...made rehab appearances last August for the GCL Twins, Single-A Ft.
