THE TWINS: The Twins began their 59th campaign in Minnesota with a win and a loss to the Indians...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale against the Tribe...following today's game, the Twins will travel to Kansas City for two April 2-3, an off-day in Philadelphia on the 4th, then three against the Phillies next weekend, an off-day in New York on April 8, then two against the Mets April 9-10...the five days off in the first 12 days is the most in baseball.

BATS GO COLD ON CHILLY DAY: The Twins lost to the Indians yesterday afternoon by a score of 2-1...Jake Odorizzi was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing one run on one hit in 6.0 innings, while tying his career-high of 11 strikeouts...Blake Parker made his Twins debut and was issued the loss, allowing a run in the ninth inning...the offense recorded just two hits and struck out 10 times.

☞ Jake Odorizzi and José Berríos became the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 – since the mound was placed at its current distance from home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals; the only others to ever do it were Randy Johnson and Curt Schilling for the Diamondbacks in 2001.

BIG MIKE: Today's starter Michael Pineda was signed to a two-year contract with the Twins on December 13, 2017...he spent entire 2018 season on the disabled list...began rehab assignment in August, appearing in games for GCL Twins, Single-A Ft. Myers and Triple-A Rochester...was shut down due to right knee discomfort he suffered throwing a bullpen in late August...he was an AL All-Star with Seattle in 2011.

TWINS AND TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the third of 19 scheduled meetings this season...the Twins are just 3-8 in their last 11 against Cleveland...a win today would give the Twins their first series win over the Tribe since taking two of three June 15-17, 2018, going 0-3 in series play since.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .335 (87-for-260) with 13 doubles, three triples, 15 home runs, 35 RBI, 41 runs scored and a .949 OPS in 69 career games vs. Cleveland; the homers, hits and RBI all being his personal most vs. any opponent...his 87 hits vs. CLE since 2015 lead baseball...he is 0-for-his-last-7 against CLE pitching...three of his nine career four-plus-hit games have come against the Indians.

☞ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .300 (12-for-40) with three doubles, three home runs and nine RBI in his last 14 games vs. Cleveland.

☞ Lifetime vs. Carlos Carrasco: Jorge Polanco is hitting .400 (6-for-15)...Eddie Rosario is hitting .333 (8-for-24) with four walks...Nelson Cruz is hitting .318 (7-for-22) with two home runs...Jason Castro is hitting .300 (6-for-20).

ROGER THAT: Yesterday Taylor Rogers extended his scoreless inning streak to 28.1, moving within one out of tying Johnny Klippstein for fourth on the Twins all-time scoreless innings streak list...additionally it's the longest active streak in baseball...below are the all-time streaks in club history (since 1961):

CRUZIN' MINNESOTA: Nelson Cruz is hitting .317 (39-for-123) with 10 doubles, 10 home runs, 26 RBI and a .998 OPS in 32 career games at Target Field...in his last 13 in Minnesota, he is hitting .392 (20-for-51) with five doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI and a 1.350 OPS...according to Statcast, Cruz has the longest home run in Target Field history, hitting a 493-foot homer off Tyler Duffey on September 24, 2016.

THE GAME IS GLOBAL: A total of 251 players represented 20 different countries and territories outside of the 50 United States on 2019 Opening Day 25-man rosters and inactive lists. Major League Baseball announced recently...the Twins and Pittsburgh have the most internationally-born players with a total of 14 on each roster...foreign-born players represented by the Twins as follows: Dominican Republic (5): Nelson Cruz, Adalberto Mejía, Michael Pineda, Jorge Polanco and Miguel Sanó; Venezuela (5): Ehire Adrianza, Williams Astudillo, Marwin Gonzalez, Gabriel Moya and Martín Pérez; Puerto Rico (2): José Berríos and Eddie Rosario, Netherlands (1): Jonathan Schoop; Germany (1): Max Kepler.

A LOOK AT THE ROSTER: The Twins open the 2019 season with 14 players on their 25-man roster who were not on the 2018 Opening Day roster: pitchers (6) - Ryne Harper, Trevor May, Adalberto Mejía, Blake Parker, Martín Pérez and Michael Pineda; catcher (1) - Williams Astudillo; infielders (5) - Tyler Austin, C.J. Cron, Marwin Gonzalez, Jorge Polanco and Jonathan Schoop; outfielder (1): Jake Cave; designated hitter (1): Nelson Cruz...of the 25 players on the Twins active roster, nine began their professional careers in the Twins organization...Ryne Harper is the only player looking to make his major league debut...the oldest on the club is Nelson Cruz (38 years, 8 months, 27 days) and the youngest is José Berríos (24 years, 10 months, 1 day).

TEAM BULLPEN NOTES

- In a franchise-high 610.1 innings, the Twins bullpen yielded 619 hits in 2018, the most in Twins history...also set franchise worsts in earned runs (301), home runs (89) and extra-base hits (215).
- The 2018, the 'pen went 5-4, 3.31 ERA (73.1 IP, 27 ER) w/ 18 BB and 65 K's against the Indians...suffered their first loss yesterday, allowing the winning run in the ninth.
- The 'pen owned a 2.78 strikeout-to-walk ratio, the eighth best mark in baseball in 2018, and the second best total by a relief core in Twins history, (2006, 3.28).
- Twins bullpen arms threw 10,365 pitches in 2018 (an average of 64.8/game), breaking the franchise record set in 2016 by 681 pitches...also tied 1982's 'pen for the most stolen bases against (53).

- Harper was an invite to Twins spring training...is making his first Opening Day roster after having his contract selected 3/27, following Spring Training in which he allowed two runs (zero earned) over 11.0 innings pitched...struck out 14 batters and did not issue a walk.
- Only Twin looking to make major league debut...has three days of major league service time, on Mariners roster in 2017 but did not appear.
- Began 2018 with AA Chattanooga; split first month w/ the Lookouts and Triple-A Rochester, making 4 appearances at each spot during the month.
- Posted a 2.34 ERA (34.2 IP, 9 ER) with 4 saves in 20 games from early May-late July at Chattanooga before being promoted back to Rochester where he finished the season...named Southern League Midseason All-Star with Lookouts.
- Combined to go 1-5, (65.0 IP, 26 ER) with 10 BB, 86 K's and 6 saves in 38 games between Chattanooga and Rochester.

- Began 2018 on 10-day disabled recovering from right elbow surgery; reinstated April 5...moved to the bullpen to finish the season after making 13 starts for the Rangers April 5-August 25, going 2-6, 6.95 ERA (68.2 IP, 53 ER).
- Held left-handed hitters to a .271 batting average last season and right-handers to a .347 average.
- Pérez ranks seventh among AL lefties in innings pitched since 2016 (469.0).

- Extended his scoreless inning streak to 28.1 innings dating back to July 30, 2018, moving within one out of tying Johnny Klippstein (1965-66) for fourth on the Twins all-time scoreless inning streak list...also trails J.C. Romero (36.0 in 2004) and Joe Nathan (29.0 in 2004).
- Has posted a 1.17 ERA (30.2 IP, 4 ER) against Cleveland in his career, including 3 ER in 13.0 IP last year...set a career high with 4 K's against Cleveland on August 30, 2016...30.2 IP are his personal most vs. any opponent, as are his 31 strikeouts.
- Held lefties to a .180 BAA w/ .428 OPS last season and righties to a .225 BAA w/ .643 OPS.
- Ranked 19th in the majors in day game ERA (min. 30 IP) allowing just 10 ER in 31.0 IP (2.90 ERA) in 2018...also ranked first on the Twins.
