THE TWINS: The Twins began their 59th campaign in Minnesota with a win and a loss to the Indians...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale against the Tribe...following today's game, the Twins will travel to Kansas City for two April 2-3, an off-day in Philadelphia on the 4th, then three against the Phillies next weekend, an off-day in New York on April 8, then two against the Mets April 9-10...the five days off in the first 12 days is the most in baseball.

BATS GO COLD ON CHILLY DAY: The Twins lost to the Indians yesterday afternoon by a score of 2-1...Jake Odorizzi was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing one run on one hit in 6.0 innings, while tying his career-high of 11 strikeouts...Blake Parker made his Twins debut and was issued the loss, allowing a run in the ninth inning...the offense recorded just two hits and struck out 10 times.

Jake Odorizzi and José Berríos became the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - since the mound was placed at its current distance from home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals; the only others
to ever do it were Randy Johnson and Curt Schilling for the Diamondbacks in 2001.
BIG MIKE: Today's starter Michael Pineda was signed to a two-year contract with the Twins on December 13, 2017.... he spent entire 2018 season on the disabled list...began rehab assignment in August, appearing in games for GCL Twins, Single-A Ft. Myers and Triple-A Rochester...was shut down due to right knee discomfort he suffered throwing a bullpen in late August...he was an AL All-Star with Seattle in 2011.

TWINS AND TRIBE: The Twins are playing the Indians for the third of 19 scheduled meetings this season...the Twins are just 3-8 in their last 11 against Cleveland...a win today would give the Twins their first series win over the Tribe since taking two of three June 15-17, 2018, going $0-3$ in series play since.
ฐ Eddie Rosario is hitting . 335 ( 87 -for-260) with 13 doubles, three triples, 15 home runs, 35 RBI, 41 runs scored and a 949 OPS in 69 career games vs. Cleveland; the homers, hits and RBI all being his personal most vs. any opponent....his 87 hits vs. CLE since 2015 lead baseball....he is 0 -for-his-last-7 against CLE pitching...three of his nine career four-plus-hit games have come against the Indians.
क Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .300 ( 12 -for-40) with three doubles, three home runs and nine RBI in his last 14 games vs. Cleveland.
$\Phi$ Lifetime vs. Carlos Carrasco: Jorge Polanco is hitting . 400 ( 6 -for-15)...Eddie Rosario is hitting . 333 (8-for-24) with four walks...Nelson Cruz is hitting . 318 (7-for-22) with two home runs...Jason Castro is hitting . 300 ( 6 -for-20).

ROGER THAT: Yesterday Taylor Rogers extended his scoreless inning streak to 28.1, moving within one out of tying Johnny Klippstein for fourth on the Twins all-time scoreless innings streak list...additionally it's the longest active streak in baseball...below are the all-time streaks in club history (since 1961):

A LOOK AT THE ROSTER: The Twins open the 2019 season with 14 players on their 25 -man roster who were not on the 2018 Opening Day roster: pitchers (6) - Ryne Harper, Trevor May, Adalberto Mejía, Blake Parker, Martín Pérez and Michael Pineda; catcher (1) - Willians Astudillo; infielders (5) - Tyler Austin, C.J. Cron, Marwin Gonzalez, Jorge Polanco and Jonathan Schoop; outfielder (1): Jake Cave; designated hitter (1): Nelson Cruz...of the 25 players on the Twins active roster, nine began their professional careers in the Twins organization.. Ryne Harper is the only player looking to make his major league debut...the oldest on the club is Nelson Cruz (38 years, 8 months, 27 days) and the youngest is José Berríos (24 years, 10 months, 1 day).

SPRING RECAP: Pineda completed his eighth spring training in 2019, the second with the Twins, after spending 2010-11 with Seattle, 2012-17 with New York-AL...he was in spring training with the Twins in 2018 but did not appear as he recovered from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow...tied for the team lead with 20.1 innings pitched, allowing nine runs (eight earned) while striking out a club-high 20 batters...finished the spring on a high note, striking out seven over 5.0 innings on March 26 against Colorado.

## 2017 RECAP:

- Made fifth career Opening Day roster (four with New York-AL: 2014-17 and one with Seattle: 2011).
- Started in Yankees Home Opener April 10 vs. Tampa Bay, retired the game's first 20 batters before his perfect game was spoiled by an Evan Longoria two-out double in the seventh....Was first major league pitcher to take a perfect game into the seventh inning of his team's home opener since Houston's J.R. Richard (perfect through 6.1 IP) April 10, 1980 vs. Los Angeles-NL, (Elias).
- Placed on 10-day injured list July 14 with a right UCL injury...transferred to 60-day injured list July 16, missing the remainder of the season...underwent "Tommy John" surgery July 18 .
- Spent entire 2018 season on injured list while he recovered from the surgery.
- Began a rehab assignment in August, but was shut down due to right knee discomfort he suffered throwing a bullpen later in the month

AGAINST CLEVELAND: Pineda is making his second start against Cleveland, having won his lone appearance against the Tribe on August 5, 2016, after allowing four runs in 6.0 innings pitched with six strikeouts as a member of the New York Yankees.

SO FAR, SO GOOD: In the first two games of the series, José Berríos and Jake Odorizzi each eclipsed the 10 strikeout mark, becoming the second pair of starters to begin the season with 10+ strikeout performances (Johnson \& Schilling, 2001 ARZ)...would be first trio in ML history to turn the trick, if he can reach the threshold.

AGAINST AL CENTRAL: The right-hander enters today's start with a record of 9-11 in 24 starts against American League Central opponents, holding opposing batters to a . 243 average while surrendering just 14 home runs in 145.1 innings pitched.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: Pineda is towing the slab today for the first time as a Twin after signing with the club December 13, 2017. This will be his first appearance in the majors since July 5, 2017, a total of 633 days.

MARCH/APRIL FLOWERS: "Big Mike" owns a 13-7 record and a 3.46 ERA (138.0 IP, 53 ER ) in the months of March and April, his second lowest of any month (September, 3.24), and his 144 strikeouts are the most of any month. In 2017, Pineda finished April 3-1 with a 3.14 ERA (28.2 IP, 10 ER), including a season-high 10 strikeout appearance on April 10 vs. Tampa Bay.

## CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched. - Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August. - Enters 2019 with 680.0 IP and 687 strikeouts... is one of 13 pitchers in major league history to have at least 687 strikeouts in 680.0 innings pitched or less, and is one of only three pitchers in that group to be primarily a starter (Mark Prior: 2002-06 and Robbie Ray: 2014-present). - Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA ( 113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of 198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16 -year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.

Gibson is making his first start of the year, and the 160th of his career, after making 32 starts last season, eclipsing the 30-start threshold for the third time in five years... finished 2018 with a 10-13 record, 3.62 ERA ( $196.2 \mathrm{IP}, 79 \mathrm{ER}$ ), setting career bests in innings pitched, strikeouts ( 179 ), ERA, quality starts (18) and strikeouts-per-9.0 IP (8.19)...joined José Berríos and Jake Odorizzi with 32 starts, marking the first time since 2007 that the Twins had a trio of starters reach 30 starts in the same season (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33 and Boof Bonser - 30)...was limited to three starts (7.2 IP, 5 ER) this Spring Training as he recovered from a bout with E. Coli.

Harper was an invite to Twins spring training...is making his first Opening Day roster after having his contract selected 3/27, following Spring Training in which he allowed two runs (zero earned) over 11.0 innings pitched...struck out 14 batters and did not issue a walk.
Only Twin looking to make major league debut...has three days of major league service time, on Mariners roster in 2017 but did not appear. Began 2018 with AA Chattanooga; split first month w/ the Lookouts and Triple-A Rochester, making 4 appearances at each spot during the month. Posted a 2.34 ERA (34.2 IP, 9 ER) with 4 saves in 20 games from early May-late July at Chattanooga before being promoted back to Rochester where he finished the season...named Southern League Midseason All-Star with Lookouts.
