THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-2 through six games on their seven-game roadtrip, going 2-0 in Kansas City, 1-2 in Philadelphia and 1-0 in New York over the Mets last night...tonight they will wrap the series and trip with the second of two against the Mets...they will travel home after the game to enjoy an off-day Thursday, followed by three against the Tigers over the weekend and four against the Blue Jays from Monday-next Thursday.

TWINS GO CRAZY IN THE CITI: The beat the Mets last night by a score of 14-8, setting season-highs in runs and hits (17)...Kyle Gibson was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on six hits in 4.2 innings pitched...the Twins set a season-high, using seven pitchers...the offense was led by Jorge Polanco, who had three hits, falling a double short of the cycle, also Mitch Garver, who had four hits, recording his first career two-homer game - both off Jacob deGrom...Jonathan Schoop also hit two homers.

☞ Garver became just the third player to homer twice in a game off deGrom, joining Giancarlo Stanton (2016) and Mark Teixeira (2015).
☞ The Twins cracked six home runs last night, three coming off of reigning Cy Young Award winner Jacob deGrom...the Twins have notched six-or-more home runs in a game 15 times since 1961, including last night, with last night being the first time in franchise history that they did so in a game started by a former/reigning Cy Young Award winner...on June 9, 1966, the Twins recorded six home runs in a game against the Kansas City Athletics started by Catfish Hunter, who would go on to win the Cy Young in 1974 and be inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1987.

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have recalled left-handed pitcher Andrew Vasquez from Triple-A Rochester...Vasquez, 25, made one appearance for the Red Wings this season, pitching 1.1 scoreless innings on Sunday...the left-handed reliever made nine appearances for the Twins in 2018...to make room on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Chase De Jong to Triple-A Rochester...after having his contract selected on Saturday, De Jong made just one appearance for the Twins.

HOT WHEELS: Byron Buxton stole his 32nd consecutive base last night extending the club record...Buxton is now 38-for-his-last-39 (97%)...below are the longest successful stolen base streaks in Twins history:

NOTE: The all-time American League record is held by Ichiro Suzuki (45) from April 29, 2006-May 16, 2007...the all-time National League/MLB record is held by Vince Coleman (50) from September 18, 1988-July 26, 1989.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins have gone 20-14 in Interleague Play, dating back to August 2, 2017...they are 213-193 all-time in IL play, the sixth most wins in IL history, trailing Boston (244), New York-AL (237), Los Angeles-AL (226), Texas (218) and Oakland (217).

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .336 (40-for-119) with 11 doubles, seven home runs and 18 RBI in his last 29 games vs. NL opponents...he has hit safely in 19 of his last 21 IL games.
☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .374 (43-for-115) in 34 career games against NL teams, with a .457 (32-for-70) AVG and 17 RBI in the last 18.
☞ Nelson Cruz has the fourth most IL home runs among players currently on a 25-man roster with 45, trailing Albert Pujols (63), Miguel Cabrera (54) and Edwin Encarnación (51).
☞ Twins are seeking their first sweep of an NL opponent since taking both games of a two-game series with Pittsburgh August 14-15 at Target Field...they also recorded another sweep of an NL opponent last season, taking a two-game series with St. Louis at Busch Stadium May 7-8.

TWINS AND THE METS: The Twins snapped their seven game losing streak to the Mets last night, winning for the first time since June 26, 2010 at Citi Field...they are 8-11 all-time against New York-NL, going 3-3 at Shea Stadium, 3-0 at the Metrodome, 2-5 at Citi Field, 0-3 at Target Field in 2013.

MINNESOTA WINS: The Twins have gone 17-6 in their last 23 games, dating back to September 16...since that date, they are 5-2-0 in series play...in that span, they rank second in baseball in batting average (.286), third in runs-per-game (6.04) and OBP (.355), and fifth in OPS (.822) and hits (230).

INSIDE THE TRIP: The Twins are 4-2 on their current trip...during the six games, they are hitting .293 (65-for-222) with 12 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 19 walks, a .887 OPS and 6.2 runs-per-game.
☞ Mitch Garver is hitting .583 (7-for-12) with a 1.167 OPS...Jorge Polanco is hitting .462 (12-for-26) with three doubles, two triples and two home runs...Willians Astudillo is hitting .353 (6-for-17)...Eddie Rosario is hitting .348 (8-for-23) with seven RBI...Max Kepler is hitting .310 (9-for-29) with three home runs and seven RBI.

THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1982, the Twins acquired reliever Ron Davis and minor leaguers Greg Gagne and Paul Boris from New York-AL, in exchange for infielder Roy Smalley and pitcher Gary Serum...Davis ranks fifth on Twins all-time saves list with 108 while Gagne was inducted into the Twins Hall of Fame in 2010.

HOF NEWS: The National Baseball Hall of Fame announced this afternoon that Bert Blyleven will return to play in the Cooperstown's Legends Game at Doubleday Field on May 25...Bert will be joined by Rollie Fingers, Goose Gossage, Tim Lincecum and Alan Trammell as the headliners of Hall of Fame Classic Weekend May 25-27...those five will be joined by recently retired players representing all 30 major league teams for the Hall of Fame Classic, a seven-inning legends game on Saturday, May 25 at Cooperstown's historic Doubleday Field.

LAST TIME OUT: Pitching on a wet, cold night last Friday in Philadelphia, Odorizzi couldn't get a feel of the baseball and the result was his shortest career outing, recording just two outs and suffering a 10-4 loss...in his 0.2-inning start, surrendered five runs (four earned) on two hits, with three walks and a strikeout.

POLAR OPPOSITE: Odorizzi's first start of 2019 was a gem, as he matched his career high with 11 strikeouts on May 30 vs. Cleveland...allowed just a single hit and run (a fourth-inning solo homer by Hanley Ramirez), while walking two...did not factor in the decision, departing with the score tied 1-1 (the Indians scored in the ninth for a 2-1 win)...the 11 Ks marked Odorizzi's fifth career double-digit strikeout effort and equalled his career-best output from 5/9/14 (also against Cleveland, with Tampa Bay).

SPECIAL K: With his 11-strikeout performance, Odorizzi teamed with José Berríos (10 Ks on Opening Day) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.

LEFT IS RIGHT: Odorizzi has held left-handed batters hitless in 18 at-bats this season, with two walks and 11 strikeouts...right-handed hitters are 3-for-5 (.333) with a home run, three walks and one strikeout.

AGAINST THE METS: Odorizzi is making just his second career start and appearance against New York, and his first at Citi Field...his lone previous start against the Mets came 8/7/15 at Tropicana Field as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays...worked the first 6.2 innings (4H-1R-1ER-1HR-1BB-6SO), departing with the game tied 1-1...New York scored twice in the ninth for a 4-3 win.

- Hitting .095 (2-for-21) in career at the plate, last hit coming 8/25/17 at STL off Wacha.

ROCKY ROAD: Following last Friday's loss in Philadelphia, Odorizzi is now 2-7 with a 4.70 ERA (84.1 IP, 44 ER) in 17 road starts with the Twins, while the club is just 5-12 (however, he has held opponents to a .229 batting average away from home)...in his 17 Target Field starts since 2018, Odo is 5-4, 4.47 ERA (86.2 IP, 43 ER) and the Twins are 10-7.

TURN OUT THE LIGHTS: In 21 night starts since joining the Twins in 2018, Odorizzi is 4-7 with a 5.47 ERA (102.1 IP, 63 ER) and a .264 opponents batting average.

- By contrast, Odorizzi has held opponents to a .194 batting average (48-for-247) in 13 day starts with the Twins, the fifth-best mark in baseball among pitchers with at least 10 day starts since 2018...he is 3-4, 3.15 ERA (68.2 IP, 24 ER) under the sun.

DON'T LEAVE ME HANGING: Odorizzi is tied for the American League lead with 16 no-decisions since Opening Day 2018 (in 34 starts), matching the White Sox' Reynaldo Lopez...only Robbie Ray (Arizona) and Patrick Corbin (Arizona and Washington) have more in baseball during that span, with 17 apiece.

FRIDAY'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP [SEASON: 1-0, 2.00 ERA ; CAREER: 41-41, 4.02 ERA]

Pineda makes his third start of the season in Friday night's series and homestand opener...in his last start 4/6 at Philadelphia, Pineda earned his first Twins win and first major league victory since 6/30/17 (at Houston, with the New York Yankees), a span of 644 days between wins...outdueled Jake Arrieta in the Twins' 6-2 victory, allowing two runs on four hits over 5.0 innings, with one walk and five strikeouts...has 10 strikeouts against two walks in 9.0 innings over his first two starts (both Twins wins), while allowing just two runs (both earned) and five hits...completed his comeback from 2017 "Tommy John" surgery with 4.0-shutout innings in his Twins debut March 31 vs. Cleveland, returning to a big league mound for the first time in 633 days (since 7/5/17 at Toronto, with the Yankees)...will make his fifth career start and appearance against Detroit, and his first since 6/12/16 (with the Yankees)...is 1-2, 3.91 ERA (23.0 IP, 10 ER) in his first four outings vs. the Tigers...enters his 120th ML start with a 41-41 career record, along with a 4.02 ERA (689.0 IP, 308 ER).

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win in his season debut on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
