THE TWINS: The Twins completed their seven-game roadtrip with a record of 4-3, going 2-0 in Kansas City, 1-2 in Philadelphia and 1-1 in New York (NL)...today they will begin a short-two game series with Detroit, followed by four against the Blue Jays from Monday-Thursday.

TWINS OUT OF ZONE IN NY: The Twins lost to the Mets on Wednesday night by a score of 9-6... Jake Odorizzi (0-2) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs on one hit in 4.2 innings pitched...the bullpen combined to allow six runs on four hits and six walks - all six runs coming in the fifth inning...Twins pitchers walked 10 batters, their most since September 10, 2018 vs. New York-AL (also 10)...the offense recorded nine hits, three from Jonathan Schoop and two from Mitch Garver, who hit his third home run of the two-game series.

⚡ The six-walk fifth inning set a club record for free passes in one inning...most in baseball since Houston did it September 9, 2017 at Oakland.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins went 12-7 against the Tigers last season, going 7-3 at Target Field and 5-4 at Comerica Park...the Twins have won six of their last seven over Detroit, dating back to August 19...last season they out-scored the Tigers 100-70 and out-hit them 163-138...12 wins last season tied with Chicago-AL for their most vs. any opponent.

⚡ C.J. Cron is hitting .325 (27-for-83) with four doubles, five home runs and 19 RBI in 21 career games vs. Detroit.

⚡ Nelson Cruz is hitting .361 (22-for-61) with five doubles, five home runs and 15 RBI in his last 16 vs. Detroit.

⚡ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .351 (26-for-74) with eight doubles and 11 RBI in his last 21 vs. Detroit.

⚡ Jorge Polanco is hitting .338 (26-for-77) in his last 19 vs. Detroit.

OLD FRIENDS: Four of the Tigers coaches/manager and three players on their current roster once were a members of the Twins organization:

⚡ Ron Gardenhire managed the Twins for 13 seasons from 2002-14, guiding the Twins to a record of 1068-1039, the second most in club history...on Wednesday, Gardy won his 1,140th career managerial game (over Cleveland), which ironically ties Tom Kelly's managerial win total for the Twins from 1986-2001.

⚡ Tigers pitching coach Rick Anderson was the Twins pitching coach from 2002-14...Tigers quality control coach Joe Vavra held several coaching positions with the Twins from 2006-17...Tigers bench coach Steve Liddle held several positions in the Twins organization (minor leagues and major leagues) from 1989-2012.

⚡ Niko Goodrum was originally selected by the Twins in the second round (71st overall) of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft...he made his major league debut in 2017 with Minnesota.

⚡ John Hicks played nine games for Triple-A Rochester in 2016.

WEATHER OFF TARGET: Yesterday the Twins-Tigers game was postponed due to blizzard-like conditions/sleet/freezing rain...below are the Target Field weather-affected games year-by-year:

HOT WHEELS: Byron Buxton stole his 32nd consecutive base Tuesday night extending the club record...Buxton is now 38-for-his-last-39 (97%)...below are the longest successful stolen base streaks in Twins history:

NOTE: The all-time American League record is held by Ichiro Suzuki (45) from April 29, 2006-May 16, 2007...the all-time National League/MLB record is held by Vince Coleman (50) from September 18, 1988-July 26, 1989.

MINNESOTA WINS: The Twins have gone 17-7 in their last 24 games, dating back to September 16, giving them a winning percentage of .708, the best in baseball since...during that time, they are 5-2-1 in series play...in that span, they lead baseball in batting average (.285), fourth in OBP (.353), third in runs-per-game (6.04), fourth in OPS (.819) and ninth in hits (239).

HOW DO YOU SAY STREAKING IN GERMAN?: Max Kepler has hit safely in eight straight games, the longest on the club this season and tied for third longest active streak in the AL...his career-high is nine, done twice, last May 29-June 7, 2017.

THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2018, the second game of a four-game series vs. the White Sox was postponed (as were games 3 and 4) due to blizzard-like conditions...the Twin Cities experienced approximately 16 inches of snow over the scheduled four-game series.

THIS AND THAT:

⚡ Twins are hitting .308 (12-for-39) with one home run (Schoop) vs. left-handed pitching and .269 (89-for-308) vs. right-handed pitching.

⚡ Twins rank last in baseball in walks (26)...Twins leaders are Cruz and Rosario, both with four.

⚡ Byron Buxton has six extra-base hits (5 doubles and 1 triple) in 30 plate appearances...he had four in 94 PA's all last season (28 games).

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: Pineda completed his big league comeback with a masterful 4.0-shutout inning performance against the Cleveland Indians on March 31 at Target Field, marking his first game back on a major league mound in 633 days...in his second start last Saturday at Philadelphia, he recorded his first victory since June 30, 2017 with 5.0 innings of two-run ball against the Phillies...allowed just two base runners through the third inning before Rhys Hoskins launched a one-out, solo home run in the fourth...was pulled after facing one batter in the sixth (a Jean Segura single, who later came around to score) with 80 pitches, 51 of which were strikes.

SETTING 'EM DOWN: He has struck out 697 batters over 689.0 innings...he is one of 12 pitchers in history to record at least 697 strikeouts in 689.0 innings or less (Philadelphia's David Robertson currently has the most with 877 career strikeouts in just 660.2 innings pitched), and is one of only three pitchers in that group to be primarily a starting pitcher (Mark Prior: 2002-06 and Robbie Ray: 2014-present)...needs just three strikeouts to reach 700 for his career.

AGAINST DETROIT: Pineda is making his fifth career start against the Tigers, and his first since a 4-1 loss on June 12, 2016, when he allowed just two runs on six hits over 6.0 IP as a member of the New York Yankees...only five Tigers currently on the 25-man roster (Cabrera, Castellanos, Greene, Norris and Zimmermann) were on the 2016 team during Pineda's start...owns a 9-11 lifetime record with a 3.74 ERA (149.1 IP, 62 ER) in 25 starts against American League Central opponents.

MARCH/APRIL FLOWERS: "Big Mike" owns a 14-7 record and a 3.37 ERA (147.0 IP, 55 ER) in the months of March and April, his second lowest of any month (September, 3.24), and his 154 strikeouts are the most of any month. In 2017, Pineda finished April 3-1 with a 3.14 ERA (28.2 IP, 10 ER), including a season-high 10 strikeout appearance on April 10 vs. Tampa Bay.

SPRING RECAP: Pineda completed his eighth spring training in 2019, his second with the Twins, after spending 2010-11 with Seattle, 2012-17 with New York-AL...he was in spring training with the Twins in 2018 but did not appear as he recovered from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow...tied for the team lead with 20.1 innings pitched, allowing nine runs (eight earned) while striking out a club-high 20 batters...finished the spring on a high note, striking out seven over 5.0 innings on March 26 against Colorado.

2017-18 RECAP:

- Made fifth career Opening Day roster (four with New York-AL: 2014-17 and one with Seattle: 2011).
- Started in Yankees Home Opener April 10 vs. Tampa Bay, retired the game's first 20 batters, before his perfect game was spoiled by Evan Longoria's two-out double in the seventh...was the first major league pitcher to take a perfect game into the seventh inning of his team's home opener since Houston's J.R. Richard (perfect through 6.1 IP) April 10, 1980 vs. Los Angeles-NL (Elias).
- Placed on 10-day injured list July 14 with a right UCL injury...transferred to 60-day injured list July 16, missing the remainder of the season...underwent "Tommy John" surgery July 18.
- Spent entire 2018 season on injured list while he recovered from the surgery.

CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched.
- Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August.
- Currently has 697 strikeouts in 689.0 IP...is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to have at least 697 strikeouts in 689.0 innings pitched or less, and is one of only three pitchers in that group to be primarily a starter (Mark Prior: 2002-06 and Robbie Ray: 2014-present).
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
