THE TWINS: After inting Kansus: After completing their seven-game roadtrip with a record of 4-3, going 2-0 in homestand, 1-2 in Philadelphia and 1-1 in New York (NL), the Twins began their six-game of two vs. Detroit before welcoming in the Blue Jays for four from Monday-Thursday.

TWINS BATTLE TIGERS TAILS OFF: The Twins beat the Tigers yesterday afternoon by a score of 4-3, scoring all four runs in the third inning, answering the two runs the Tigers scored in the top half....Michael Pineda (2-0) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Blake Parker earned his third save in as many chances...the offense was out-hit for the second time this season (1-1 in those games)...Eddie Rosario had two of the five hits and no Twins batters recorded an extra-base hit.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are 13-7 against the Tigers since the start of last season, going 8-3 at Target Field...the Twins have won seven of their last eight over Detroit, dating back to August 19...Twins last swept the Tigers September 17-19, 2018 in three games at Comerica. $\Phi$ C.J. Cron is hitting . 310 (27-for-87) with four doubles, five home runs and 19 RBI in 22 career games vs. Detroit.
क Nelson Cruz is hitting . 349 (22-for-63) with five doubles, five home runs and 15 RBI in his last 17 vs. Detroit.
क Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .333 (26-for-78) with eight doubles and 11 RBI in his last
22 vs. Detroit. 22 vs. Detroit.
\$ Jorge Polanco is hitting . 338 (27-for-80) in his last 20 vs. Detroit.
क DID YOU KNOW?: Just three players on the current Twins roster were ever on a Ron Gardenhire-managed team in Minnesota: Kyle Gibson started 10 games for Gardy in 2013 and 31 games in 2014...Trevor May pitched in 10 games ( 9 starts) in 2014...Jorge Polanco played five games in 2014.

MINNESOTA WINS: The Twins have gone 18 -7 in their last 25 games, dating back to September 16 , giving them a winning percentage of . 720 , the best in baseball since...during that time, they are 5-2-1 in series play....in that span, they rank second in baseball in batting average (.282), third in OBP (.353), fourth in runs-per-game (5.96), and sixth in OPS (.811).

HOW DO YOU SAY STREAKING IN GERMAN?: Max Kepler has hit safely in nine straight games, the longest on the club this season and second best active streak in baseball...it also ties his career-high of nine, done twice, last May 29-June 7, 2017...below are the active streaks in all of baseball:

During the streak, Kepler is hitting . 333 ( 13 -for-39) with one double, three home runs, eight RBI, four walks and a $.985^{\circ} \mathrm{OPS}$.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: The first Twins weekly award winners have been named...left-handed pitcher Devin Smeltzer has been named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week and infielder Travis Blankenhorn has been named Twins minor league Player of the Week...the 23 -year-old Smeltzer, who was acquired along with three others players in exchange for Brian Dozier at the deadline last year, made two starts for Double-A Pensacola this week, going 2-0, 0.00 (14.0 IP) with five hits allowed, two walks and 17 strikeouts... Blankenhorn, who was selected by the Twins in the third round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Pottsville High School (PA), played in seven games for Single-A Ft. Myers, hitting . 333 (8-for-24) with two doubles, one home run, two RBI and five walks.

LAST START: Made his third start of the season on April 7 at Philadelphia, the third of three games at Philadelphia, opposite Zach Eflin....was the loser, allowing two runs on two hits in 6.0 innings pitched....both runs allowed came on a Rhys Hoskins two-run homer in the sixth inning...finished the sixth but was relieved by Trevor May to start the seventh...it marked his third straight Interleague loss...it also marked his first loss since September 8, 2018 vs. Kansas City.

START PRIOR: Berríos did not factor into the decision at Kansas City on April $2 . .$. went 7.0 innings and allowed three runs on seven hits with four strikeouts...gave up his first home run of the season, a solo shot in the sixth (0'Hearn)...recorded at least 7.0 innings for his third straight start dating back to 2018, matching the longest such stretch of his career (May 15-27, 2018)... Mondesi's RBI single in the first inning snapped Berrís' scoreless-innings streak at 11.2 dating back to the fourth inning of his final start of 2018 (Sept. 28 vs. Chicago).

HOME SWEET HOME: He is 19-10, 3.50 ERA ( $205.2 \mathrm{IP}, 80 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in 35 career starts at Target Field... in his last 14 starts, he has gone 9-2, 2.61 ERA (93.0 IP, 27 ER) with a 189 opponent batting average and four double-digit strikeouts games (Twins 11-3 in those 14)...in that span he is tied with David Price, Blake Snell and Ryan Yarbrough for most home wins in the AL, while his innings pitched rank second and his strikeouts rank third (105).

- Since Target Field opened in 2010, he ranks tied with Phil Hughes for third most wins in
the park's history, trailing Kyle Gibson (24) and Brian Duensing (20).
AFTERNOON DELIGHT: In his career, Berríos has a 4.55 ERA ( $170.0 \mathrm{IP}, 86 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in 30 starts during the day with a 2.51 strikeout/walk ratio...this season he is 1-1 1.32 ERA (13.2 IP, 2 ER) with 4 walks and 17 strikeouts and holds batters to a .089 average.

STAYIN' HOT: He is 1-1, 2.18 ERA ( 20.2 IP, 5 ER) with four walks and 21 strikeouts in his three starts...all three outings have been quality starts...his . 155 opponent batting average ranks 6 th best in the AL and 11 th in all of baseball...in one start at home, Berríos is 1-0 ( 0.00 ERA, 7.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts, which marked the seventh time in his career with double-digit strikeout totals...the only current Twin to match at least seven $10+$ strikeout games is Michael Pineda.

LESS RUNS, LESS PROBLEMS: Berríos has now allowed three earned runs-or-less in each of his first three starts this year, becoming just the sixth Twins pitcher (seventh instance) to record three starts with three-or-less earned runs in the Twins' first eight games of the year, joining Brad Radke (1996), Bert Blyleven (1974 \& '72), Jim Perry (1970), Jim Kaat (1965), and Mudcat Grant (1966).

FACING THE TIGERS: Berríos is making his seventh career start against Detroit today... he last faced them June 13, 2018 at Comerica Park...surrendered only one run on seven hits with one walk and seven strikeouts over 6.0 innings and did not factor into decision....is 2-1, 4.40 ERA (14.1 IP, 7 ER) with 7 walks and 13 strikeouts in two career starts against the Tigers at Target Field...his last win was in a home start May 21, 2018, when he tossed 8.0 innings and allowed two runs on three hits with two walks and nine strikeouts.

BEST OFF THE ISLAND: He has the most wins among Puerto Rican Twins pitchers all-time with 30, ahead of J.C. Romero (25), Francisco Oliveras (3), Juan Agosto (1) and Ruben Gomez (1)... among all active Puerto Ricans in baseball he ranks first...Alex Claudio ranks second with 13.

DIVISION WOES: Division opponents batted just . 195 (63-for-323) against Berríos in the 2018 season...sixth best in his Major League Baseball among starting pitchers with at least 80 innings pitched. (according to InsideEdge)

SPRING RECAP: Berríos made six appearances, all starts, in Spring Training, going 3-0, 4.43 ERA (21.1 IP, 10 ER) with eight walks and 17 strikeouts...tied for the club lead for innings, matching Pineda.

## 2018 RECAP:

- 2018 American League All-Star led Twins in wins (12), complete games (2) and strikeouts (202), tied for first in starts (32) and second in innings pitched (192.1).
- Finished with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30 -plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana -33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Finished tied for first in the AL in complete games, tied for sixth in starts, eighth in innings pitched, 11th in strikeouts, 13th in opponent batting average (.222), and tied for 15th in wins.
- Recorded double-digit strikeouts four times on season: 11 on April 12 vs. Chicago-AL, 10 on May 15 vs. St. Louis, 10 on June 7 vs. Chicago-AL and career-high of 12 on June 24 vs. Texas.
