THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game roadtrip with a record of 4-3 (2-0 in Kansas City, 1-2 in Philadelphia and 1-1 in New York-NL), the Twins began their six-game homestand with two wins in three games, sweeping the Tigers in two over the weekend and losing to Toronto last night...today they will play the second of four games with the Jays at Target Field.

TWINS TAKE TOUGH LOSS TO TORONTO: The Twins lost to the Blue Jays last night by a score of 5-3, surrendering four runs in the top of the eighth inning...Martin Pérez made his first start of the season, allowing one run on seven hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Adalberto Mejia was dealt the loss, allowing a Teoscar Hernández three-run homer, giving the Jays the lead... the offense recorded five hits, three from Jorge Polanco, who also drew a walk.

TWINS-JAYS: The Twins are playing the second of seven games vs. the Blue Jays this season... they will travel to Canada for three at Rogers Centre May 6-8...the Twins have gone just 22-40 vs. the Jays since 2010, for a winning percentage of .355, their second lowest vs. any AL opponent since then (New York - .311).

⚡ Eddie Rosario is hitting .356 (16-for-45) with five home runs, seven RBI, nine runs scored and a 1.119 OPS in his last 11 games vs. the Blue Jays.

⚡ Byron Buxton is hitting .424 (14-for-33) with five home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.381 OPS in eight career games vs. the Jays.

⚡ Twins have hit at least one home run vs. the Jays in 13 straight games (since August 26, 2017), their longest active streak vs. an opponent, next being Baltimore (6).

HOW DO YOU SAY STREAKING IN GERMAN?: Max Kepler has hit safely in a career-high 10 games, the longest on the club this season and second best active streak in baseball...below are the active streaks in all of baseball:

During the streak, Kepler is hitting .318 (14-for-44) with two doubles, three home runs, eight RBI, four walks and a .943 OPS.

HIP HIP JORGE!: Jorge Polanco is hitting .420 (21-for-50) with three doubles, three triples, two home runs, four RBI and a 1.184 OPS in 13 games this season...in fact, since September 5, 2018 he is hitting .361 (53-for-147) with a .410 on-base percentage in 36 games...below are the AL leaders in a few categories this season:

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have recalled right-handed pitcher Tyler Duffey from Triple-A Rochester...Duffey pitched in three games for the Red Wings this season, allowing one run on two hits in 6.0 innings with three walks and 11 strikeouts... he appeared in 19 games for the Twins last season, going 2-2 with a 7.20 ERA (25.0 IP, 20 ER), four walks and 19 strikeouts...to make room on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned left-handed pitcher Andrew Vasquez to Triple-A Rochester...Vasquez, who was recalled last Wednesday, appeared in one game for the Twins.

⚡ Duffey appeared in seven games for the Twins in spring training and was optioned March 16.

JUMP ON 'EM EARLY: The Twins have seen 3.66 pitches-per-plate appearance this season, the lowest ratio in baseball; the highest in baseball is New York-AL at 4.18...they have also seen the lowest number of pitches at 1,804, the next closest being Cincinnati with 2,033...Jonathan Schoop leads the Twins and ranks eighth in baseball in fewest pitches-per-PA with 3.29...the next five are: Max Kepler (3.48), Byron Buxton (3.54), Eddie Rosario (3.81), C.J. Cron (3.83) and Jorge Polanco (3.86).

⚡ The Twins have struck out 97 times this season, only the Angels (90) have struck out fewer.

FIRST RESPONDERS: Through 13 games, opponents have scored at least one run in exactly 27 half-innings...the Twins have scored in 13 of the 27 half-innings that directly follow an opponent scoring...they lead baseball in largest percent of responding to opposing runs by scoring runs in next half inning: Minnesota - 48.1%, Washington - 41.2%, Tampa Bay - 40.0%, Los Angeles-NL 38.6%, Los Angeles-AL 36.8%...through 13 games in 2018, Twins pitchers surrendered a run, or more, in 23 half-innings, while their offense rebutted with runs of their own only five times (22%).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1961, Bob Allison hit the first grand slam in Twins history in the fourth ever game for the Twins after moving from Washington...the shot came in the first inning at Baltimore off Chuck Estrada...the Twins have hit 192 grand slams in their history...in 2018, while in Puerto Rico to play a two-game series with Cleveland, Twins players and staff visited communities on the island to help rebuild and clean after Hurricane Maria...José Berríos and teammates visited San Jorge Children's Hospital in San Juan and Eddie Rosario visited his high school and hosted a youth baseball clinic in his hometown of Guayama.

RESTO HOF: Former Twins outfielder and Rochester, Minnesota native Michael Restovich was inducted into the Rochester Quarterbacks Club 2019 Hall of Fame...the 1997 Mayo High School grad was drafted by the Twins in the second round of the 1997 First-Year Player Draft and appeared in 61 games for the Twins from 2002-04, hitting .274 (31-for-113) with three home runs...Michael now works at The Restovich, Braun and Associates firm which does criminal, family and personal law in Rochester, MN.

LAST START: Did not earn a decision after lasting 4.2 innings against New York-NL on April 9, a game in which the Twins battered Mets starter Jacob deGrom and four relievers in a 14-8 win...allowed three runs (3 earned) on eight hits and three walks with a season high six strikeouts...threw only 10 pitches in the first.

START PRIOR: In his first start, Gibson yielded six runs (5 earned) on eight hits over 4.2 innings at Kansas City, as the Twins rallied to win 7-6...the no-decision marked his first since July 2, 2018, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive starts in which he earned a decision...it was the longest such streak by a Twins pitcher since Phil Hughes took a decision in 18 straight starts from June 1-Sept. 1, 2014.

- The last time Gibby allowed more than five runs and struck out 2 or less batters was July 9, 2017 vs. Baltimore (4.0 IP, 9 H, 7 R, 7 ER, 2 BB, 1 K, 1 HR).

NIGHT VS. DAY: Gibson is making his second night start on the season...carries a record of 34-32, 4.33 ERA (557.2 IP, 268 ER) with 194 walks and 421 strikeouts with opponents hitting .268 in 94 career night starts...compared to 20-29, 4.75 ERA (378.2 IP, 200 ER) with 147 walks and 272 strikeouts and a .275 opponents average in 67 day starts.

AGAINST THE BLUE JAYS: Gibson is 3-1 in seven career starts against Toronto with a 4.79 ERA (41.1 IP, 22 ER), 19 walks and 33 strikeouts...last time out against the Blue Jays, May 1, 2018, he allowed two runs on five hits with two walks and six strikeouts over 5.0 innings but did not factor into the decision in a 7-4 loss at Target Field...last win came September 17, 2017 at Target Field, allowing five runs on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched (supported with 13 runs)...only loss to Toronto came August 6, 2015, allowing eight runs over 4.2 innings, tied for the most runs he has given up in a start in his career.

APRIL/MARCH SHOWERS: Gibby owns a 5-11 record and a 5.37 ERA (130.2 IP, 78 ER) in the months of March and April, his second highest of any month (August, 5.49), and his 83 strikeouts are the least of any month...in 2018, however, Gibson ended March/April 3-1 with a 3.33 ERA (27.0 IP, 20 ER) and 14 walks.

LEFT AND RIGHT: He has held right-handed hitters to a .200 (4-for-20) average with zero home runs, three walks, six strikeouts and a .554 OPS...lefties have hit .455 (10-for-22) with three homers, two strikeouts and a 1.545 OPS in 2019...for his career righties have hit .255 with 152 walks and 393 strikeouts and lefties have hit .286 with 189 walks and 300 strikeouts.

HOME AGAIN: In his career, Gibson is 24-32 with a 4.61 ERA (446.2 IP, 229 ER) in 78 starts at home...he was 4-6 with a 3.67 ERA (83.1 IP, 34 ER) and 36 walks with 79 strikeouts in 14 home starts in 2018...on the road, Gibson was 6-7 with a 3.57 ERA (113.1 IP, 45 ER) in 18 starts...he is the all-time leader in wins at Target Field.

SPRING RECAP: Gibson participated in his seventh career spring training with the Twins in 2019...made three appearances (3 starts), going 0-1, 5.87 ERA (7.2 IP, 5 ER) with three walks and nine strikeouts...was limited due to his recovery from a bout with E. coli.

2018 RECAP:

- Led Twins in innings pitched (196.2), ERA (3.62), and quality starts (18), tied for first in starts (32), and ranked second in strikeouts (179)...set career bests in every category (matching previous high for starts), while also setting career standard for strikeouts-per-9.0 IP (8.19).
- Along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Set single-game career-high with 10 strikeouts April 26 at New York-AL.
- Ranked tied for second in the AL in opponent grounded into doubleplays (23).
- Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings pitched.
- Named 2018 Charles O. Johnson Award for Most Improved Twin, also Mike Augustin "Media Good Guy" award.

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
- Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
- Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
- In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.

Odorizzi is making his fourth start of the season tomorrow night against Toronto...suffered the loss in his last start April 10 at New York-NL after working 4.2 innings, allowing three earned runs on one hit and four walks with three strikeouts...took a no-hitter into the fifth inning against the Mets...this will be his 16th career start against Toronto and his first in a Twins uniform...his last start against the Blue Jays came August 14, 2017, when he tossed 6.0 innings, allowing two runs on three hits with three walks and four strikeouts in a 2-1 loss as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays...Odorizzi is 5-3, 3.21 ERA (89.2 IP, 32 ER) with 33 walks and 68 strikeouts all-time against Toronto.
