THE TWINS．The Twins beran their 59th campaign in Minnesota with a series win Indians last weekend．．．tonight they will begin their first roadtrip with seven games in the next nine days．．．they start with two in Kansas City tonight and tomorrow，an off－day in Philadelphia on Thursday，then three against the Phillies over weekend，an off－day in New York on April 8，then two against the Mets April 9－10．．．the five days off in the first 12 days are the most in baseball．

TWINS TAKE SERIES OVER TRIBE：The Twins beat the Indians on Sunday afternoon in the rubber game of the weekend series．．．Michael Pineda made his Twins debut pitching 4.0 shutout innings．．．Martín Pérez（1－0）pitched 3.2 innings of relief in his Twins debut and Ryne Harper made his major league debut with a scoreless ninth．．．the offense recorded 15 hits，three from Nelson Cruz，who fell a triple short of the cycle．．．five other Twins recorded multiple hits．
क Harper became the sixth－oldest player（second－oldest pitcher）to make his major league debut for the Twins（since 1961）at 30 years and four days old．．．only INF Minnie Mendoza（4／9／1970， 36.144 years old），C Hank Izquierdo（8／9／1967，36．142），C Chris Heintz（9／10／2005，31．035），INF Randy Ruiz（8／1／2008，30．287）and RHP Yohan Pino （ $6 / 19 / 2014,30.174$ ）were older．

TWINS AND ROYALS：The Twins and Royals are playing the first of 19 games this season．．． the Twins went 9－10 against KC in 2018，going 2－8 at Kauffman Stadium and 7－2 at Target Field．．．the Twins have gone 6－4 in their last 10 vs．KC．
$\Phi$ The Twins had an eight－game losing streak at Kauffman last season until winning the season－finale on September 16.
$\Phi$ Willians Astudillo is 7 －for－13（．538）in four career games against the Royals．
$\Phi$ Jason Castro is hitting 298 （36－for－121）with nine doubles，two triples，two home runs
and 17 RBI in 35 career games vs．KC．
玉 C．J．Cron is hitting ． 324 （11－for－34）with five home runs，nine RBI and a 1.196 OPS in 10 career games at Kauffman．
$\Phi$ Jorge Polanco is hitting ． 325 （ 13 －for－ 40 ）in his last nine games against KC．
$\Phi$ Eddie Rosario is hitting ． 307 （39－for－127）in 32 career games at Kauffman．．．in his last 15 here，he is hitting .385 （ 25 －for－65）with 12 RBI．

ARMS RACE：Through three games，the Twins have struckout 39 batters in 27.0 innings pitched．．．in all of baseball，they rank first in opponent batting average（．133），hits allowed and strikeouts－per－9．0 IP（13．00），and second in WHIP（0．81）
$\mp$ Over the three－game series with Cleveland，the Twins set a club record for strikeouts in any Twins team＇s first three games（39）．．．for the starters：José Berríos had 10 （ 7.2 IP ）， Jake Odorizzi had 11 （ 6.0 IP）and Michael Pineda had five（4．0 IP）．．．they combined for a 13.25 strikeout－to－walk ratio，the best in baseball．

क Former Mets pitcher Jeremy Hefner begins his first season as a professional coach，filling the Assistant Pitching position．．．Pitching Coach Wes Johnson joins from the University of Arkansas and becomes the first ever major league pitching coach to jump straight from the collegiate ranks．

DO YOU SMELL WHAT THE ROC＇IS COOKIN＇？：Rocco Baldelli became the 14th manager of the Twins on October 25 after spending parts of six years with the Tampa Bay Rays as a player and splitting eight seasons between their front office and coaching staff，most recently as their Major League Field Coordinator．．．he is the first managerial hire for the Twins outside the organization since Ray Miller in 1985，who was a coach with the Orioles prior．．．at 37 years， six months，Baldelli is the youngest manager in baseball．．．．he is roughly 15 months younger than Nelson Cruz．
玉 Baldelli played 24 career games against the Royals from 2003－10，hitting ． 362 （34－for－ 94）with eight doubles，two home runs and 16 RBI．

MAKING 'EM MISS: Made his first career Opening Day start March 28 vs. CLE, setting a club record for strikeouts by an Opening Day starter, surpassing the previous high of eight done by Brad Radke (1996), Bert Blyleven (1975) and Dean Chance (1968)...struck out 10 batters, marking the seventh time in his career with double-digit strikeout totals...the only current Twin to match at least seven $10+$ strikeout games is Michael Pineda, who has done so with two other clubs (NYY, SEA).

- Allowed just two hits, a double to Leonys Martin and a single to Brad Miller....also issued a walk to Carlos Santana...was relied by Taylor Rogers after 96 pitches as Rogers earned his third career save.
- Became the 11th different Opening Day starter in the Twins' last 13 seasons (J. Santana 2007, L. Hernandez-2008, Liriano - 2009, Baker-2010, Pavano-2011-12, Worley - 2013, Nolasco - 2014, Hughes - 2015, E. Santana - 2016-17, Odorizzi - 2018).
- The last pitchers in baseball to strikeout double-digit batters on Opening Day were Max Scherzer (10) and Noah Syndergaard (10) last season.
SPRING RECAP: Berríos made six appearances, all starts, in Spring Training, going 3-0, 4.43 ERA (21.1 IP, 10 ER) with eight walks and 17 strikeouts...tied for the club lead for innings, matching Pineda.

- Recorded double-digit strikeouts four times on season: 11 on April 12 vs. Chicago-AL, 10 on May 15 vs. St. Louis, 10 on June 7 vs. Chicago-AL and career-high of 12 on June 24 vs. Texas.

AGAINST THE ROYALS: Berríos will be making his 10th career start against Kansas City and his first of the season...is 2-2, $4.35 \mathrm{ERA}(51.2 \mathrm{IP}, 25 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 18 walks and 42 strikeouts in his career...last time out against the Royals was September 24, 2018...took a no-decision after allowing two runs on five hits and three walks with nine strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work... last win against Kansas City was August 4, 2018, allowed two runs on five hits with three walks and six strikeouts over 7.0 innings...looking for first win at Kansas City...is 0-0 5.40 ERA (26.2 IP, 16 ER) with 12 walks and 17 strikeouts at Kauffman Stadium.
