**THE TWINS:** The Twins completed their homestand with a record of 3-3, going 2-0 vs. Detroit and 1-3 vs. Toronto...today the Twins will begin a six-game roadtrip with three vs. the Orioles today and tomorrow, followed by three in Houston from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins are scheduled to play 19 games in their next 19 days (including today).

**TORONTO TAKES TWIN CITIES:** The Twins lost to the Blue Jays Thursday afternoon by a score of 7-4, losing the four-game series three games to one...Michael Pineda (2-1) was the starter and loser, allowing a season-high six runs on seven hits in 3.2 innings pitched...Ryne Harper pitched 3.1 scoreless innings of relief...the offense recorded eight hits and struck out nine times...Eddie Rosario homered twice, the seventh multi-homer game of his career...Byron Buxton extended his team-record 33 straight successful stolen base attempts.

**MAN UP:** Right-handed pitcher Fernando Romero is the 26th man for the Twins first double-header of the season today...Romero, who was optioned to Triple-A Rochester on March 22 from spring training, appeared in four games of relief for the Red Wings, allowing four runs on five hits in 8.1 innings, including four home runs, two walks and 11 strikeouts.

**TWINS AND BIRDS:** The Twins went 6-1 against the Orioles last season, going 1-2 at Camden Yards in the Opening Series and 4-0 at Target Field in early July...their only loss came on Opening Day as Adam Jones hit a walk-off homer off Fernando Rodney in the 11th inning...since that game, their six-game winning streak is the longest active streak vs. any opponent...it's tied for their third longest ever vs. the Orioles, the longest being nine games from September 23, 2006-August 26, 2007.

☞ Since 2017, the Twins are 11-3 vs. the O's, their best vs. any AL opponent in that span...the Twins are 20-8 in their last 28, dating back to September 2014.

☞ They have won three of their last four series at Camden, dating back to 2015.

☞ Max Kepler has hit safely in 13 of 14 career games against the Orioles, hitting .404 (21-for-52) with six doubles, one triple, five home runs, 16 RBI, eight walks, a .483 OBP and a 1.329 OPS.

☞ Jonathan Schoop signed a one-year contract with the Twins on December 6...he was signed by the Orioles in 2008 and spent six seasons in Baltimore, hitting .261 (615-for-2360) with 126 doubles, 106 home runs and 312 RBI in 635 games...he remains the club's all-time leader in homers among second basemen; ranks second in runs and RBI and third in doubles.

☞ Nelson Cruz spent 2014 with Baltimore, hitting .271 (166-for-613) with 32 doubles, a major league-best 40 home runs and 108 RBI in 159 games for the AL East champs...he was named the starting DH for the AL in the All-Star Game, played at Target Field.

**HIP HIP JORGE!** Jorge Polanco is hitting .462 (18-for-39) with two doubles, two triples, three home runs, five RBI and a 1.357 OPS in his last 11 games...in fact, since September 5, 2018 he is hitting .357 (56-for-157) with a .414 on-base percentage in 39 games...below are the AL leaders in a few categories this season:

**RED HOT ROSIE:** Eddie Rosario hit two home runs on Thursday, continuing his 13-game tear...since April 2, he leads the American League with 16 RBI and is tied for third in the AL lead with 6 home runs...after beginning the season 0-for-11 in his first three games, he is 16-for-50 (.320) with an 1.110 OPS in his last 13 games...since 1961, only four players in Twins history have recorded six or more home runs through the team's first 16 games: Tony Oliva (7) in 1966, Rosario (6) in 2019, Kent Hrbek (6) in 1982 and Bobby Darwin (6) in 1972.

**MAD MAX (FURY ROAD):** Max Kepler went 0-for-4 with a walk on Thursday, extending his on-base streak to 13, tied for third longest of his career, his longest being 19 done July 5-27, 2018...during the current streak, he is hitting .278 (15-for-54) with a .361 on-base percentage...Kepler enters today with an eight-game road hitting streak, hitting .324 (12-for-37) with three home runs and nine RBI in that span.

**HOT WHEELS:** Byron Buxton has stolen a club record 33 straight stolen bases successfully...his last caught-stealing was in Baltimore on May 23, 2017, when he over-slid second base in a steal attempt; had the base stolen but was tagged out upon the over-slide...Buxton is now 39-for-his-last-40 (97.5%)...below are a few notable charts on Buxton's stolen base success rate (Buxton is 50-for-55 in his career):

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1988, the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome hosted the 10,000th home run in Yankees history as Claudell Washington went deep off Jeff Reardon in a 7-6 victory over the Twins...on this day in 1995, Jeff Reardon announced his retirement; the closer for the 1987 World Champion Twins saved 104 games in a Twins uniform from 1987-89 and ranks sixth on the club's all-time list; he saved three postseason games in 1987, including World Series Game 7, securing the Twins first ever World Series victory.

**LAST START:** Earned his second win of the season (first since his Opening Day start on March 28 vs. Cleveland) with a 6-4 victory last Saturday vs. Detroit...pitched 6.2 innings and allowed two runs on four hits with one walk and seven strikeouts...received his most runs of support this season with five...marked his fourth quality start and his fifth consecutive dating back to September 28, 2018 vs. Chicago-AL.

**STAYIN' HOT, STILL:** He is 2-1, 2.30 ERA (27.1 IP, 7 ER) with five walks and 28 strikeouts on the year...his four outings have all been quality starts...his 28 strikeouts rank 9th-best among American League starters...his H/9 (4.94) ranks 9th best in all of baseball and 5th in the AL behind Shane Bieber-CLE, Domingo Germán-NYY, Collin McHugh-HOU and Matt Shoemaker-TOR.

**WHIP IT:** Entering today's start, Berríos has allowed 15 hits and five walks in 27.1 innings pitched for a 0.73 WHIP, which ranks first in the American League and second in all of baseball (trailing only German Márquez of the Colorado Rockies).

**ROAD WOES:** In 40 career road starts, Berríos is 11-17 with a 5.20 ERA over 211.1 innings...of the 55 home runs Berríos has surrendered in his career, 40 have been at opposing ballparks...owned a 3-7 away record in 2018 with a 4.85 ERA (85.1 IP, 46 ER).

- However, has a 3.46 ERA (13.0 IP, 5 ER) in two road starts this year...has pitched at least 6.0 innings in both outings.

**AGAINST THE ORIOLES:** He will be making his fifth career start against the Orioles, third at Camden Yards...he is 3-0, 3.08 ERA (26.1 IP, 9 ER) with four walks and 23 strikeouts in his career vs. Baltimore...his best career start against the O's came on April 1, 2018 as he threw his first career complete game shutout, a three-hitter at Camden Yards in a 7-0 victory (1BB & 6SO)...had only allowed one hit entering the ninth inning before surrendering a pair of singles...marked the Twins first complete game shutout since Ervin Santana on June 17, 2017 at San Francisco.

- Has won both of his career starts at Camden Yards with a 1.76 ERA (his lowest of any road ballpark at which he has made multiple starts)...has turned in a quality start in both of his outings in Baltimore (also a 4-3 win on May 24, 2017).

**PITCH SELECTION:** José has favored his curveball more this season than any other with a 38.9 percent usage rate...in 2018 he threw it 30.4 percent of time, 30 percent in 2017 and 21.6 percent in 2016...32.3 percent of his pitches thrown this year have been four-seamers and he'll also feature a sinker (19 percent) as well as a changeup (9.8 percent)...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitch arsenal, according to Baseball Savant:

### 2018 RECAP:

- 2018 American League All-Star led Twins in wins (12), complete games (2) and strikeouts (202), tied for first in starts (32) and second in innings pitched (192.1).
- Finished with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Finished tied for first in the AL in complete games, tied for sixth in starts, eighth in innings pitched, 11th in strikeouts, 13th in opponent batting average (.222), and tied for 15th in wins.
- Recorded double-digit strikeouts four times on season: 11 on April 12 vs. Chicago-AL, 10 on May 15 vs. St. Louis, 10 on June 7 vs. Chicago-AL and career-high of 12 on June 24 vs. Texas.
- Given 2018 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year, voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA...also awarded with the Carl R. Pohlad Community Service Award.

**Ks FOR GOOD:** Berrios will donate \$50 per strikeout in 2019 to Fundación CAP. Fundación CAP is a non-profit organization that since 1989 has been working for children with cancer at Hospital Pediátrico, the leading public pediatric hospital in Puerto Rico and the only one that treats certain types of cancer. The mission of CAP is to ensure that ALL children with cancer, regardless of their financial resources, have access to first-rate cancer treatment here in Puerto Rico, close to their family and home. 100% of the funds collected remain in Puerto Rico and their benefit is seen and felt in every corner of the Hospital.

### TONIGHT'S STARTER - MARTÍN PÉREZ, LHP [SEASON: 1-0, 5.02 ERA ; CAREER: 44-49, 4.64 ERA]

Pérez is making his second start of the season and his 130th career start tonight at Baltimore...made his first start as a Twin Monday vs. Toronto and turned in a quality start, tossing 6.0 innings, allowing just one run on seven hits...departed with a 3-1 lead, but the Jays rallied for a 5-3 victory...is 44-49 with a 4.64 ERA (775.2 IP, 400 ER), 281 walks and 479 strikeouts in 145 career appearances (129 starts)...lifetime against Baltimore, Pérez is 2-4, 5.36 ERA (42.0 IP, 25 ER) with nine walks and 29 strikeouts in seven appearances (five starts)...his last start against the Orioles came July 14, 2018 at Camden Yards (with Texas)...gave up one run on five hits in 7.0 innings, but was dealt a tough-luck, 1-0 loss.

**AGAINST THE O'S:** In seven starts against Baltimore, the left-hander owns a 5.36 ERA (42.0 IP, 25 ER), the third highest of any team he has made at least five starts against, trailing only Tampa Bay (6.57) and Boston (5.68)...when he pitches at Camden Yards, he brings a career line of 1-2, 3.79 ERA (19.0 IP, 8 ER), with his last road start coming on July 17, 2018, as a member of the Texas Rangers, when he threw 7.0 one-run innings, allowing just five hits and striking out four in a 1-0 loss.
