THE TWINS: After completing their homestand with a record of 3-3, going 2-0 vs. Detroit and 1-3 vs. Toronto, the Twins began their six-game roadtrip with a two wins over the Orioles yesterday...today the Twins will play the three-game series finale before traveling to Houston post game to play three against the Astros from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins are scheduled to play 18 games in their next 18 days (including today).

TWINS BULLY BALTIMORE: The Twins won both games of the doubleheader yesterday, winning game one by a score of 6-5, followed by a 16-7 victory in the night game...Twins starters José Berríos and Martín Pérez combined to allow eight runs on 14 hits in 12.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded 28 hits on the day, 20 going for extra-base hits (nine doubles and 11 home runs)...Eddie Rosario went 5-for-9 with one double, three home runs and four RBI in both games combined...Jonathan Schoop made his return to Baltimore and went 4-for-8 with two doubles, two home runs and four RBI on the day.

☞ 11 home runs on the day fell one short of the club record of 12 (in one day), done August 29, 1963 vs. Washington.

☞ Eight home runs in game two tied a club record, done previously August 29, 1963.

☞ Nelson Cruz, Mitch Garver and Jonathan Schoop each had multi-homer games, tying a club record for most players with multiple homers in same game (July 12, 2001 at Milwaukee - Jacque Jones, Corey Koskie and Torii Hunter)...Eddie Rosario also had a multi-homer game in game one, making the Twins the first team in baseball history with four multi-homer games in one day.

☞ 16 runs and 19 hits in game two both marked season-highs.

TWINS AND BIRDS: The Twins are 8-1 vs. the Orioles dating back to last season...their only loss came on 2018 Opening Day as Adam Jones hit a walk-off homer off Fernando Rodney in the 11th inning...since that game, their eight-game winning streak is the longest active streak vs. any opponent...it's tied for their second longest ever vs. the Orioles for the Twins, the longest being nine games from September 23, 2006-August 26, 2007.

☞ Since 2017, the Twins are 13-3 vs. the O's, their best vs. any AL opponent in that span...the Twins are 22-8 in their last 30, dating back to September 2014.

☞ The Twins last sweep of the Orioles came in four games July 5-8, 2018 at Target Field...their last sweep at Camden came in three games May 22-24, 2017.

☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .389 (37-for-95) with seven doubles, six home runs, 24 RBI and a 1.111 OPS in his last 25 games at Camden Yards.

HIP HIP JORGE! Jorge Polanco is hitting .409 (18-for-44) with two doubles, two triples, three home runs, five RBI and a 1.210 OPS in his last 12 games...in fact, since September 5, 2018 he is hitting .346 (56-for-162) with a .402 on-base percentage in 40 games - fourth best average in baseball since that date.

RED HOT ROSIE: Eddie Rosario hit two home runs on Thursday and two in game one yesterday becoming the third Twin to hit multiple homers in consecutive games (Kirby Puckett - 1987 and Don Mincher - 1963)...since April 6, he leads the American League in RBI (18), home runs (9) and slugging percentage (1.044)...through games of April 5, he had a slugging percentage of .200, he is now at .743 SLG...his nine home runs through 18 games to start a season is a club record, the next most was Tony Oliva with seven in 1966.

LEAVING THE YARD: The Twins have hit 33 home runs so far through 18 games, their most in club history through their first 18...the club record through the first 19 is 32, done in 1964 (eclipsed record already)...the Twins are on pace to hit 288 home runs, which would pass their previous mark of 225, set in 1963...the MLB record if 267, done by New York-AL last season.

HOT WHEELS: Byron Buxton has stolen a club record 33 straight stolen bases successfully...his last caught-stealing was in Baltimore on May 23, 2017, when he over-slid second base in a steal attempt; had the base stolen but was tagged out upon the over-slide...Buxton is now 39-for-his-last-40 (97.5%)...below are a few notable charts on Buxton's stolen base success rate (Buxton is 50-for-55 in his career):

TWINS MINOR LEAGUE WEEKLYS: Single-A Cedar Rapids outfielder Trey Cabbage and Double-A Pensacola right-handed pitcher Brusdar Graterol are the Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...Cabbage was drafted by the Twins in the fourth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Grainger High School in Rutledge, Tennessee...Graterol made the start for the Blue Wahoos on Tuesday at Biloxi, pitching 7.0 shutout innings with one hit, one walk and eight strikeouts...the 20-year-old Calabozo, Venezuela native has gone 1-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER) with six walks, 18 strikeouts and a .121 opponent batting average in three starts for the Wahoos this season.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1961, the Twins played their first game in Minnesota at Metropolitan Stadium after moving from Washington...they lost that game to the expansion "new" Washington Senators by a score of 5-3...Camilo Pascual was the starter for the Twins, allowing three runs on eight hits in 8.0 innings pitched...Ray Moore was the losing pitcher, allowing two runs in the top of the ninth inning...the Twins went on to win their first ever game in Minnesota the following day against the Senators.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not earn a decision after lasting 5.1 innings against Toronto on April 16...allowed one run through 5.0 innings, then was pulled after letting in two runs on two hits in the sixth...Ryne Harper came in relief and allowed each runner Gibson left on to score...third straight start lasting at least 4.2 innings.

AGAINST THE ORIOLES: Gibson is 4-2, 4.89 ERA (49.2 IP, 27 ER) with 28 walks and 45 strikeouts in nine career starts against the O's...last outing against Baltimore was July 7, 2018, earned the win after allowing three earned runs over 7.0 innings on four hits and four walks with nine strikeouts, one shy of his career high...career 2-1, 4.39 ERA (26.2 IP, 13 ER) at Camden Yards...is 2-2 in last first four decisions against the Orioles, 1-1, 2.08 ERA (13.0 IP, 3 ER) in last two starts.

ROAD WARRIOR: Gibson is looking for his first road win this season and the Twins have gone 6-1 in his last seven road starts dating back to July 26...has posted an ERA of 4.28 (90.1 IP, 43 ER) since...over his career, Gibson has had success on the road, posting a 30-20 record with a 4.39 ERA across 83 starts as compared to his 24-32 record (4.64 ERA) at home.

REST UP: On five days rest, Gibson is 20-14, 3.94 ERA (337.2 IP, 148 ER) in his career while he's 27-33, 4.56 ERA (460.0 IP, 233 ER) when given four day's rest... in 2018, Gibson was 5-7, 4.09 ERA and 3-3, 3.28 ERA on four day's rest.

APRIL/MARCH SHOWERS: Gibby owns a 5-11 record and a 5.43 ERA (136.0 IP, 82 ER) in the months of March and April, his second highest of any month (August, 5.49), and his 87 strikeouts are the second least of any month (86 in May)...in 2018, however, Gibson ended March/April 1-1 with a 3.33 ERA (27.0 IP, 10 ER) and 14 walks.

GIBBY ON TARGET: Dating back to last season, Gibson has a two-game winning streak on the road (two no-decisions since that two-game win-streak) posting a 5.40 ERA (23.1 IP, 15 ER) in that span...his last loss on the road came September 3 at Houston, allowing two runs on four hits in 7.0 innings pitched.

PITCH ARENAL: Gibson's 37.8 percent usage rate of his sinker is the most he's thrown that pitch since 2015 where it was logged at 38.1 percent...in 2018, he threw it 35.4 percent of time, 35.4 percent again in 2017 and 29.6 percent in 2016...he has hurled his four-seamer 23 percent of the time this year, his slider 20.6, curve 10.6 and his changeup sits at 10.4 percent ...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitches according to Baseball Savant:

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
- Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
- Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
- In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE ODORIZZI [SEASON: 1-2, 4.76 ERA // CAREER: 48-50, 3.97 ERA]

Odorizzi is making his fifth start of the season tomorrow and his sixth career start against Houston...earned the win in his last start April 17 vs. Toronto after working 5.2 innings, allowing one run on six hits and one walk with six strikeouts (fewest walks since September 18, six starts)...his last start against the Astros came September 5, 2018, when he tossed 4.2 innings, allowing five runs on four hits with four walks and four strikeouts in a 1-9 Twin's loss...Odorizzi is 3-1, 2.12 ERA (29.2 IP, 18 ER) with 15 walks and 32 strikeouts all-time against Houston...his 2.12 ERA is his lowest against any opponent that he's thrown at least 20.0 innings.

TEAM BULLPEN NOTES

- Twins relievers have combined for four wins this season, tied for fifteenth most in baseball...they've walked 34, tied for fourteenth most in baseball...they've walked 20 in their last 12 games vs. 27 in their first ten...Twins are 7-for-8 in save opps this season (Parker 4-for-4, Rogers 2-for-2, Hildenberger 1-for-1 & Mejia 0-for-1)...opp. batting average of .259 (64-for-247) in 18 games (64.1 IP).
- The Twins bullpen went 6-1, 1.97 ERA (64.0 IP, 14 ER) with 6 HR, 22 BB, 57 K and a .180 BAA in seven games vs. Baltimore last season...the Twins bullpen recorded three holds and averaged 15.3 pitches per inning against Baltimore in those seven games...in two games at Camden Yards last season, the Twins bullpen went 1-1 w/ a 6.43 ERA (7.0 IP, 5 ER) five walks & 11 strikeouts.
