THE TWINS: The Twins began their six-game roadtrip with a three-game sweep over the Orioles this weekend...tonight the Twins will play a three-game series in Houston, all night games...they will travel home late on Wednesday, enjoy an off-day on Thursday, then repeat their current week by hosting Baltimore over the weekend, followed by four against the Astros...the Twins are 7-3 on the road, tied for the third most road wins in baseball.

BREAK OUT BROOMS IN BALTIMORE: The Twins beat the Orioles yesterday afternoon by a score of 4-3, sweeping an opponent for the third time this season - the first in three games... Kyle Gibson earned his first win of the season, allowing two runs on five hits in 6.0 innings pitched...Trevor May (2) and Trevor Hildenberger (4) each earned a hold and Taylor Rogers (3) earned the save...the offense recorded nine hits, two from both C.J. Cron and Ehire Adrianza...the club also went 3-for-14 with runners in scoring position.

TWINS-STROS: The Twins and Astros are playing the first of seven meetings this season...their next series will be at Target Field a week from today for four...last season, they went 2-4, going 2-1 at home and 0-3 at Minute Maid Park...their last win in this ballpark came July 15, 2017, losing four straight here since...the Twins are 27-30 all-time against the Astros, including a record of 16-21 since Houston joined the American League in 2013...they have won just three times in their last 15 meetings with the Astros.

☞ Marwin Gonzalez signed a two-year contract with the Twins on February 25...he started his Houston career in 2012 and played parts of seven seasons with the Astros until last season...he played 795 career games for Houston, hitting .264 (650-for-2466) with 139 doubles, eight triples, 76 home runs and 292 RBI...he ranks 26th on the Astros all-time list in games...delivered game-tying, 9th-inning home run in Game 2 of 2017 World Series at Los Angeles-NL (off Kenley Jansen), saving Astros from 2-0 deficit (Houston won the game, 7-6 in 11 innings, and eventually the series, 4-3).

☞ Jason Castro was originally selected by Houston in the first round (10th overall) of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft...he played 617 career games with Houston, hitting .232 (469-for-2018) with 114 doubles, nine triples, 62 home runs and 212 RBI and represented the Astros in the 2013 All-Star Game...he remains fourth on the Astros all-time list in games caught (572), trailing Brad Ausmus (1243), Alan Ashby (901) and Johnny Edwards (607).

☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .333 (16-for-48) with a .353 OBP vs. Houston, hitting safely in 11 of 12 career games.

☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .365 (31-for-85) with five doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI and a .972 OPS in 21 career games vs. the Astros, including multiple hits in five of his last seven, and three hits in three of his last four...347 (17-for-49) in 12 games at Minute Maid.

☞ Tyler Duffey graduated from Bellaire High School approximately a 15 minute drive southwest from Minute Maid Park...he attended Rice University from 2010-12.

BUCK DOUBLES DOWN: Byron Buxton has doubled in four straight games and has five doubles in those four...he has 12 doubles on the season, already just seven short of his career-high of 19, done in 2016...the 12 doubles lead all of baseball, next are Mitch Haniger, Ryon Healy, David Peralta and Anthony Rendon, all with 10.

☞ Buxton has 13 extra-base hits out of 17 total hits (76.5%) this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: 39.5%

RED HOT ROSIE: After starting the season 0-for-11 in his first three games, Eddie Rosario is hitting .328 (21-for-64) with four doubles, nine home runs, 20 RBI and a 1.180 OPS in his last 16 games...all nine of his home runs have come since April 6, since that date he is tied with Christian Yelich for first in baseball in homers, second to Yelich (21) in RBI (18), and leads baseball in slugging percentage (.940).

☞ Rosario is slugging .943 (33 total bases in 35 ABs) on fastballs this season -- 2nd best in MLB; League Avg: .504.

LEAVING THE YARD: The Twins have hit 33 home runs so far through 19 games, their most in club history through their first 19...the Twins are on pace to hit 281 home runs, which would pass their club record of 225, set in 1963...the MLB record is 267, done by New York-AL last season.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 7-3 on the road this season for a winning percentage of .700, tied for third best in baseball...seven wins in the first 10 road games are their most since 2010...individuals on the road this season: Mitch Garver is hitting .545 (12-for-22) with five home runs, Jonathan Schoop is hitting .371 (13-for-35) with four home runs, Jorge Polanco is hitting .342 (13-for-38) with four doubles, Nelson Cruz is hitting .333 (7-for-21), Max Kepler is hitting .333 (11-for-33), and Eddie Rosario is hitting .317 (13-for-41).

HOT WHEELS: Byron Buxton has stolen a club record 33 straight stolen bases successfully...his last caught-stealing was in Baltimore on May 23, 2017, when he over-slid second base in a steal attempt; had the base stolen but was tagged out upon the over-slide...Buxton is now 39-for-his-last-40 (97.5%) and 50-for-55 in his career.

☞ The all-time American League record is held by Ichiro Suzuki (45) from April 29, 2006-May 16, 2007...the all-time National League/MLB record is held by Vince Coleman (50) from September 18, 1988-July 26, 1989.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1961, the Twins won their first game in Minnesota at Metropolitan Stadium after moving from Washington...the score was 5-4 in 10 innings...they won on a Zoilo Versalles sac-fly, scoring Early Battey; in front of a crowd of 17,445...in 1985, the Twins recorded 16 hits in a 9-5 victory over Seattle...in the fourth inning, Kirby Puckett hit a three-run home run, his first homer in the majors, off Matt Young.

TARGET FIELD IS GREEN: In celebration of Earth Day 2019, the Twins announced today that they have achieved LEED (Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design) Gold recertification for Existing Buildings: Operations & Maintenance, resulting from the club's continued enhancements to Target Field, the "Greenest Ballpark in America"...LEED is the world's most widely used program for the design, construction and operation of high-performance buildings...after the Twins opened Target Field as the second Major League Baseball facility to earn LEED Silver for New Construction (in 2010), the team then became the first professional sports franchise to receive LEED Silver for both construction and Existing Buildings: Operations & Maintenance (in 2011)...in 2017, the Twins became the first to attain LEED Gold for operation and maintenance of their facility.

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: Odorizzi picked up his first win of the season in his last start, tossing 5.2-innings of one-run ball in a 4-1 victory April 17 over Toronto...allowed a first-inning run, but after the Twins responded with two in the bottom half, he combined with three relievers to blank the Jays the rest of the way...walked a season-low one batter, while striking out six and working into the sixth inning for the first time since his season-opening start March 30 vs. Cleveland.

HARD TO HIT: With enough innings to qualify (currently 4.0 short), Odorizzi would rank third among American League starters with a .172 opponents batting average (10-for-58), first for opponents slugging percentage (.241), eighth with .304 strikeouts per batter faced (69 BFP, 21 SO) and 10th with 11.12 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (17.0 IP)...on the flip side, he would also have the second-highest rate for walks per batter faced (.145) and third-worst mark for walks per 9.0 innings (5.29).

SPECIAL K: With his career-high-tying, 11-strikeout performance March 30 vs. Cleveland, Odorizzi teamed with José Berríos (10 Ks on Opening Day against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.

AGAINST THE ASTROS: Odorizzi has enjoyed success against Houston, going 3-1, 2.12 ERA (29.2 IP, 7 ER) in five career appearances (all starts)...went 1-1, 5.06 ERA (10.2 IP, 6 ER) in two starts last season.

- Earned his first win in a Twins uniform April 10, 2018 vs. the Astros, allowing a run in 6.0 innings of a 4-1 victory at Target Field.
- Was knocked out in the fifth inning of an eventual 9-1 loss last Sept. 5 here at Minute Maid Park, surrendering five runs on four hits (including a pair of home runs).

HOMEBODY: Odorizzi's four 2019 starts have been split evenly between home and road...in two Target Field starts, he is 1-0, 1.54 ERA (11.2 IP, 2 ER), has walked three and struck out 17, while twice pitching into the sixth inning...by contrast, he has worked a total of 5.1 innings in two road starts, going 0-2, 11.81 ERA (7 ER) with seven walks and four strikeouts.

- In his Twins career (since 2018), Odorizzi is 6-4, 4.29 ERA (44 ER, 92.1 IP) with 33 walks and 98 strikeouts in 18 home starts (Minnesota is 11-7 in those games)...in 18 road starts, he is 2-8, 4.75 ERA (89.0 IP, 47 ER) with 47 walks and 85 strikeouts (the Twins are 5-13).
- For his career (Tampa Bay and Minnesota), Odorizzi is 27-25, 3.57 ERA (476.2 IP, 189 ER) at home and 21-25, 4.43 ERA (410.0 IP, 202 ER) on the road.

DON'T LEAVE ME HANGING: Odorizzi is tied for the American League lead with 16 no-decisions since Opening Day 2018 (in 37 starts), matching the White Sox' Reynaldo López...only Arizona's Robbie Ray (20) and Washington's Patrick Corbin (18) have more in baseball during that span.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 156 starts since 2014 (teammate Kyle Gibson is fifth with 153)...he is also sixth in that span with a .235 opponents batting average.

- Only Corey Kluber (165), Rick Porcello (162) and Justin Verlander (158) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the last 5+ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.215), Kluber (.222), Verlander (.225), Marco Estrada (.234) and Carlos Carrasco (.234) are the five with lower opponent averages in that same span.

PITCH ARENAL: Odorizzi has opened 2019 by throwing his four-seam fastball at a greater rate than at any point in his career (62.7 percent)...his full-season high is 54.1 percent, which came in 2018 with the Twins...between 2014-18 with Tampa Bay, his fastball usage ranged from a high of 49.4 percent (2017) to a low of 31.1 (2016)...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitches according to Baseball Savant:

Ks FOR GOOD: Odorizzi will donate \$50 per strikeout in 2019 to the Animal Humane Society (\$750 to date). They take in every animal surrendered, regardless of its health, age, breed, or behavior and provide extensive medical treatment, behavior programs, compassionate care, and new homes for these cats, dogs and critters.

2018 RECAP:

- Twins 2018 Opening Day starter finished with 32 starts, matching Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos for the club lead...ranked third on the staff for innings pitched (164.1) and strikeouts (162).
- Finished with a strikeout-per-9.0 innings pitched ratio of 8.87, the second highest of career (9.32 - 2014).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP [SEASON: 2-1, 5.30 ERA ; CAREER: 42-42, 4.08 ERA]

Pineda makes his fifth start and appearance of the season in tomorrow night's game...is 2-1, 5.30 ERA (18.2 IP, 11 ER) through the first four outings of his comeback campaign...is coming off his first rough start of the season, allowing six runs on seven hits (two home runs) in just 3.2 innings of a 7-4 loss to Toronto last Thursday at Target Field...Twins had won his first three starts, while he was 2-0, 3.00 ERA (15.0 IP, 5 ER)...completed his comeback from 2017 "Tommy John" surgery with 4.0-shutout innings in his Twins debut March 31 vs. Cleveland, returning to a big league mound for the first time in 633 days...turned in his first quality start in 652 days April 13 against Detroit, allowing three runs over 6.0 innings of a 4-3 victory...is 3-3, 4.40 ERA (43.0 IP, 21 ER) in seven career starts against Houston, but is an impressive 2-1, 2.14 ERA (21.0 IP, 5 ER) in three outings at Minute Maid Park...last faced the Astros on June 30, 2017, pitching the Yankees to a 13-4 win here in Houston by allowing three runs (two earned) over 6.0 innings.

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
