THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-0 on their current six-game roadtrip, going 3-0 in Baltimore and 1-0 in Houston...tonight the Twins will play the second of three at Minute Maid Park...they will travel home late on Wednesday, enjoy an off-day on Thursday, then repeat their current week by hosting Baltimore over the weekend, followed by four against the Astros...the Twins have won five of their last six games overall.

BATS BLAST OFF IN HOUSTON: The Twins beat the Astros last night by a score of 9-5 at Minute Maid Park...Jake Odorizzi (2-2) was the starter and winner, allowing two runs on eight hits in 5.2 innings pitched...the offense recorded 12 hits and scored eight of their runs with two outs, going 4-for-8 with runners in scoring position...Jorge Polanco went 4-for-5 and matched his career high with four RBI...Marwin Gonzalez made his return to Houston, going 0-for-4 with a walk...Byron Buxton had his streak of successful stolen bases snapped at 33, getting thrown out in the eighth inning.

TWINS-'STROS: The Twins and Astros are playing the second of seven meetings this season...their next series will be at Target Field, starting a week from today, for four...the Twins are 28-30 all-time against the Astros, including a record of 17-21 since Houston joined the American League in 2013...they have won just four times in their last 16 meetings with the Astros.

☞ A win tonight would give the Twins their first series win over the Astros since taking two of three April 9-11, 2018 at Target Field...their last series win in Houston came August 11-13, 2014, taking two of three.

☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .377 (20-for-53) with a .393 OBP vs. Houston, hitting safely in 12 of 13 career games.

☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .360 (32-for-89) with six doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI and a .962 OPS in 22 career games vs. the Astros...hitting .340 (18-for-53) in 13 games at Minute Maid.

HIP HIP JORGE!: Jorge Polanco is hitting .434 (23-for-53) with four doubles, two triples, four home runs, nine RBI and a 1.295 OPS in his last 14 games...in fact, since September 5, 2018 he is hitting .357 (61-for-171) with a .413 on-base percentage and .986 OPS in 42 games - fifth best average in baseball since that date...below are his 2019 AL ranks:

BACKSTOPS: Catchers Willians Astudillo, Jason Castro and Mitch Garver have combined to hit .373 (25-for-67) with eight doubles, seven home runs, 16 RBI and 20 runs scored when catching...Jason Castro has made nine starts (has started for: Berríos - 4, Odorizzi - 3, Pineda - 1, Gibson - 1), Mitch Garver has made seven starts (has started for: Berríos - 1, Odorizzi - 2, Gibson - 2, Pérez - 2), and Willians Astudillo has made four starts (has started for: Pineda - 3, Gibson 1)...Castro has a catcher ERA of 3.75, Garver has a catcher ERA of 5.78 and Astudillo is at 3.69...where those three combined offensive numbers rank in baseball compared to other team's catchers: first in average (.373) and slugging percentage (.806), tied for first in home runs (7), second in OBP (.443) and OPS (1.249), tied for second in doubles (8) and tied for fourth in RBI (16).

LEFTY LOOSEY: Wade Miley is the first left-handed starter the Twins have faced this season...the last lefty starter the Twins faced was Carlos Rodón on September 29, 2018 vs. Chicago-AL in an 8-3 win...they went 21-25 against left-handed starters last season...this season they are hitting .284 (19-for-67) with five doubles, three home runs and a .368 on-base percentage against left-handed pitching.

MINNESOTA WINS: The Twins enter today with the second best winning percentage in baseball at .650, trailing only Tampa Bay (.652, 15-8)...their 13 wins through the first 20 games is tied for their third most in club history through 20, their best being 15 wins in 1972 and 2001.

BUCK DOUBLES DOWN: Byron Buxton has five doubles in his last five games...he has 12 doubles on the season, already just seven short of his career-high of 19, done in 2016...the 12 doubles lead all of baseball, next is Arizona's David Peralta with 11.

ROAD RULES: The Twins have gone 8-3 on the road this season for a winning percentage of .727, third best in baseball, trailing Seattle (.846, 11-2) and Tampa Bay (.778, 7-2)...individuals on the road this season: Mitch Garver is hitting .545 (12-for-22) with five home runs, Jonathan Schoop is hitting .359 (14-for-39) with four home runs, Jorge Polanco is hitting .395 (17-for-43) with five doubles, Nelson Cruz is hitting .346 (9-for-26), Max Kepler is hitting .333 (12-for-36) and Eddie Rosario is hitting .304 (14-for-46).

OH, CANADA: In his last time out, Pineda struggled at home against the Toronto Blue Jays last Thursday, allowing six runs on seven hits (two home runs) over just 3.2 innings and was handed a 7-4 loss...surrendered a first-inning home run to Randal Grichuk before settling down through the next 2.0 innings...had the wheels fall off in the fourth as a two-run home run to Justin Smoak got the Jays on the board before three more runs came across, bumping Pineda from the start...threw 75 pitches in the outing, 48 for strikes.

WALK HARD: Through four starts this season, "Big Mike" has only issued three free passes in 18.2 innings pitched...owns 703 career strikeouts against 160 walks, a lifetime SO/BB ratio of 4.39, sixth best among pitchers currently on a 25-man roster (min. 695.0 IP)...he hasn't issued more than three walks in a start since July 31, 2016 at Tampa Bay, a stretch of 32 starts, and is one of 13 pitchers with an active streak of 32+ starts and less than four walks (full list is below).

SETTING 'EM DOWN: In the third inning of his start on April 13, Pineda struck out Detroit's Christin Stewart to register the 700th strikeout of his big league career...among players currently on a 25-man roster, there are only four pitchers with 700+ strikeouts in less than 700.0 IP, and Pineda is one of only two to be a starting pitcher...the other three pitchers to have these numbers are Arizona's Robbie Ray (765 K in 637.2 IP), New York-AL's Aroldis Chapman (807 K in 485.2 IP) and Los Angeles-NL's Kenley Jansen (836 K in 559.0 IP).

AGAINST HOUSTON: Pineda brings a lifetime 3-3 record with a 4.40 ERA (43.0 IP, 21 ER) against the Houston Astros into this start...has not seen the 'Stros since before his "Tommy John" surgery, with his last appearance coming here on June 30, 2017 in a 13-4 blowout victory, as a member of the New York Yankees...threw 6.0 innings in that start, striking out three, while allowing three runs (two earned) on seven hits...has had success at Minute Maid Park, going 2-1 with a 2.14 ERA (21.0 IP, 5 ER) with 19 strikeouts and just two walks in three starts...current Twins teammate Marwin Gonzalez started as the leftfielder for Houston in Pineda's last start here, collecting two hits and an RBI before his groundout to end the sixth inning; the last out Pineda recorded on the night.

MARCH/APRIL FLOWERS: "Big Mike" owns a 15-8 record and a 3.68 ERA (156.2 IP, 64 ER) in the months of March and April, his second lowest of any month (September, 3.24), and his 160 strikeouts are the most of any month. In 2017, Pineda finished April 3-1 with a 3.14 ERA (28.2 IP, 10 ER), including a season-high 10 strikeout appearance on April 10.

THE REPERTOIRE: Pineda has relied on his big, high-velocity fastball throughout his eight-year big league career, as referenced by the 57.7 percent usage rate of his four-seamer this season...his slider is his favorite offspeed pitch, as he throws that 30.9 percent of the time...he'll also feature a changeup that fades away from a left-handed hitter...he uses that pitch 11.3 percent of the time...to right-handed hitters, Pineda favors his fastball/slider combo, throwing just five changeups to righties this season...that rate lines up with what Pineda has done throughout his career, as in 2017 he threw 207 changeups, 44 to left-handed batters...he has thrown 291 pitches this year, below is the breakdown of each pitch and its usage, according to Baseball Savant:

CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched.
- Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August.
- Currently has 703 strikeouts in 698.2 IP...is one of four pitchers on a 25-man roster to record 700+ strikeouts in less than 700.0 IP, and joins Robbie Ray (Arizona) as the only two starters.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
