THE TWINS: After completing their six-game roadtrip with a record of 4-2 (3-0 in Baltimore and 1-2 in Houston), the Twins began their homestand with consecutive wins over the Orioles...today they will play the three-game series finale vs. Baltimore...tomorrow night they will begin a four-game series with Houston through Thursday...the Twins have won six of their last eight games overall.

TWINS TAKE ANOTHER SERIES FROM O'S: The Twins beat the Orioles yesterday afternoon at Target Field by a score of 9-2, scoring eight of their runs from the sixth inning on...José Berríos (4-1) was the starter and winner, allowing two runs on seven hits in 6.0 innings with no walks and eight strikeouts...the offense recorded 10 hits, five being home runs from Max Kepler (5 \& 6), Jason Castro (2), C.J. Cron (5) and Marwin Gonzalez (2)...it marked the fourth time this season that the Twins have hit five-plus homers in a game.

TWINS AND BIRDS: The Twins are 11-1 vs. the Orioles dating back to last season...their last loss came on 2018 Opening Day as Adam Jones hit a walk-off homer off Fernando Rodney in the 11th inning...since that game, their 11-game winning streak is the longest active streak vs. any opponent...it's their longest ever vs. the Orioles for the Twins (see next note).玉 Since 2017, the Twins are 16-3 vs. the 0's...the Twins are $25-8$ vs. BAL in their last 33 , dating back to September 2014...in fact, since the start of 2014, no team outside the AL East has won more games vs. Baltimore than the Twins at 27-12.
क Max Kepler has hit safely in 15 of 16 career games against the Orioles, hitting . 417 ( 25 -for-60) with six doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 21 RBI, eight walks, a . 478 OBP and a 1.428 OPS...Kepler's eight homers are tied for his most vs. any opponent (also CLE) and his 25 hits are his most vs. any non-AL Central opponent.
Ф The Twins have now hit 21 home runs vs. the Orioles this season, their club record over the 0 's in a single season is 22 done in both 1962 and 1964... 21 homers mark the most for the Twins vs. a non-AL Central opponent since hitting 22 vs. Oakland in 1971...the most they have ever hit vs. one team in a season is 40 vs. Texas in 1963.
क Nelson Cruz is hitting . 455 (10-for-22) with two doubles, four home runs and six RBI against the Orioles this season...C.J. Cron is hitting . 467 (7-for-15) with three home runs vs. the 0's this season.

the 10-day injured list with a left hamstring strain, an injury he suffered yesterday afternoon running the bases...Astudillo has appeared in 16 games for the Twins this season, hitting . 327 ( 16 -for- 49 ) with four doubles, two home runs and seven RBI...the Twins have recalled outfielder Jake Cave from Triple-A Rochester to replace Astudillo on the 25-man roster...Cave, who was optioned after Wednesday night's game in Houston, has appeared in 12 games for the Twins this season, hitting . 233 (7-for-30) with one double, three RBI and four walks

WHOA NELLY!: Nelson Cruz is hitting . 341 (14-for-41) with three doubles, four home runs, nine RBI and a 1.107 OPS in his last 10 games... he ranks 83rd on baseball's all-time home runs list (365), one shy of Lance Berkman (366) and four short of Todd Helton and Ralph Kiner (369)...among designated hitters this season, he ranks second in batting average (.319), 0BP (.420), slugging (.609) and OPS (1.028).

YARD WORK: The Twins have hit 47 home runs so far through 24 games, the most in club history through their first 24...they hit their 47th home run last season on May 25 at Seattle, a Max Kepler solo shot off James Paxton in the club's 46th game...the Twins are on pace to hit 317 home runs, the club record of 225 , set in 1963...the MLB record is 267, done by New York-AL last season...the Twins rank fourth in baseball in home runs, despite playing in the fewest games...they lead baseball in at-bats-per-home run (17.51)

WINNESOTA: The Twins enter today with the second best winning percentage in baseball at .625, trailing only Tampa Bay (.654, 17-9)... their 15 wins through the first 24 games is their best start through 24 since going 15-9 in 2010...just six other Twins teams have won 15-plus in their first 24 ( 18 in 2001, 17 in 1979, 15 in 2005, 15 in 1977, 15 in 2004, and 15 in 2010).
TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Double-A Pensacola outfielder Jaylin Davis and Triple-A Rochester left-handed pitcher Lewis Thorpe have been named Twins minor league player and Pitcher of the Week...in six games for the Blue Wahoos, Davis hit . 407 (11-for-27) with three doubles, two home runs, six RBI and a 1.148 OPS...Davis, 24 , was drafted by the Twins in the 24th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Appalachian State University...Thorpe made one start for the Red Wings on Tuesday vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, allowing one run on three hits in 8.0 innings while striking out 12 batters for the second straight start...Thorpe, who was the Twins minor league Pitcher of the Year last season, was signed in 2012 out of Melbourne, Australia.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2010, Luke Hughes homered in his first major league at-bat off Max Scherzer in the third inning of an 11-6 loss...the Australian became the fifth Twin to accomplish the feat, but the first since Andre David in 1984...Eddie Rosario was the last Twin to do so, hitting the first pitch he saw in the big leagues on May 6, 2015 vs. Oakland at Target Field off Scott Kazmir.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his first win of the season after holding the Orioles to two runs on five hits with no walks and six strikeouts over a season-high 6.0 innings of work... marked his first Quality Start of the season.... has made 19 career starts in which he pitched 6.0 -plus innings and did not issue a walk; the Twins are 13-6 in those games.

- Before last Saturday, his last April win came on April 15, 2015...his 18 consecutive winless April starts fell one shy of the Major League record set by Matt Cain in 2012-17(MLB.com).

AGAINST THE ORIOLES: Gibson is making his 11th career start and second of the year against Baltimore...in 10 starts, is 5-2, 4.69 ERA ( 55.2 IP, 29 ER) with 28 walks and 51 strikeouts...last start against the Orioles was April 21 , earned the win after 6.0 innings of work with five walks and six strikeouts...last loss to Baltimore was July 9, 2017, allowed seven runs on nine hits and two walks with one strikeout over 4.0 innings.

- In 2018, Gibson owned a H/9 percentage of 2.77 against the Orioles...since 2013, (the year he debuted), it was the lowest individual rate among pitchers who threw at least 13.0 IP .

APRIL SHOWERS BRINGS MAY FLOWERS: Gibby owns a 6-11 record and a 5.32 ERA ( $142.0 \mathrm{IP}, 84 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in the months of March and April, his second highest of any month..his 93 strikeouts are the second least of any month ( 86 in May)...in 2018, however, Gibson ended March/April 1-1 with a 3.33 ERA ( 27.0 IP, 10 ER) and 14 walks.

- His 3.46 career ERA ( 117.0 IP, 45 ER ) in the month of May is his lowest of any month (April-5.56, June-3.86, July-4.58, August-5.49, September-4.04)...his 110 hits allowed and 40 walks are also the least of any month...in 2018, however, Gibson registered a 3.75 ERA ( 36.0 IP, 15 ER ) in May which was the third highest of any month.

GIBBY AT HOME: In his career, Gibson owns a 24-32 record at Target Field, 4.64 ERA (452.0 IP, 233 ER) with 157 walks and 342 strikeouts as opposed to 31 -29, 4.38 ERA (495.2 IP, 241 ER ) with 187 walks and 361 strikeouts on the road...looking for first win at home in 2019 campaign...last win at Target Field came September 29 vs. Chicago-AL, where he allowed just one run on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched.

- In 2018, he recorded a 3.67 ERA (83.1 IP, 34 ER) on his home turf, his lowest season ERA at Target Field since the 2015 season (3.55).

PITCH ARSENAL: Gibson's 36.5 percent usage rate of his sinker is the most he's thrown that pitch since 2015 where it was logged at 38.1 percent...in 2018, he threw it 34.5 percent of time, 35.4 percent in 2017 and 29.6 percent in 2016...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitches according to Baseball Savant:

LEFT AND RIGHT: He has held right-handed hitters to a 216 (8-for-37) average with zero home runs, five walks, nine strikeouts and a .310 OBP...conversely, lefties have hit .319 ( 15 -for- 47 ) with three homers, nine strikeouts and a .617 SLG in 2019...for his career, righties have hit 255 ( $459-$ for-1802) with 154 walks and 396 strikeouts, while lefties have hit .285 ( 531 -for-1865) with 190 walks and 307 strikeouts.

## 2018 RECAP:

- Led Twins in innings pitched (196.2), ERA (3.62), and quality starts (18), tied for first in starts (32), and ranked second in strikeouts (179)...set career bests in every category (matching previous high for starts), while also setting career standard for strikeouts-per-9.0 IP (8.19).
- Along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30 -plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).

THAT'S KYLE WITH A K: Gibson has improved his strikeouts-per-9.0 innings rate nearly every year in his career, peaking in 2018 by fanning 8.19 batters-per- 9.0 innings (196.2 IP, 179 S0).

- Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).

Odorizzi will be making his sixth appearance and start of the season tomorrow...he is 2-2, 4.37 ERA ( $22.2 \mathrm{IP}, 11 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 10 walks and 23 strikeouts in five appearances this season....he earned the win in his last start April 22 at Houston allowing two runs on eight hits with zero walks and two strikeouts in 5.2 innings pitched...he will be facing the Orioles for the 21 st time in his career... he was the winner in his last start vs. Baltimore July 8 , allowing zero runs on five hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings... Odorizzi has a career record of 6-4, 4.17 ERA ( $105.2 \mathrm{IP}, 49 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with 30 walks and 87 strikeouts in 20 games ( 19 starts) against the 0 's.
