THE TWINS: After beginning their 2019 season with a 2-1 series win over the Indians last weekend, the Twins began their first roadtrip with a two-game sweep of the Royals Tues-day-Wednesday...tonight the Twins will begin a three-game series with the Phillies over the weekend...they will continue the trip with an off-day in New York on Monday, then finish with two against the Mets Tuesday-Wednesday...the five days off in the first 15 days are the most in baseball.

TWINS SWEEP ROYALS: The Twins beat the Royals on Wednesday afternoon by a score of 7-6, scoring three runs in the final two innings...Kyle Gibson made his season debut, allowing six runs ( 5 earned) on eight hits in 4.2 innings pitched...Adalberto Mejía, Trevor May and Blake Parker combined to 4.1 innings of scoreless relief with one hit allowed...the offense recorded 11 hits...Willians Astudillo and Mitch Garver each had three hits and Eddie Rosario hit his 100 th career double in the second inning.
INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins went 8-12 in Interleague Play last season, going 3-1 vs. Pittsburgh, $1-2$ vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. St. Louis, $1-5$ vs. Milwaukee and $0-3$ at Chicago... their 12 losses were tied for their most since IL Play began in 1997 ( $8-12$ in 2015, 8-12 in 2013 and 8-12 in 2016).
$\Phi$ Eddie Rosario is hitting .333 (35-for-105) with 10 doubles, five home runs and 13 RB in his last 25 games vs. NL opponents...he has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 IL games. $\Phi$ Jorge Polanco is hitting .343 ( 34 -for- 99 ) in 30 career games against NL opponents, including a 426 ( 23 -for-54) average in the last 14.

$\Phi$ Jason Castro is hitting . 346 (9-for-26) with three doubles and five walks in eight career games vs. Philly.
$\Phi$ Marwin Gonzalez has hit safely in all eight career games vs. Philly, hitting . 308 (8-for-26).
LIVE IN FRONT OF ASTUDILLO AUDIENCE!: Willians Astudillo was originally signed by Philadelphia as a minor league free agent on December 15, 2008 and spent six seasons in the Phillies minor league system, getting as high as Single-A Clearwater...in 2014 with Single-A Lakewood he was named both South Atlantic League Midseason and Postseason All-Star...in 2015 with Clearwater he hit . 314 (121-for-385), winning the Florida State League batting title; he struck out just 10 times in 418 plate appearances.
क Among players with at least 10 plate appearances, he ranks second to Bryce Harper (.652) in on-base percentage at .636; also in OPS (Harper - 1.840 / Astudillo - 1.636).
玉 His career .382 batting average ( 39 -for-102) is the highest in major league history (min. 100 at-bats).
HOT START: The Twins enter today with a record of 4-1; last time they started 4-1 was in 2017... it marks the 14th time in club history to start with four wins in five games...the best Twins club through five was in 1968, starting 5-0...they last started 5-1 in 2017 and have started a season with five-plus wins six games just seven times in their history (1961, '65, '68, '87, '02, ' 10 \& ' 17 ).
$\Phi$ Entering today the Twins rank fifth in baseball in OBP (.358), sixth in batting average (.265), and ninth in OPS (.755).
$\Phi$ Dating back to September 16, 2018, the Twins have gone 15-4, tied with Los Angeles-NL for second most wins in baseball since that date and trailing Milwaukee (17-4).
DO YOU SMELL WHAT THE ROC' IS COOKIN'?: Rocco Baldelli became the 14th manager of the Twins on October 25 after spending parts of six years with the Tampa Bay Rays as a player and splitting eight seasons between their front office and coaching staff, most recently as their Major League Field Coordinator....he is the first managerial hire for the Twins outside the organization since Ray Miller in 1985, who was a coach with the Orioles prior....at 37 years, six months, Baldelli is the youngest manager in baseball....he is roughly 15 months younger than Nelson Cruz.

ARMS RACE: Through five games, Twins pitchers have struck out 51 batters in 46.0 innings pitched....in all of baseball, they rank tied for first in fewest hits allowed (31), fourth in opponent batting average (.190) and WHIP (0.98), ninth in strikeouts-per-9.0 IP (9.98).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2014, Ron Gardenhire earned his 1,000 th career managerial victory with a $7-3$ win at Cleveland, managing his 1,950 th career game...Gardy is second on the Twins all-time list for managerial victories with 1,068 , trailing Tom Kelly's 1,140

STARTING STRONG: Odorizzi had a fantastic 2019 debut, matching his career high with 11 strikeouts over 6.0 innings last Saturday vs. Cleveland...allowed just a single hit and run (a fourth-inning solo homer by Hanley Ramírez), while walking two...did not factor in the decision, departing with the score tied 1-1 (the Indians scored in the ninth for a 2-1 win)...the 11 ks marked Odorizzi's fifth career double-digit strikeout effort and equalled his career-best output from 5/9/14 (also against Cleveland, with Tampa Bay).

SPECIAL K: With his 11 -strikeout performance, Odorizzi teamed with José Berríos (10 Ks on Opening Day) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.

DON'T LEAVE ME HANGING: After tying for the lead among American League starters in 2018 with 15 no-decisions (tied for third-most in the majors), Odorizzi did not factor in the decision for his first start of the 2019 campaign...he now has 16 no-decisions in 33 Twins starts (48.5\%).

- Odorizzi's 15 no-decisions in 2018 matched the White Sox' Reynaldo Lopez for most in the AL...only Arizona's Robbie Ray and Colorado's Tyler Anderson (both with 16) had more in all of baseball.

STAYING IN STRIDE: Odorizzi's first start of 2019 continued his solid finish of 2018....over his last four starts dating back to September 12, 2018, the right-hander is 2-0, 3.18 ERA (22.2 IP, 8 ER )...he has held opponents to a .152 batting average ( 12 -for- 79 ) and a .509 OPS.

AGAINST THE PHILLIES: Odorizzi is making just his second career start and appearance against Philadelphia... his Ione previous start also came here at Citizens Bank Park, on $7 / 22 / 15$ as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays....worked the first 5.0 innings (5H-2R-2ER$2 B B-5 S 0$ ), leaving with a $3-2$ lead...Philly rallied to win, $5-4$ in 10 innings

- Hitting . 095 (2-for-21) in career at the plate, last hit coming $8 / 25 / 17$ at STL off Wacha.

LOOKING TO REVERSE 2018 TRENDS: Tonight's outing marks Odorizzi's first of 2019 on the road and under the lights, two areas he struggled last season....he posted a 5.22 ERA ( 101.2 IP, 59 ER ) and .262 opponents batting average in 20 night starts last season, as opposed to a 3.30 ERA ( 62.2 IP, 23 ER) and .206 average against (12th-best in the AL) during 12 day game outings...he was also just 2-6 in 16 road starts, despite posting a better ERA ( 4.30 to 4.69 ) and opponents average ( .225 to .258 ) than in his 16 home starts.

## 2018 RECAP:

- Twins 2018 Opening Day starter finished with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Ranked tied for first on Twins staff in starts (32), and third in innings pitched (164.1) and strikeouts (162).
- Finished with a strikeout-per-9.0 innings pitched ratio of 8.87 , the second highest of career (9.32-2014).

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30 -plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30). - Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career. - Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest - on May 29,20 bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win in his season debut on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.

QUALITY NOT QUANTITY: Over his 32 starts in 2018, Odorizzi averaged just over 5.1 innings/start...of starters with at least 30 starts, his 164.1 innings ranked as the fewest in the American League...his 18.7 pitches/inning and 4.33 pitches/batter faced both ranked as the highest in baseball...however, his 82 earned runs allowed ranked tied-13th fewest in the American League among those with 30+ starts.

- His start on August 24, 2018 snapped his MLB record stretch of 26 games started without recording an out in the 7th inning.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30 -start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 153 starts since 2014...he is also sixth in that span with a .235 opponents batting average.

- Only Corey Kluber (162), Rick Porcello (159) and Justin Verlander (155) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the last 5+ seasons.


## TOMDRROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP [SEASDN: D-D, D.OD ERA ; CAREER: 40-प1, प.03 ERA]

Pineda makes his second start of the season in tomorrow afternoon's game...made his Twins debut in a start last Sunday vs. Cleveland, returning to a major league mound for the first time in 633 days (since July 5, 2007 at Toronto, with the New York Yankees)...completed his comeback from 2017 "Tommy John" surgery with 4.0-shutout innings in the Twins 9-3 win over the Indians, allowing just two baserunners (a single and a walk) with five strikeouts...was removed after 40 pitches and replaced by Martín Pérez in a predetermined change...will make his third career start and appearance against Philadelphia, but his first at Citizens Bank Park...faced the Phillies on June 17, 2011 (with Seattle) and June 22 , 2015 (with the Yankees), going 1-1, 8.68 ERA (9.1 IP, 9 ER)....owns a career 40-41 record with a 4.03 ERA in 118 career major league appearances (all starts)...has 692 strikeouts in 684.0 innings pitched...originally signed with the Twins as a free agent December 13, 2017, missing the entire 2018 season while recovering from "Tommy John" surgery.

Has never faced the Phillies...made his major league debut last Sunday afternoon in the 9-3 victory over Cleveland...sandwiched two walks between a ground out and a pop out, before fanning Max Moroff for his first ML strikeout, ending the game and securing the series victory. with his appearance last Sunday, he became the sixth-oldest player (second-oldest pitcher) to make his major league debut for the Twins (since 1961) at 30 years and four days old....nly INF Minnie Mendoza (debuted on 4/9/1970, 36.144 years old), C Hank Izquierdo (8/9/1967 36.142), C Chris Heintz ( $9 / 10 / 2005,31.035$ ), INF Randy Ruiz ( $8 / 1 / 2008,30.287$ ) and RHP Yohan Pino ( $6 / 19 / 2014,30.174$ ) were older. Began 2018 with Double-A Chattanooga; split first month w/ the Lookouts and Triple-A Rochester, making 4 appearances at each spot. Posted a 2.34 ERA (34.2 IP, 9 ER) with 4 saves in 20 games from early May-late July at Chattanooga, before being promoted back to Rochester where he finished the season...named Southern League Midseason All-Star with Lookouts.
Combined to go 1-5, ( $65.0 \mathrm{IP}, 26 \mathrm{ER}$ ) with $10 \mathrm{BB}, 86 \mathrm{~K}$ 's and 6 saves in 38 games between Chattanooga and Rochester.
