THE TWINS: The Twins began their first roadtrip of the season with two wins in two games over the Royals, followed by a loss to the Phillies last night...today the Twins will play the second of three in Philly...following tomorrow's series finale, the Twins will continue the trip with an off-day in New York on Monday, then finish with two against the Mets on Tuesday and Wednesday.

TWINS PHLOP IN PHILLY: The Twins lost to the Phillies last night by a score 10-4...Jake Odorizzi ( $0-1$ ) was the starter and loser, allowing five runs (4 earned) on two hits and three walks, marking the shortest start of his career...the offense recorded 11 hits, five coming from Jorge Polanco, who became the 55th player in club history with five-plus hits in one game, and the 11th to hit for the cycle.... list of Twins all-time cycles:


INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins began their IL season with a loss to the Phillies last night... they are just 3-10 in their last 13 vs. National League opponents...they still rank eighth in baseball all-time in wins in IL play (211).

$\Phi$ Eddie Rosario is hitting. 327 ( 36 -for- 110 ) with 10 doubles, five home runs and 13 RBI in his last 26 games vs. NL opponents... he has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 IL games.
$\Phi$ Jorge Polanco is hitting . 375 (39-for-104) in 31 career games against NL opponents, including a .475 ( 28 -for- 59 ) average in the last 15 ... he has hit safely in 14 of those last 15 .
$\Phi$ C.J. Cron is hitting . 323 ( 50 -for-155) and a .979 OPS in 59 career IL games.
$\Phi$ Nelson Cruz has the fourth most IL home runs among actives with 45, trailing Albert Pujols (63), Miguel Cabrera (54) and Edwin Encarnacion (51).

TWINS AND PHILLY: The Twins are playing the Phillies for the 20th time in their history today...they are 10-9 all-time against Philadelphia, going 2-1 at Veterans Stadium in 2002, 1-2 at the Metrodome in 2004, 2-2 at Citizens Bank Park in 2010 \& ' 19 , and 5-4 at Target Field in 2012, ' 13 and ' $16 \ldots$..they are 7-4 against Philly dating back to June ' $19,2010$.
$\Phi$ Jason Castro is hitting .321 ( 9 -for-28) with three doubles and five walks in nine career games vs. Philly.
LIVE IN FRONT OF ASTUDILLO AUDIENCE!: Willians Astudillo was originally signed by Philadelphia as a minor league free agent on December 15, 2008 and spent six seasons in the Phillies minor league system, getting as high as Single-A Clearwater...in 2014 with Single-A Lakewood he was named both South Atlantic League Midseason and Postseason All-Star...in 2015 with Clearwater he hit . 314 (121-for-385), winning the Florida State League batting title; he struck out just 10 times in 418 plate appearances.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: The Twins have double-digit hit totals in each of their last four and a total of 49 hits in those...during that span, they are hitting .331 ( 49 -for-148) with 15 doubles, one triple, three home runs, 25 runs and a .909 OPS...since Sunday, only three other teams have more hits than the Twins: Arizona (67), Chicago-NL (56), and Boston (51).
PITCHERS WITH THE STICKS: Last season Twins pitchers went 2-for-19 (excluding Chris Gimenez 1 -for-1 and Ryan LaMarre 0 -for-1 in the pitchers spot)...Kyle Gibson had both of the Twins' pitchers hits, singling twice on July 2 at Milwaukee...the last Twins pitcher with an extra-base hit was Ervin Santana, doubling off Matt Moore on June 9, 2017 at San Francisco.
PINCH ME: Twins pinch hitters hit . 172 ( 16 -for-93) with one home run, 11 RBI and seven walks last season...last season, the Twins best pinch hitter was Mitch Garver, who went 4 -for-10 with two doubles, three RBI and two walks.
ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1982, the largest crowd ever to see a baseball game in Minnesota, 52,279, turns out for the inaugural game at the brand-new Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome...Twins rookie Gary Gaetti has four hits, including a pair of home runs, but the visiting Seattle Mariners win, 11-7.

HAPPY BERT DAY: Hall of Famer Bert Blyleven turns 68 today...Bert shares a birthday with actor Paul Rudd (49), The Walking Dead star Michael Rooker (63), actor Zach Braff (43), and actress Candace Cameron (42), who played D.J. Tanner in Dan Gladden's favorite TV show "Full House."

WELCOME BACK, BIG MIKE: Pineda completed his big league comeback with a masterful 4.0-shutout inning performance against the Cleveland Indians on Sunday at Target Field... he opened the game with a pair of strikeouts and a flyout in the first before a Carlos Santana leadoff single was wiped away by a head's-up play by Willians Astudillo in the second, backing up an errant throw...set down seven of the next eight, including a double play that erased his lone walk of the day....marked the first time that the big righty had stepped on a major league mound in the regular season since July 5, 2017, a span of 633 days.

SETTING 'EM DOWN: Pineda has struck out 692 batters since 2011, but has only thrown 684.0 innings, in part due to injuries... he is one of thirteen pitchers in history to record at least 692 strikeouts in 684.0 innings or less (currently tied with José Valverde for 12th most strikeouts), and is one of only three pitchers in that group to be primarily a starting pitcher (Mark Prior: 2002-06 and Robbie Ray: 2014-present).

AGAINST PHILADELPHIA: Pineda is making his third career start against Philadelphia, and his first since an 11-8 loss on June 22, 2015, when he allowed eight runs on 11 hits in 3.1 IP as a member of the New York Yankees...five current Phillies (M. Franco, C. Hernández, 0. Herrera, H. Neris and A. Nola) were on the 2015 roster during Pineda's start...yielded three hits, one HR to Franco in that appearance.

GRAB A BAT: Pineda has spent his entire career playing in the American League (2011 w/ SEA, 2012-2017 w/NYY), but has pitched against National League opponents 14 times... has fared well in his Interleague starts, boasting a record of 7-3 and a sparkling 2.95 ERA (82.1 IP, 27 ER) with eight of those earned runs coming in his last start against the Phillies on June 22, 2015...with a bat in his hand, Pineda is 2 -for-11 (.182) with a sacrifice...his last hit came in his last at-bat, May 5, 2017 at Chicago-NL.

SPRING RECAP: Pineda completed his eighth spring training in 2019, the second with the Twins, after spending 2010-11 with Seattle, 2012-17 with New York-AL....he was in spring training with the Twins in 2018 but did not appear as he recovered from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow...tied for the team lead with 20.1 innings pitched, allowing nine runs (eight earned) while striking out a club-high 20 batters...finished the spring on a high note, striking out seven over 5.0 innings on March 26 against Colorado.

- Made fifth career Opening Day roster (four with New York-AL: 2014-17 and one with Seattle: 2011).
- Started in Yankees Home Opener April 10 vs. Tampa Bay, retired the game's first 20 batters, before his perfect game was spoiled by Evan Longoria's two-out double in the seventh....was the first major league pitcher to take a perfect game into the seventh inning of his team's home opener since Houston's J.R. Richard (perfect through 6.1 IP) April 10, 1980 vs. Los Angeles-NL (Elias).
- Recorded second career hit May 5 at Chicago-NL, singling off Kyle Hendricks.
- Placed on 10-day injured list July 14 with a right UCL injury...transferred to 60-day injured list July 16, missing the remainder of the season...underwent "Tommy John" surgery July 18 .
- Spent entire 2018 season on injured list while he recovered from the surgery.
- Began a rehab assignment in August, but was shut down due to right knee discomfort he suffered throwing a bullpen later in the month.

## CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched. - Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August - Currently has 684.0 IP and 692 strikeouts...is one of 13 pitchers in major league history to have at least 692 strikeouts in 684.0 innings pitched or less, and is one of only three pitchers in that group to be primarily a starter (Mark Prior: 2002-06 and Robbie Ray: 2014-present). - Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA ( 113.0 IP , 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of . 198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
