THE TWINS: The Twins bounced back yesterday with a 6-2 victory in Philadelphia to even the series at one win apiece, and look to win their second consecutive rubber match (and third consecutive series), after claiming the Opening Series against Cleveland with a 9-3 win March 31...following today's matchup, the team will enjoy an off-day tomorrow in New York before a quick two-game set Tuesday and Wednesday against the Mets concludes this three-city, 11-day roadtrip.

PHIGHTING BACK: After a sloppy defeat opened this three-game set on a down-note, the Twins rallied back yesterday for a win to even the series...after a pair of quick innings, Byron Buxton used his legs to manufacture the team's first run with a swipe of second, his 31st consecutive SB without a CS, before a wild pitch two later allowed him to scamper home... Max Kepler and Willians "La Tortuga" Astudillo launched back-to-back home runs in the third to cap-off the three run inning, but it was Eddie Rosario's pinch-hit, three-run, ninth-inning off the rightfield foul pole that iced the Twins' 6-2 victory...Michael Pineda spun 5.0 two-run innings, and four 'pen arms combined to allow three hits and no runs in the win.

ROS(I)ES ARE RED (AND BLUE): Eddie Rosario connected for a pinch-hit three-run home run in the 9th inning yesterday, extending the lead to four as the Twins evened the series at one...marked his eighth career home run in the ninth inning or later, after cracking four such longballs last season...only Nelson Cruz (34) and Jonathan Schoop (12) have more among current Twins...was Twins' first pinch-hit homer since Joe Mauer on Aug. 17, 2018.

POLANCO JOINS ELITE COMPANY: Jorge Polanco made history Friday night as he recorded the Twins' 11th cycle, the first since Michael Cuddyer on May 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee...the shortstop, who signed an extension to remain with the club through 2023 (with options for 2024 and '25), needed just four hits to accomplish the feat, but collected an extra single in the ninth for good measure.

- The Became 55th player in Major League history to record a cycle with 5+ hits, and first since
- Milwaukee's Christian Yelich, who collected six hits for his cycle, on August 29 of last year.

 ♣ Also became the 55th player in Twins history to notch 5+ hits in a game, with Logan Forsythe being the last to do so on August 16 of last season.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Twins went 8-12 in Interleague Play last season, going 3-1 vs. Pittsburgh, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. St. Louis, 1-5 vs. Milwaukee and 0-3 at Chicago... their 12 losses were tied for their most since IL Play began in 1997 (8-12 in 2015, 8-12 in 2013 and 8-12 in 2016)...they are 212-192 all-time in IL play.

₱ Eddie Rosario is hitting .320 (33-for-130) with eight doubles, six home runs and 16 RBI in his last 25 games vs. NL opponents...he has hit safely in 16 of his last 17 IL games.

© Jorge Polanco is hitting .367 (40-for-109) in 32 career games against NL teams with a .453 (29-for-64) AVG and 15 RBI in the last 14. © C.J. Cron is hitting .323 (51-for-158) and a .977 OPS in 60 career IL games.

© Nelson Cruz has the fourth most IL home runs among players currently on a 25-man roster with 45, trailing Albert Pujols (63), Miguel

TWINS AND PHILLY: The Twins are playing the Phillies for the 21st time in their history...they are 11-9 all-time against Philadelphia, going 2-1 at Veterans Stadium in 2002, 1-2 at the Metrodome in 2004, 3-2 at Citizens Bank Park in 2010 and '19, and 5-4 at Target Field (2012, '13 and '16)...they are 8-5 against Philly dating back to June 19, 2010.

- The Twins and Phillies met twice in spring training as the Twins took the first game in Clearwater by a score of 4-2 February 27 and
- tied at 3-3 in a split squad game at Hammond Stadium on March 3.

 Jason Castro is hitting .321 (9-for-28) with three doubles and five walks in nine career games vs. Philly.

LIVE IN FRONT OF ASTUDILLO AUDIENCE!: Williams Astudillo was originally signed by Philadelphia as a minor league free agent on December 15, 2008 and spent six seasons in the Phillies minor league system, getting as high as Single-A Clearwater...in 2014 with Single-A Lakewood he was named both South Atlantic League Midseason and Postseason All-Star...in 2015 with Clearwater he hit .314

(121-for-385), winning the Florida State League batting title; he struck out just 10 times in 418 plate appearances.

₱ His career .374 batting average (40-for-107) is the highest in major league history (min. 100 at-bats).

LAST START: Berríos did not factor into the decision at Kansas City on April 2...went 7.0 innings and allowed three runs on seven hits with four strikeouts...gave up his first home run of the season, a solo shot in the sixth (O'Hearn)...recorded at least 7.0 innings for the third straight start dating back to 2018, matching the longest such stretch of his career (May 15-27, 2018)... Mondesi's RBI single in the first inning snapped Berríos' scoreless-innings streak at 11.2 dating back to the fourth inning of his final start of 2018 (Sept. 28 vs. Chicago).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: In 11 career Interleague starts and appearances, Berríos owns a 4-6 record, 3.88 ERA (60.1 IP, 26 ER) with 23 walks, 56 strikeouts and has held batters to a .217 average... went 1-3, 6.04 ERA (25.1 IP, 17 ER) in Interleague Play last season...making his first career start and appearance against the Phillies...is 0-1 against NL East opponents, 4.50 ERA (4.0 IP, 2 ER).
