THE TWINS: The Twins bounced back yesterday with a 6-2 victory in Philadelphia to even the series at one win apiece, and look to win their second consecutive rubber match (and win March 31...following today's matchup, the team will enjoy an off-day tomorrow in New York before a quick two-game set Tuesday and Wednesday against the Mets concludes this three-city, 11-day roadtrip.

POLANCO JOINS ELITE COMPANY: Jorge Polanco made history Friday night as he recorded the Twins' 11th cycle, the first since Michael Cuddyer on May 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee...the shortstop, who signed an extension to remain with the club through 2023 (with options for 2024 and '25), needed just four hits to accomplish the feat, but collected an extra single
