**THE TWINS:** The Twins dropped their first series of the season at the Philadelphia Phillies this past weekend (1-2) after sweeping a brief two-game set in Kansas City and winning the opening series against Cleveland 2-1...tonight the Twins begin another quick two-game series, this time in New York against the Mets, with the series finale tomorrow night preceding an off-day Thursday in Minneapolis...the team ushers in the Detroit Tigers for three games this weekend and the Toronto Blue Jays for their annual trip to Minnesota - a four-game tilt Monday through Thursday.

**THE 'O' PHELL PHLAT:** The Twins lost the rubber game in Philly 2-1, despite 6.0 two-hit innings from starting pitcher José Berríos...jumped out ahead early behind a Max Kepler leadoff home run, the first of his career and first of the season for the Twins, but that proved to be the only run the Twins could muster off starter Zach Eflin...Berríos kept the Phillies off the board for 5.2 innings before Rhys Hoskins flipped a change-up over the left-centerfield fence for a two-run shot, ultimately deciding the game in Philadelphia's favor...the Twins come into Citi Field tonight 7-11 against the Mets all-time, and are here for the first time since 2016, when they lost all three games by a combined five runs.

**YES WAY, JOSÉ!** Twins starter José Berríos took the loss on Sunday after allowing two earned runs in 6.0 IP...has allowed three earned runs or less in each of his first three starts this year, becoming just the sixth Twins pitcher (seventh instance) to record three starts with three-or-less earned runs in the Twins' first eight games of the year, joining Brad Radke (1996), Bert Blyleven (1974 & '72), Jim Perry (1970), Jim Kaat (1965), and Mudcat Grant (1966).

**ROS(IES) ARE RED (AND BLUE):** Eddie Rosario connected for a three-run home run in the 9th inning Saturday, extending the lead to four as the Twins evened the series at one...marked his eighth career home run in the ninth inning or later, after cracking four such longballs last season...only Nelson Cruz (34) and Jonathan Schoop (12) have more among current Twins.

**ONE IS THE LONELIEST NUMBER:** On Saturday, the Twins offense only recorded one strikeout against the Phillies pitching staff (a Mitch Garver pinch-hit strikeout looking in the 7th)...Saturday's affair marked just the 11th time since 2010 that the Twins went an entire game with one or less strikeouts, and just the second time since 2015 (also: August 10, 2018 at DET)...the last time the Twins didn't record a strikeout in a game was May 15, 2012 vs. CLE.

**POLANCO JOINS ELITE COMPANY:** Jorge Polanco made history Friday night as he recorded the Twins' 11th cycle, the first since Michael Cuddyer on May 22, 2009 vs. Milwaukee...the shortstop, who signed an extension to remain with the club through 2023 (with options for 2024 and '25), needed just four hits to accomplish the feat, but collected an extra single in the ninth for good measure.  
☞ Became 55th player in Major League history to record a cycle with 5+ hits, and first since Milwaukee's Christian Yelich, who collected six hits for his cycle on August 29 of last year.  
☞ Also became the 55th player in Twins history to notch 5+ hits in a game, with Logan Forsythe being the last to do so on August 16 of last season.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The Twins went 8-12 in Interleague Play last season, going 3-1 vs. Pittsburgh, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. St. Louis, 1-5 vs. Milwaukee and 0-3 at Chicago...their 12 losses were tied for their most since IL Play began in 1997 (8-12 in 2015, 8-12 in 2013 and 8-12 in 2016)...they are 212-193 all-time in IL play.  
☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .318 (34-for-107) with eight doubles, six home runs and 16 RBI in his last 26 games vs. NL opponents... he has hit safely in 18 of his last 20 IL games.  
☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .364 (40-for-110) in 33 career games against NL teams, with a .397 (23-for-58) AVG and 12 RBI in the last 15.  
☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .315 (51-for-162) with a .954 OPS in 61 career Interleague games.  
☞ Nelson Cruz has the fourth most IL home runs among players currently on a 25-man roster with 45, trailing Albert Pujols (63), Miguel Cabrera (54) and Edwin Encarnación (51).

**HOT WHEELS:** Byron Buxton stole his 31st consecutive base Saturday, extending the club record...Buxton is now 47-for-his-last-50 (94.0%)...below are the longest successful stolen base streaks in Twins history:

**NOTE:** The all-time American League record is held by Ichiro Suzuki (45) from April 29, 2006-May 16, 2007...the all-time National League/MLB record is held by Vince Coleman (50) from September 18, 1988-July 26, 1989.

**TWINS AND THE METS:** The Twins are playing the Mets for the 19th time in their history...they are 7-11 all-time against New York-NL, going 1-2 at Shea Stadium in 2002, 2-1 at the Metrodome in 2004, 2-1 at the Metrodome in 2007, 1-2 at Citi Field in 2010, 0-3 at Target Field in 2013 and 0-3 here at Citi Field in the teams' last matchup in Sept. 2016...are currently riding a seven-game losing streak against the Mets, dating back to June 27, 2010, after starting their Interleague history 7-4 from June 18, 2002-June 26, 2010.

**FIRST OUTING:** In his first start of the 2019 campaign, Gibson yielded six runs (five earned) on eight hits over 4.2 IP at Kansas City...the no-decision marked his first since July 2, 2018, snapping a streak of 15 consecutive starts in which he earned a decision... it was the longest such streak by a Twins pitcher since Phil Hughes took a decision in 18 straight starts from June 1-Sept. 1, 2014.

- The last time Gibby allowed more than five runs and struck out 2 or less batters was July 9, 2017 vs. Baltimore (4.0 IP, 9 H, 7 R, 7 ER, 2 BB, 1 K, 1 HR).

**AGAINST THE NL EAST:** Gibson is 1-3 all-time against National League East opponents...owns a 7.09 ERA (26.2 IP, 21 ER) with 11 walks and 18 strikeouts...this will be his third career start against the Mets and his second at Citi Field...suffered the loss in his last appearance here September 18, 2016 at New York-NL, allowing three runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings with four walks and two strikeouts.

**AT THE PLATE:** With a bat in his hand, Gibson is 4-for-18 (.222) in his career...in his last Interleague start on July 2, 2018 at Milwaukee, he went 2-for-2 with two singles...the last Twins pitcher to record two hits in a game was Tommy Milone on April 20, 2016 at Milwaukee, going 2-for-2 with two singles.

**SPRING RECAP:** Gibson participated in his seventh career spring training with the Twins in 2019...made three appearances (3 starts), going 0-1, 5.87 ERA (7.2 IP, 5 ER) with three walks and nine strikeouts...was limited due to his recovery from a bout with E. coli.

**2018 RECAP:**

- Led Twins in innings pitched (196.2), ERA (3.62), and quality starts (18), tied for first in starts (32), and ranked second in strikeouts (179)...set career bests in every category (matching previous high for starts), while also setting career standard for strikeouts-per-9.0 IP (8.19).
- Along with José Berrios (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Set single-game career-high with 10 strikeouts April 26 at New York-AL.
- Ranked tied for second in the AL in opponent grounded into doubleplays (23).
- Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings pitched.
- Named 2018 Charles O. Johnson Award for Most Improved Twin, also Mike Augustin "Media Good Guy" award.

- Named 2018 Charles O. Johnson Award for Most Improved Twin, also Mike Augustin "Media Good Guy" award.
- Since the start of 2014 has induced 119 ground ball double plays, the most in baseball.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berrios (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
- Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
- Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
- In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.
- Earned the win in his MLB debut 6/29/13 vs. KC allowing three runs on eight hits in 6.0 innings.
