THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-1 on their current seven-game homestand, sweeping the Orioles over the weekend, followed by a win and a loss to the Astros the last two nights... tonight they will play the third of four with the Astros...after tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will travel to New York for three over the weekend vs. the Yankees, followed by three in Toronto Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won eight of their last 11 games overall.

BOY, THAT ESCALATED QUICKLY: The Twins lost to the Astros last night by a score of 11-0, suffering their first shutout of the season and largest margin of loss since losing 18-4 on September 2, 2018 at Texas...Michael Pineda (2-2) was the starter and winner, allowing five runs on nine hits in 5.0 innings pitched...the offense was held hit-less by Gerrit Cole through 5.1 innings until a Max Kepler double...Kepler added another single as the Twins totaled three hits.

ADDITIONAL MARCH/APRIL NOTES: Byron Buxton ranked fourth in baseball in doubles (12) and finished with the second most in club history for "the month" (Torii Hunter, 13 in 2007)...Eddie Rosario ranked third in baseball in home runs (11) and finished with the most in club history...Mitch Garver finished with third best slugging percentage in club history at .761...José Berríos finished with the third most strikeouts in club history with 41.

TWINS-ASTROS: The Twins and Astros are playing the sixth of seven games this season...the Twins are 29-33 all-time against the Astros, including a record of 18-24 since Houston joined the American League in 2013...they have won just five times in their last 20 meetings with the Astros.

☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .318 (21-for-66) with a .361 OBP vs. Houston, hitting safely in 13 of 17 career games.

☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .360 (36-for-100) with nine doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI and a .966 OPS in 25 career games vs. the Astros...the .360 average is his highest vs. any AL opponent...additionally, he is hitting .435 (20-for-46) in his last 11 vs. the Astros.

YARD WORK: The Twins have hit 50 home runs so far through 27 games, the second most in club history through their first 27 (51 in the first 27 of 1964)...they hit their 50th home run last season on May 30 at Kansas City in the club's 51st game...the Twins are on pace to hit 300 home runs, the club record is 225, set in 1963...the MLB record is 267, done by New York-AL last season...the Twins rank tied for fourth in baseball in home runs, despite playing in the second fewest games...they rank second in baseball to Milwaukee (17.91) in at-bats-per-home run (18.14).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2005, Johan Santana ended his 17-game winning streak in the Twins 2-1 loss to the Los Angeles Angels...Santana struck out seven in 8.0 innings and allowed just two hits, both solo home runs by Vladimir Guerrero and Jose Molina...the win-streak started July 17, 2014 and spanned 20 starts.

REMARKABLE FROM INSIDE EDGE:

☞ Martín Pérez has not allowed a hit on a cutter to any of the last 20 batters he's faced after reaching two strikes. -- tied with Anibal Sanchez for the longest active streak.

☞ Twins hitters have 112 Extra-Base hits out of 233 total hits (48.1%) this season -- best in MLB; League Avg. 38.5%

☞ Jorge Polanco is batting .422 (27-for-64) with the bases empty this season -- 2nd best in MLB; League Avg. .252

☞ Twins hitters have pulled 23 home runs to right field this season -- tied for most in MLB.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitless in his last 17 AB's dating back to April 26th -- Mikie Mahtook has the longest active streak at 31.

WINNER WINNER, CHICKEN DINNER: Pérez enters tonight's start after receiving his second consecutive win of the season as a starter (also won on March 31 vs. CLE in relief)...

- Made three relief appearances prior, pitching to a 7.56 ERA (8.2 IP, 7 ER) on 11 hits, nine walks and 12 strikeouts...recorded the win in relief March 31 vs. CLE (his Twins debut) after allowing three runs over 3.2 IP in relief of starter Michael Pineda in a pre-arranged outing for the duo.

AGAINST THE 'STROS: The Venezuelan lefty is making his first start against the O's this season, and first since August 29, 2017...in 11 starts against Houston, he owns a 6-4 record with a 3.00 ERA (72.0 IP, 24 ER)...

HOME COOKING: Is 2-0, 2.87 ERA (15.2 IP, 5 ER) with five walks and 15 strikeouts in three home starts this season...his last home loss came April 22, 2018 vs. Seattle at Globe Life Park in Arlington.

CABALLO ZURDO: Pérez has thrown 495.1 innings since 2016, sixth-most among left-handed pitchers in the American League...below is a list of AL lefties with 475.0+ IP since 2016:

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS, RHP [SEASON: 4-1, 2.97 ERA ; CAREER: 33-27, 4.34 ERA]

Berrios takes the ball in the final game of the series tomorrow afternoon against Houston...earned the win in the series finale last Sunday against the Orioles, clinching the series sweep, after yielding just two runs over 6.0 IP with eight strikeouts...

CAREER NOTES

- His 495.1 innings since 2016 are the sixth-most among American League lefties.
• Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
• According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP.
• Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA (17.1 IP, 1 ER).
• Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
• His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
• Went 10-6 with a 3.62 ERA (50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
• Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8, 2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games (19 starts).
• Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
