THE TWINS：The Twins completed their six－game roadtrip with a record of 4－2，going 1－2 vs the Yankees and 3－0 vs．the Blue Jays．．．tonight they will begin a seven－game homestand with four against the Tigers this weekend（split doubleheader tomorrow），followed by three against the Angels from Monday－Wednesday．．．the Twins have won 14 of their last 19， 10 of their last 13 and six of their last eight．．．the Twins are 4－2 when following an off－day．

TWINS BRING BROOMS TO BLUE JAYS：The Twins beat the Blue Jays on Wednesday night by a score of 9－1，sweeping in three games，marking their fifth sweep of an opponent this season．． Kyle Gibson（3－1）was the starter and winner，allowing one run on two hits in 6.0 innings with a career－high 11 strikeouts．．．the offense recorded 18 hits，five from Jorge Polanco，his second five－hit game this season，and they hit four two－run homers：Polanco，Eddie Rosario，C．J．Cron and Jonathan Schoop．．．despite the nine runs and 18 hits，the Twins went 1－for－9 with RISP．

INSIDE THE ROADTRIP：Numbers from the Twins 4－2 roadtrip：
क Twins out－scored the Yankees and Blue Jays 31－14 and out－hit them 58－32
$\mp$ Twins pitching posted a 1.76 ERA（51．0 IP， 10 ER）with opponents hitting． 180 and 10.4 strikeouts－per－9．0 innings pitched．．．the starting staff went 4－2，1．50 ERA（36．0 IP， 6 ER ） with opponents hitting ． 183 and 11.5 strikeouts－per－ 9.0 innings pitched．
$\Phi$ The staff posted a streak of 25.0 consecutive scoreless innings from mid－game Sunday through mid－game Wednesday，their longest since September 1－4， 2004 （also 25．0）．
$\Phi$ The one run allowed over the three－game series in Toronto was the fewest for the Twins in a series since allowing none in three games July 5－7， 2004 vs．Kansas City．．．it marked the sixth time ever to allow one run－or－fewer in a Twins series： 1 vs．TOR in Sept．1981， 1 vs．TEX in Sept．1976， 1 vs．DET in Aug．of 1975， 1 vs．BOS in Aug．of 1967，and above mentioned KC series．

玉 64 homers are the most for a Twins club through the first 35 games．．．next most was 61 in 1964.

POLANCO POP：Since September 1，2018，Jorge Polanco is hitting ． 328 （ 80 －for－244）with 17 doubles，five triples， 10 home runs， 28 RBI， 36 runs scored， 23 walks and a 950 OPS．．．．since that date，he leads all MLB shortstops in average，hits，OBP（．389），and OPS．

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY：In 1997，a streak of 19 straight steals by Twins baserunners is stopped when Denny Hocking is caught stealing，the Twins fall to the Blue Jays，6－4．．．in 2000，the Twins defeat the Indians，10－9，overcoming an 8－1 deficit at the Metrodome．． it still remains the biggest comeback in Twins history．．．in 1932，Twins legendary radio broadcaster Herb Carneal was born in Richmond， VA．．．Herb worked 46 seasons behind the microphone for the Twins and passed away in 2007.

## JAKE ODORIZZI

- He is making his eighth start and appearance of the season
- He is making his 166 th career start and 169th career appearance.


W-W-W-W: Odorizzi has won each of his last four starts (beginning April 17), with a miniscule 1.11 ERA ( $24.1 \mathrm{IPP}, 3 \mathrm{ER}$ ), six walks, 23 strikeouts, a $1.07 \mathrm{WHIP}, .222$ opponents' batting average ( 20 -for90) and .545 opponents' OPS.

- Since April 17, Odorizzi is tied for the Major League lead for wins (matching Twins rotation-mates josé Berríos and Martín Pérez), while ranking second for ERA (behind only Detroit's Spencer Turnbull, at 0.75).
- The winning streak features victories over Toronto, Houston (twice) and the New York Yankees... Odorizzi's 1-0 triumph over Justin Verlander and the Astros on April 29 marked the Twins' first 1-0 win over a former Cy Young Award-winning pitcher since Sept. 7, 1976 (1-0 against Gaylord Perry and the Texas Rangers).

ODO-METER: For the season, Odorizzi ranks third in the American League with a 190 average against (24-for-126), eighth with a 2.75 ERA ( 35.2 IP, 11 ER), 12 th with a 1.09 WHIP ( 15 BB ) and 13 th by striking out 9.59 batters per 9.0 innings ( 38 SO ).
CAN'T TOUCH THIS: Not only has Odorizzi been tough to scratch out a hit against (third-lowest opponents' batting average in the AL), but he's been even harder to square up - he's allowed just four extra-base hits, tied for the fewest in the majors among pitchers with at least four starts and 20.0 innings pitched.

- His 254 opponents' slugging percentage is second-best in the AL (NYY's Domingo Germán has the lowest at .245 ), while is .536 OPS against ranks third.
- Of the 89 balls put in play against Odorizzi, only 24 have been hit hard (defined as an exit velocity at or above 95.0 MPH )... his 27.0 percent hard-hit rate is the sixth-lowest in baseball (min. 80 batted balls).
- Odorizzi has recorded a 30.9 percent miss rate this season, sixth-best in the American League... in his last start (Saturday at New York-AL), Yankee hitters swung and missed at 54.5 percent of Odorizi's fastballs - just the third time he's recorded a plus-50 percent swing rate on his fastball, and first since 2014 (courtesy: Inside Edge).
LAST TIME OUT: Odorizzi ran his winning streak to four-straight last Saturday at Yankee Stadium, tossing 6.0 shutout innings of two-hit baseball in the Twins' eventual 7-3 victory...walked four and struck out eight, his most punchouts since his first start of the season (career high-tying 11 on March 30 vs. Cleveland).
- Allowed just two runners to reach second base, walking a pair of batters in both the first and fourth innings, but escaped the jam both times. Both Yankees hits were singles, while one (DJ LeMahieu) was subsequently wiped out on a pick-off.

AGAINST THE TIGERS: Odorizzi is 3 -1 with a 3.77 ERA ( $43.0 \mathrm{IP}, 18$ ER) in eight career starts against Detroit... his last start came September 26, 2018, allowing four runs on six hits in 3.0 innings pitched and did not factor into the decision....last win came September 18, 2018 at Comerica, allowing two runs on four hits in 6.1 innings pitched in a Twins $5-3$ victory.

- The Twins won all four games Odo started against the Tigers in 2018 , while he personally was
$1-0$ with a 5.59 ERA ( 19.1 IP, 12 ER).
ON TARGET AT HOME: In his first three starts at Target Field this season, Odorizzi is $2-0$ with a 0.96 ERA ( 18.2 IP, 2 ER), 0.80 WHIP and .167 opponents' batting average (11-for-66), with four walks and 24 strikeouts.
- His 0.96 home ERA is second-best in the American League, behind only NYY's James Paxton ( 0.40 )...his WHIP ( 0.80 ) and opponents' batting average (.167) rank second and fourth, respectively.
- In his first 19 home starts with the Twins, 0dorizzi is 7-4 with a 3.99 ERA (99.1 IP, 44 ER) and a . 242 opponents' average ( 92 -for-380), with 34 walks and 105 strikeouts...the Twins are 12-7 when he takes the mound at Target Field ( $2-1$ in 2019).
FLY AWAY: After posting the lowest ground ball percentage in baseball last season at 28.7 percent, Odorizzi again leads the majors in 2019 at 26.2 percent...in fact, since his first full big league season (2014), 0do has the third-lowest ground ball mark in the game at 33.5 percent.

SPECIAL K: With his career-high-tying, 11-strikeout performance March 30 vs. Cleveland, Odorizi teamed with José Berríos ( 10 Ks on Opening Day against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30 -start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 159 starts since 2014 (teammate Kyle Gibson is tied for fifth with 156)...he is also sixth in that span with a . 234 opponents batting average.

- Only Corey Kluber (167), Rick Porcello (165) and Justin Verlander (161) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the last $5+$ seasons.
- Chris Sale (.214), Kluber (.223), Verlander (.224), Carlos Carrasco (.233) and Marco Estrada (.234) are the five with lower opponent averages in that same span

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi has opened 2019 by relying on his four-seam fastball at a greater rate than any other pitch, as referenced by his 55.2 percent usage rate.. his full-season high is 54.1 percent, which came in 2018 with the Twins....between 2014-18 with Tampa Bay, his fastball usage ranged from a high of 49.4 percent (2017) to a low of 31.1 (2016)...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitches according to Baseball Savant:

## CAREER NDTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berríos (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
