BIG MIKE'S RETURN TO BRONX SPOILED BY YANKEE BATS: In his last start, May 5 against the Yankees in the Bronx, Pineda pitched 5.0 innings and received his third loss of the year, allowing four runs (three earned) on six hits and three walks with a season-high eight strikeouts in a 4-1 loss...in what was his first start in Yankee Stadium since July 5, 2017 vs. Toronto, his final start before undergoing "Tommy John" surgery on his pitching elbow, Pineda allowed four runs (all with two outs), including a two-run single to DJ LeMahieu in the second inning and a two-run homer to Mike Tauchman in the fourth.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES: In Pineda's first three starts of his comeback campaign (all Twins wins), "Big Mike" went 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA ( 15.0 IP, 5 ER), a . 241 opponents batting average ( 13 -for-54) and .689 OPS, along with 15 strikeouts and a WHIP of 1.00 ...in his last four outings (all Twins losses), Pineda is 0-3 with an 8.53 ERA (19.0 IP, 18 ER), a . 361 opponents average ( 30 -for-83) and 1.040 OPS, along with 15 strikeouts and a WHIP of 1.95 .

WALK HARD: Through seven starts this year, Pineda has only issued nine free passes in 34.0 innings pitched...owns 717 career strikeouts, 166 walks and a lifetime $\mathrm{SO} / \mathrm{BB}$ ratio of 4.32 , sixth best among pitchers currently on a 25 -man roster (min. 700.0 IP )...he hasn't issued more than three walks since July 31, 2016 at Tampa Bay, a stretch of 35 starts... is one of 13 starters with an active streak of $35+$ starts and less than four walks (full list is below).

AGAINST DETROIT: Pineda is making his sixth career start against Detroit, second this year...faced the Tigers on April 13 at Target Field, recording 4-3 victory after allowing three runs in 6.0 innings pitched, his first quality start in more than 600 days...owns a career record of 2-2, 4.03 ERA ( $29.0 \mathrm{IP}, 13 \mathrm{ER}$ ), with 34 strikeouts to just six walks vs. the Tigers...owns a lifetime 5.67 SO/BB ratio against them, his fourth-highest against any American League opponent (Minnesota - 10.00, Tampa Bay - 6.06 and Baltimore - 5.80 ).

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Dominican-born right-hander owns a career 3.88 ERA ( 371.1 IP, 160 ER) at home, as opposed to a 4.44 ERA ( 342.2 IP, 169 ER) on the road...this season, Pineda has a 6.75 ERA ( 18.2 IP, 14 ER) in four starts at Target Field, and is 1-3 lifetime here with a 6.42 ERA ( 33.2 IP, 24 ER in seven starts overall.

THE REPERTOIRE: Coming into 2019, Pineda relied on high-velocity fastball, as referenced by the 59.6 percent (2011), 29.7 (2014), 38.7 (2015), 47.6 (2016) and 47.9 (2017) usage rates for his fastball that averaged 94.08 MPH each year....similarly this season, has thrown the fastball 56.0 percent of the time at 92.0 MPH , despite a 2.0 MPH drop in velocity this season....below is Baseball Savant's breakdown of Pineda's pitches and usage in 2019:

ANSWER THE CALL: Stewart is making his second start this season in Game Two of today's doubleheader against the Tigers after being recalled from Triple-A Rochester earlier today... will be the 10th appearance of his big league career, the sixth start, after pitching four games as the "primary pitcher" in September of 2018, logging four starts in August and making one start this season on April 24 at Houston.

LAST TIME UP WITH THE BIG CLUB: Made season debut April 24 when he was recalled from Triple-A to start against the Astros...made the start at Minute Made Park, about 30 miles from his hometown of Tomball, Texas...threw 105 pitches over 6.0 innings and was dealt the loss as Houston beat the Twins 7-1...Stewart pitched a scoreless first but allowed a home run to Carlos Correa in the second...the righty gave up three hits in the third, leading to a two-run home run by Michael Brantley, before allowing a lead-off walk to score on a double by Robinson Chirinos, who later scored from second on a pair of wild pitches..
