THE TWINS: After completing their six-game roadtrip with a record of 4-2, going 1-2 vs. the Yankees and 3-0 vs. the Blue Jays, the Twins began their seven-game homestand with a win over the Tigers last night...today they will play games two and three of this four-game series...following tomorrow afternoon's series finale, the Twins will begin a three-game series with the Angels from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 15 of their last 20, 11 of their last 14 and seven of their last nine.

TWINS BLANK ANOTHER OPPONENT: The Twins beat the Tigers last night by a score of 6-0, their fifth shutout of an opponent this season and third in their last four games...Jake Odorizzi (5-2) was the starter and winner, pitching 7.0 shutout innings with one hit allowed, no walks and five strikeouts...the offense recorded seven hits, highlighted by home runs from Mitch Garver (8) and Max Kepler (8)...Jorge Polanco added three RBI.

ROSTER SHUFFLE: Who's in, who's out...

- ☞ Left-handed pitcher Martín Pérez has been placed on Paternity List...Pérez appeared in eight games (5 starts) for the Twins, going 5-0, 2.83 ERA (41.1 IP, 13 ER), 16 walks and 39 strikeouts.
- ☞ Kohl Stewart recalled...made five starts for the Red Wings, going 2-2 with a 4.50 ERA (20.0 IP, 10 ER), nine walks and 23 strikeouts.
- ☞ Tyler Duffey recalled as 26th man...Duffey posted a 1.69 ERA (5.1 IP, 1 ER) with two walks and seven strikeouts for the Twins in April.

HANGING EMPTY FRAMES: The Twins pitched their fifth shutout last night, tied with Cincinnati for second most in baseball, trailing Chicago-NL (6)...they have recorded three shutouts in their last four games (8-0 on Monday at TOR, 3-0 Tuesday at TOR and 6-0 last night over DET)...38 of the Twins last 39 innings pitched have been scoreless (only run allowed came in the fifth inning on Wednesday on a Billy McKinney solo homer)...they had seven shutouts in 2018.

DOING THE SPLITS: The Twins are playing their second doubleheader of the season today...below are the doubleheaders since the start of 2018:

NOTE: The last doubleheader the Twins played, they hit 11 home runs on the day and fell one short of the club record of 12 (in one day), done August 29, 1963 vs. Washington...eight home runs in game two tied a club record, done previously August 29, 1963...Nelson Cruz, Mitch Garver and Jonathan Schoop each had multi-homer games, tying a club record for most players with multiple homers in same game (July 12, 2001 at Milwaukee - Jacque Jones, Corey Koskie and Torii Hunter)...Eddie Rosario also had a multi-homer game in game one, making the Twins the first team in baseball history with four multi-homer games in one day.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins are 3-0 vs. Detroit this season...Twins have won five straight over the Tigers and nine of their last 10 over Detroit, dating back to August 19.

- ☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .309 (29-for-94) with four doubles, six home runs and 22 RBI in 24 career games vs. DET...has eight hits in last 23 at-bats with seven RBI vs. Tigers.
- ☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .330 (30-for-91) with six doubles, seven home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.052 OPS in his last 23 vs. the Tigers.
- ☞ Jorge Polanco is hitting .338 (22-for-65) with eight multi-hit games vs. DET since 2018.

WE DIG THE LONG BALL: The Twins have hit 66 home runs, tied for third most in baseball with Los Angeles-NL and Milwaukee, and trailing Seattle (75) and Houston (69)...66 homers are the most for a Twins club through the first 36 games, the next most being 63 in 1964...they are pace to hit 297 homers, which would pass the club record of 225 in 1963.

☞ Former player/coach/manager and broadcaster Frank Quilici was born on this day in 1939...he passed away on May 14, 2018 at age 79.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS/SENATORS FRANCHISE HISTORY: In 1919, Walter Johnson of the Washington Senators pitched 12 scoreless innings in a duel with Jack Quinn of the New York Yankees at the Polo Grounds...Johnson allowed only two hits and retired 28 batters in-a-row...the Senators moved to Minnesota prior to the 1961 season...Johnson is the Senators/Twins franchise all-time leader in wins (417), starts (666), games (802), ERA (2.17), complete games (531), innings pitched (5914.2) and shutouts (110).
