THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 2-2 through four games on their seven-game homestand, going 2-2 vs. the Tigers over the weekend...tonight they will begin a three-game series with the Angels through Wednesday...the Twins have won 16 of their last 23, 12 of their last 17 and eight of their last 12.

TWINS SPLIT WITH TIGERS: The Twins lost to the Tigers yesterday afternoon by a score of 5-3, splitting the four-game series...Martin Pérez (5-1) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched, exiting the game with a foot contusion after a come-backer from Nicholas Castellanos...the Twins recorded 10 hits, marking just the second time this season the Twins have lost while having double-digit hit totals...the bottom three in the Twins lineup combined to go 7-for-10, including a season-high three hits from Byron Buxton...the Twins left 11 men on base and went 1-for-5 with runners in scoring position.

MINNESOTA: The Twins enter tonight with the best winning percentage in baseball, having gone 25-14, .641...below is where the Twins rank in baseball in terms of winning percentage:

NOTE: It's the latest date that Minnesota has had the best record in MLB since being 92-60 through September 23 in the 2010 season.

TWINS AND HALOS: The Twins went 3-4 against the Angels last season, going 2-2 at Angel Stadium from May 10-13 and 1-2 at Target Field from June 8-10...the Twins scored 25 runs to the Angels 27 and the Twins recorded 58 hits to the Angels 57...the Twins have gone just 3-5 in their last eight but are 13-8 in their last 21, dating back to September 20, 2015.

- ☞ Nelson Cruz is hitting .286 (195-for-683) with 28 doubles, 50 home runs, 125 RBI, 57 walks and 106 runs scored in 186 career games vs. the Angels...the hits, homers, RBI, walks, runs and games are all his most vs. any opponent...
- ☞ Cruz leads all actives vs. LAA in homers, RBI and total bases (373)...only Alex Rodriguez (70) has more home runs all-time against the Angels franchise...among active players, only Albert Pujols has more home runs against any single opponent (vs. HOU - 59 and vs. CHC - 57).
- ☞ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .323 (21-for-65) with eight doubles and 11 walks in his last 19 games vs. the Angels.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .333 (8-for-24) in his last six games vs. LAA.
- ☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .320 (24-for-75) in 21 career games vs. LAA.

TWINS & ANGEL TIES:

- ☞ Blake Parker pitched two seasons for the Angels from 2017-18, going 5-4, 2.90 ERA (133.2 IP, 43 ER) with 22 saves in 28 opportunities...he led the Angels in saves in 2018, going 14-for-17.
- ☞ C.J. Cron was drafted by the Angels 17th overall in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft...he played parts of four seasons with the Angels, from 2014-17, hitting .262 (358-for-1366) with 68 doubles, 59 home runs and 213 RBI in 408 games...he played 289 games at first base for the Angels and 99 games as designated hitter.
- ☞ Mike Morin was drafted by the Angels in the 13th round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft and pitched parts of four seasons with Los Angeles from 2014-17, going 10-8, 4.49 ERA (164.1 IP, 82 ER) with one save, 45 walks and 154 strikeouts...from 2014-17, he appeared in 167 games for the Halos, third most on the club for that span, trailing Fernando Salas (187) and Joe Smith (184).
- ☞ Twins hitting coach James Rowson was a hitting coach in the Angels system from 2002-05.
- ☞ Twins third base coach Tony Diaz was drafted by California in the 46th round of the 1995 First-Year Player Draft.

WE DIG THE LONG BALL: The Twins have hit 71 home runs, third most in baseball, trailing Seattle (78) and Houston (75)...they rank second to Houston (1.83) in home runs-per-game with 1.82...they are on pace to hit 294 homers, which would pass the club record of 225 in 1963.

☞ Twins have seven players with six-plus homers (Rosario - 13, Cron - 9, Garver - 8, Kepler - 8, Cruz - 7, Polanco 7 and Schoop - 6)...trailing only Seattle (8 players) for most in baseball.

BACKSTOPS WITH THE BATS: Catchers Willians Astudillo, Jason Castro and Mitch Garver have combined to hit .333 (44-for-132) with 11 doubles, 14 home runs, 33 RBI and 34 runs scored when catching...at catcher, Garver has made 18 starts, Castro has made 16 starts, while Astudillo has made five starts...where those three combined offensive numbers rank in baseball compared to other team's catchers: first in home runs (14), slugging percentage (.750), OPS (1.166) and batting average (.333), tied for first in RBI (33), second in OBP (.416), and tied for third in doubles (11) and hits (44).

BUCK DOUBLING DOWN: Byron Buxton has 17 doubles this season, two short of his single-season career-high of 19, done in 2016...he enters today leading all of baseball in doubles, ahead of Ryon Healy (16), Paul DeJong (15) and David Peralta (15)...additionally, in 11 games this month, Buxton is hitting .333 (12-for-36) with five doubles, one triple, four walks, seven runs scored and a .928 OPS.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1989, Kirby Puckett tied a major league record with four doubles against the Toronto Blue Jays...he became the 35th player to hit four doubles in a game, the first since Toronto's Damaso Garcia in 1986...16 players have accomplished the feat since, the most recent to do so being David Peralta with Arizona on April 22, 2017 against Los Angeles-NL.

FANTASTIC FIVE: Berríos has won a career-best five consecutive starts since April 14...over the streak he has posted a 2.76 ERA (32.2 IP, 10 ER), with four walks and 30 strikeouts...he has held opponents to a .240 average, and is averaging 8.27 SO/9.

- Has gone three consecutive starts without walking a batter (20.0 IP) and has four such outings this year (and two others with just one free pass)...has gone three straight starts now without a walk to tie a career-long streak (April 7-18, 2018).
- Is one of two Twins starters to be currently riding five-starting winning streaks, joining Jake Odorizzi.

LAST PERFORMANCE: He tossed 7.0 shutout innings in a 3-0 win over Toronto on May 7 at Rogers Centre, giving up four hits while recording five strikeouts without a walk.

DELIVERING QUALITY: Berríos is tied for first in the American League lead alongside Matthew Boyd, Gerrit Cole and Justin Verlander with seven quality starts (tied for second-most in baseball), while each of his starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including four 7.0+ inning efforts).

- His seven quality starts through his first eight marks the best start of his career...in 2018 he had three through his first eight, in 2017 he recorded six and in 2016 he had one quality start.
- Has faced 85 consecutive batters without allowing a walk, the longest active streak in the majors. Among qualified pitchers this season, Berríos' 1.35 BB/9 IP ranks fifth in MLB, and first in the AL.

NO BASES, NO PROBLEMS: Through eight starts, Berríos has struck out 51 batters and walked eight, for a 6.38 SO/BB ratio, which is second best among American League starters and sixth in baseball...Berríos has also only allowed 41 hits and owns a 0.92 WHIP, which is third best for an AL starter and 5th in baseball.

MORE LEADERBOARD LOVE: Berríos leads Twins starters in innings pitched (53.1), wins (6), strikeouts (51), quality starts (6), WHIP (0.92) and SO/BB ratio (6.38), while he is second behind Odorizzi (.169) in opponents batting average (.209).

- Among American League starters, Berríos is tied for first in quality starts (7), second in SO/BB ratio (6.38), tied for second in wins (6), third in WHIP, fourth in opponent OBP (.245), fifth in ERA (2.53), sixth in innings pitched, seventh in opponent OPS (.618) 12th in strikeouts and 13th in opponent batting average.

AGAINST THE ANGELS: Making his third career start against the Angels and first at home, and is 1-1, 5.56 ERA (11.1 IP, 7 ER) with three walks and six strikeouts in his career...his best career start against Los Angeles-AL came on June 4, 2017, throwing 6.0 innings, allowing two runs on six hits with two walks and four strikeouts while earning the win...his last outing came May 10, 2018, he was dealt the loss and allowed five runs on seven hits over 5.1 innings pitched.

JOSÉ'S HOME TURF: He is 22-10, 3.43 ERA (225.1 IP, 86 ER) in 37 career starts at Target Field...in his last 15 home starts, he has gone 10-2, 2.77 ERA (97.1 IP, 30 ER) with a .211 opponent batting average and three double-digit strikeout games (Twins are 12-3 in those 15)...in that span he has only allowed six home runs and has averaged 9.80 SO/9.

- Since Target Field opened in 2010, he ranks second for most wins in the park's history, trailing only Kyle Gibson (25).
- His last loss at home came September 8, 2018 vs. Kansas City, where he threw 6.0 three-hit innings, while allowing just one run with two walks and five strikeouts (KC won 4-1).

PITCH SELECTION: José is throwing his curveball this season at a 32.4 percent usage rate...in 2018 he threw it 30.4 percent of time, 30 percent in 2017 and 21.6 in 2016...he has thrown a total of 763 pitches on the year with 47.9 percent of those landing in the strike zone...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitch arsenal, according to Baseball Savant:

- Given 2018 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins Pitcher of the Year, voted on by the Twin Cities Chapter of the BBWAA...also awarded with the Carl R. Pohlad Community Service Award.
- Became 21st pitcher in Twins history to reach the 200-strikeout mark (202 in 2018).
- Named to 2018 AL All-Star team, threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the All-Star Game.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Pitched for Team Puerto Rico in the 2017 World Baseball Classic, going 1-0, 8.10 ERA (6.2 IP, 6 ER) with two walks and 10 strikeouts.
- Made MLB debut April 27, 2016 vs. Cleveland.
- Named Twins second best prospect entering 2016, as well as best curveball, best changeup, and best control in Twins system by *Baseball America*.
- Named 20th best prospect in baseball by MLB.com entering 2016.
- Started for the World Team in the SiriusXM Futures Games in consecutive seasons, 2014 at Target Field and 2015 at Great American Ball Park in Cincinnati.
- Led all of minor league baseball in strikeouts (175) in 2015.
