**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 3-3 through six games on their seven-game homestand, going 2-2 vs. the Tigers last weekend and 1-1 vs. the Angels the last two nights...today they will play the three-game series finale then travel to the West Coast post-game to begin a seven-game roadtrip...they will play four at Seattle from Thursday-Sunday and Los Angeles-AL from next Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 17 of their last 25, 13 of their last 19 and nine of their last 14.

**PLAY AT PLATE SAVES THE DAY:** The Twins beat the Angels last night by a score of 4-3 evening the series at 1-1...Kyle Gibson (4-1) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.2 innings pitched...Blake Parker earned the save against his former club, his seventh of the season in seven chances...the offense recorded seven hits, highlighted by a Mitch Garver two-run homer in the third inning...Byron Buxton recorded his third outfield assist in the eighth inning, throwing out Shohei Ohtani at the plate with a 98.6 mph throw to end the inning and preserve the Twins' one-run lead.

**SAUCE PLACED ON THE SHELF:** The Twins announced today that they have placed catcher Mitch Garver on the 10-day Injured List with a high left ankle sprain, an injury he suffered in the eighth inning of last night's game against the Angels...Garver played in 25 games this season, hitting .329 (26-for-79) with four doubles, nine home runs, 19 RBI and a 1.164 OPS...to replace Garver on the 25-man roster, the Twins have returned infielder Miguel Sanó from rehab assignment and have reinstated him from the 10-day Injured List...Sanó, who has missed the first 41 games of the season with a right heel laceration, recently played in 10 games on rehab assignment between Single-A Ft. Myers, Double-A Pensacola and Triple-A Rochester, hitting .316 (12-for-38) with four doubles, two home runs, nine RBI and three walks.

**TWINS AND HALOS:** The Twins are looking to win a series over the Angels for the first time since taking two of three at Target Field July 3-5, 2017, having gone 0-1-1 head-to-head since...the Twins will travel to Anaheim for three night games next week where they are 5-3 in their last eight.

- ☞ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .315 (23-for-73) with nine doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI, 11 walks and a .966 OPS in his last 21 games vs. the Angels.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .355 (11-for-31) in his last eight games vs. LAA.
- ☞ Jonathan Schoop is hitting .316 (25-for-79) in 23 career games vs. LAA.
- ☞ Blake Parker pitched two seasons for the Angels from 2017-18, going 5-4, 2.90 ERA (133.2 IP, 43 ER) with 22 saves in 28 opportunities.
- ☞ C.J. Cron was drafted by the Angels 17th overall in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft...he played parts of four seasons with the Angels, from 2014-17.
- ☞ Mike Morin was drafted by the Angels in the 13th round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft and pitched parts of four seasons with Los Angeles from 2014-17.

**MARGO GOING GOOD:** Marwin Gonzalez enters today with a season-long seven-game hitting streak, hitting .360 (9-for-25) with two home runs, five RBI, four walks and a 1.107 OPS during the streak...his career-high is 13, done July 15-August 3, 2016 with Houston...in his last 12 games, since May 2, Gonzalez is hitting .372 (16-for-43) with a 1.018 OPS after starting the season hitting .159 (13-for-82) with a .477 OPS...additionally, the Twins longest hit-streaks this season are: Max Kepler, 10 games March 31-April 14 & Jonathan Schoop, 7 games April 18-26.

**POLANCO POP:** Since September 1, 2018, Jorge Polanco is hitting .320 (85-for-266) with 18 doubles, five triples, 11 home runs, 33 RBI, 38 runs scored, 25 walks and a .930 OPS...since that date, he leads all MLB shortstops in hits, average, OBP, SLG and OPS...below are his American League rankings this season:

**LIVE IN FRONT OF ASTUDILLO AUDIENCE!:** Willians Astudillo is hitting .323 (10-for-31) with three doubles, one home run and three RBI in his last 10 games...he has struck out just twice this season (April 9 at NYM vs. Luis Avilán & last night vs. Taylor Cole)...he is one of six players in major league history with less than 50 games played (49), more than 150 at-bats (155) and less than or equal to five strikeouts (5)...the other five players: PHI-Bill Burgo (1943-44), DET-Jake Wells (1888-90), WAS-Frank Olin (1884-85), PIT/WAS-Jim McDonald (1884-85), HAR/PIT-Live Oak Taylor (1877-84)...however, Olin, Wells, McDonald and Taylor are estimated totals, as the strikeout was not tracked in each season.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY, MORN!:** Former Twins great and FS North analyst Justin Morneau is celebrating his 38th birthday today...he played in eight games on his birthday, hitting .367 (11-for-30) with two doubles, four home runs, eight RBI and four walks...he recorded two two-homer games on his birthday, one coming in 2007 at Cleveland and one in 2009 at New York-AL...he shares a birthday with former Twin Brian Dozier (32), and Hall of Famers John Smoltz (52) and George Brett (66).

**ON THIS DAY IN MINNESOTA BASEBALL HISTORY:** In 1991, Milwaukee's Paul Molitor hit for the cycle in a 4-2 victory over Minnesota...Molitor tripled in the first, singled in the third, doubled in the fifth, and homered in the seventh...Molitor was the Brewers leadoff hitter and designated hitter, while Twins radio broadcaster Dan Gladden led-off for the Twins...Gladden went 1-for-4, singling to center field off Chuck Crim in the eighth inning.

W-W-W-W-W: Odorizzi has won each of his last five starts (beginning April 17), with a 0.86 ERA (31.1 IP, 3 ER), six walks, 28 strikeouts, a 0.86 WHIP, .188 opponents batting average (21-for-112) and .467 opponents OPS.

- Since April 17, Odorizzi leads all of baseball in wins and ERA, and is second in opponents OPS (tops in the American League), while he ranks fifth in the AL (t-11th majors) for WHIP and BAA (12th majors).
• The winning streak features victories over Toronto, Houston (twice), the New York Yankees and Detroit...Odorizzi is one victory shy of matching his career high six-game winning streak, which happened over an eight-start stretch from July 17-August 25, 2016 (with Tampa Bay).

NOTHING BUT ZEROS: Odorizzi brings an active 20.0-inning scoreless streak into today's start, the sixth-longest by a starter in Twins history...he last allowed a run in his sixth and final inning of a start April 22 at Houston, and has since blanked the Astros over 7.0 innings (April 29 at Target Field), the Yankees for 6.0 frames (May 4 in the Bronx) and the Tigers for 7.0 innings (last Friday in the homestand opener).

- During his three-start scoreless stretch, Odorizzi has allowed seven hits (six singles and one double in 66 at-bats, for a .107 BAA), with five walks and 20 strikeouts...the longest scoreless inning streaks for Twins starters:

ODO-METER: For the season, Odorizzi ranks second in the American League with a 2.32 ERA and .169 opponents' batting average (25-for-148), fourth with a 0.94 WHIP (15 BB) and 17th by striking out 9.07 batters-per-9.0 innings (43 SO).

CAN'T TOUCH THIS: Not only has Odorizzi been tough to scratch out a hit against (2nd-lowest opponents' batting average in the AL), but he's been even harder to square up - he's allowed just five extra-base hits, second-fewest in the majors among pitchers with at least five starts and 25.0 innings pitched.

- His .230 opponents' slugging pct. and .480 OPS against are both the lowest in the AL (SLG% is lowest in baseball, OPS is second).
• Of the 106 balls put in play against Odorizzi, only 31 have been hit hard (defined as an exit velocity at or above 95.0 MPH)...his 29.2 percent hard-hit rate is the eighth-lowest in baseball (min. 100 batted balls).
• Odorizzi has recorded a 28.4 percent miss rate this season, 14th-best in the American League.

LAST TIME OUT: Odorizzi ran his winning streak to five-straight in last Friday's homestand opener, tossing 7.0-innings of one-hit, shutout ball in a 6-0 victory over Detroit...did not walk a batter and struck out five.

- Allowed a one-out double to Christin Stewart in the first, then retired his final 20 batters faced.

AGAINST THE ANGELS: Is looking for his first career win against the Halos, having gone 0-3 with a 6.04 ERA (25.1 IP, 17 ER) in his first five appearances (all starts)...will be his first outing against Los Angeles in a Twins uniform, having last faced the Angels on May 22, 2017 (no-decision in a 3-2 LAA victory).

ON TARGET AT HOME: In his first four starts at Target Field this season, Odorizzi is 3-0 with a 0.70 ERA (25.2 IP, 2 ER), 0.62 WHIP and .136 opponents' batting average (12-for-88), with four walks and 29 strikeouts.

- His 0.70 home ERA is second-best in the American League, behind only NYY's James Paxton (0.40)...his WHIP and opponents' batting average are both tops in the AL (2nd in the majors).
• In his first 20 home starts with the Twins, Odorizzi is 8-4 with a 3.72 ERA (106.1 IP, 44 ER) and a .242 opponents' average (93-for-402), with 34 walks and 110 strikeouts...the Twins are 13-7 when he takes the mound at Target Field (3-1 in 2019).

CONSISTENCY IS KEY: Odorizzi, who has made at least 28 starts in five-straight seasons (including a trio of 30-start campaigns), is fourth in the American League with 160 starts since 2014 (teammate Kyle Gibson is tied for fifth with 157)...he is also fourth in that span with a .233 opponents' batting average.

- Only Corey Kluber (167), Rick Porcello (166) and Justin Verlander (162) have made more starts than Odorizzi over the past 5+ seasons.
• Chris Sale (.213), Kluber (.223) and Verlander (.223) are the three with lower BAAs.

PITCH ARSENAL: Odorizzi has opened 2019 by relying on his four-seam fastball at a greater rate than any other pitch, as referenced by his 54.7 percent usage rate...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitches according to Baseball Savant:

SPECIAL K: With his career-high-tying, 11-strikeout performance March 30 vs. Cleveland, Odorizzi teamed with José Berrios (10 Ks on Opening Day against the Indians) to become just the second pair of pitchers in baseball history (since 1893 - when the mound was placed at its current distance to home plate) to start a team's season with consecutive double-digit strikeout totals...the only others to ever do it were Hall of Famer Randy Johnson, along with Curt Schilling, for the 2001 Arizona Diamondbacks.

CAREER NOTES

- Finished 2018 with 32 starts, his fifth-straight season with at least 28 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and José Berrios (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
• Was Twins Opening Day starter March 29, 2018 at Baltimore, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, two walks and seven strikeouts...first Opening Day start of career.
• Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
• On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters faced, tied for third-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
• Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
• Earned his first major league win on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - MICHAEL PINEDA, RHP [SEASON: 2-3, 5.85 ERA ; CAREER: 42-44, 4.15 ERA]

Pineda makes his ninth start and appearance of the season in tomorrow night's series opener in Seattle...is 2-3, 5.85 ERA (40.0 IP, 26 ER) through the first eight outings of his comeback season...Twins have lost his last five starts, while he is 0-3 with a 7.56 ERA (25.0 IP, 21 ER)...Minnesota won his first three starts, while he was 2-0, 3.00 ERA (15.0 IP, 5 ER)...did not factor in the decision (a 5-3 loss) in Game 1 last Saturday vs. Detroit, despite a quality start (6.0 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 5 SO)...originally signed by the Mariners as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005 and pitched for Seattle in 2011...went 1-1, 5.71 ERA (17.1 IP, 11 ER) in three starts vs. the M's while with the Yankees...will mark his 126th Major League start and appearance.
