THE TWINS: The Twins completed their seven-game homestand with a record of 4-3, going 2-2 vs. the Tigers over the weekend and 2-1 over the Angels this week...tonight they will begin a seven-game roadtrip with the first of four in Seattle...following this series, the Twins will travel to Anaheim for three against the Angels from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 18 of their last 26, 14 of their last 20 and 10 of their last 15.

TWINS TAKE RUBBER GAME OVER HALOS: The Twins beat the Angels yesterday afternoon at Target Field by a score of 8-7...Jake Odorizzi (6-2) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs on nine hits in 5.1 innings pitched...Twins pitchers allowed a season-high 18 hits, but just five going for extra-bases...the Twins offense recorded 10 hits, highlighted by homers from Byron Buxton (2) and Jason Castro (6).

ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have selected the contract of right-handed pitcher Austin Adams from Triple-A Rochester...Adams, 32, appeared in 11 games (1 start) for the Red Wings, going 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (18.0 IP, 9 ER), one save, six walks, 28 strikeouts and an opponent batting average of .229...the Montgomery, Alabama native was originally drafted by Cleveland in the fifth round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft and was signed by the Twins as a minor league free agent in August of 2018...he appeared in 53 games for the Indians from 2014-16, going 2-0 with one save, a 6.29 ERA (58.2 IP, 41 ER), 21 walks and 44 strikeouts.

☞ To make room on the 25-man roster, the Twins have optioned right-handed pitcher Trevor Hildenberger to Triple-A Rochester...in 19 games this season, he allowed 13 runs on 24 hits in 14.0 innings pitched (8.36 ERA).

☞ To make room on the 40-man roster, the Twins have designated right-handed pitcher Addison Reed for release or assignment...Reed, who has been on rehab assignment with Rochester this season with a left thumb sprain, appeared in five games (1 start) for the Red Wings, allowing eight runs on 13 hits with five strikeouts.

M'S and TC's: The Twins and Mariners are playing the first of seven games this season (3 games at Target Field June 11-13)...the Twins went 1-5 vs. the Mariners last season and enter today with a five-game losing streak to Seattle...their last series in Seattle was May 25-27 of last season, getting swept in three games...five of the six games last season were decided by two runs-or-fewer...the Twins last win in Seattle came on June 8, 2017 in a 2-1 victory (Kyle Gibson over Christian Bergman)...Twins are looking to avoid losing six straight to the M's for the first time since May 5-August 28, 2012, when they dropped seven in-a-row.

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .324 (23-for-71) with eight home runs, 15 RBI, 15 walks, a .442 on-base percentage and a 1.202 OPS in 21 career games against the Mariners.

☞ Nelson Cruz spent the last four seasons in Seattle, playing in 606 games, hitting .284 (640-for-2254) with 95 doubles, 163 home runs and 414 RBI...he was named to the AL All-Star team three times with the Mariners in 2015, 2017 and 2018...he led the AL in RBI in 2017, driving in 119 and earning a Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Award.

MARGO GOING GOOD: Marwin Gonzalez enters today with a season-long seven-game hitting streak, hitting .360 (9-for-25) with two home runs, five RBI, four walks and a 1.107 OPS during the streak...his career-high is 13, done July 15-August 3, 2016 with Houston...in his last 12 games, since May 2, Gonzalez is hitting .372 (16-for-43) with a 1.018 OPS after starting the season hitting .159 (13-for-82) with a .477 OPS...additionally, the Twins longest hit-streaks this season are: Max Kepler, 10 games March 31-April 14, & Jonathan Schoop, 7 games April 18-26.

'SOTA POP: The Twins have homered in 10 straight games, their longest streak of the season...it marks their longest stretch since homering in 16 straight from September 1-17, 2017...the Twins have hit 76 home runs, third most in baseball, trailing Seattle and Houston, both with 83.

☞ The Twins have homered in 33 of 42 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 20 of 42 games, going 15-5 in those games...they are on pace to hit 293 home runs, which would pass the club record of 225, done in 1963.

☞ The Twins have eight players with six-plus home runs: Rosario - 13, Cron - 9, Garver - 9, Kepler - 8, Polanco - 8, Cruz - 7, Castro - 6, Schoop - 6...only Seattle has as many players with six-plus homers in all of baseball.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2010, Jason Kubel hit an eighth inning grand slam off Mariano Rivera for a 6-3 win at new Yankee Stadium...Rivera had converted a record-tying 51 consecutive save opportunities at home and had not given up a grand slam since 2002; the runs were also the first he allowed that season.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY, BLACK JACK: Hall of Famer Jack Morris is celebrating his 64th birthday today...during his 18-year major league career, he pitched one game on his birthday, that coming in 1987, pitching a complete game over Cleveland at Tiger Stadium, allowing three runs on five hits with 11 strikeouts...he shares a birthday with University of Minnesota baseball coach John Anderson (65), actress Megan Fox (33), pop singer Janet Jackson (53), actor Pierce Brosnan (66), and former Nirvana bassist and local Seattle legend Krist Novoselic (54).

TIGERS OH MY: Pineda enters tonight's start after receiving a no-decision last Saturday against Detroit in a Twins 3-5 defeat at Target Field...pitched 6.0 innings, allowing three runs on six hits, and a trio of home runs, his season-high (one away from tying his career-high)...struck out five in the outing and did not issue a walk for the second time this season, and just the fifth time since the beginning of 2017...in eight starts this season, is 2-3 with a 5.85 ERA (40.0 IP, 26 ER) with 35 SO.

• Of his six career starts vs. the Tigers, this marks the first time allowing more than one home run in a game...he allowed one on June 11, 2011 (Jonny Peralta) and one on April 13 of this year (Christin Stewart).

WALK HARD: Through eight starts this year, Pineda has only issued nine free passes in 40.0 innings pitched...owns 722 career strikeouts, 166 walks and a lifetime SO/BB ratio of 4.35...he hasn't issued more than three walks since July 31, 2016 at Tampa Bay, a stretch of 36 starts...is one of 13 starters with an active streak of 36+ starts and less than four walks (full list is below).

AGAINST THE MARINERS: Pineda brings a lifetime 1-1 record with a 5.71 ERA (17.1 IP, 11 ER) against the Seattle Mariners into tonight's start...has not seen the Mariners since before his "Tommy John" surgery, with his last appearance at T-Mobile Park coming on August 22, 2016 in a 5-7 loss, as a member of the New York Yankees...threw 5.1 innings in that start, striking out six, while allowing five runs (all earned) on seven hits...is 1-0 at T-Mobile Park with a 5.56 ERA (11.1 IP, 7 ER) with 15 strikeouts and four walks in two starts.

• Signed as a free agent with the Mariners in 2005, and made his Major League Debut with them in 2011...in his rookie season, he was named an All-Star and finished fifth in balloting for American League Rookie of the Year...went 9-10 with a 3.74 ERA (171.0 IP, 71 ER) with 55 walks and 173 strikeouts.

ROAD WOES: The Dominican-born right-hander owns a career 4.44 ERA (342.2 IP, 169 ER) on the road, as opposed to a 3.89 ERA (377.1 IP, 163 ER) at home...this season, Pineda is 1-1 on the road, with a 5.28 ERA (15.1 IP, 9 ER) with six walks and 17 strikeouts and is 1-2 at Target field, 6.20 ERA (24.2 IP, 17 ER) with three walks and 18 strike outs.

THE REPERTOIRE: Coming into 2019, Pineda relied on high-velocity fastball, as referenced by the 59.6 percent (2011), 29.7 (2014), 38.7 (2015), 47.6 (2016) and 47.9 (2017) usage rates for his fastball that averaged 94.08 MPH each year...similarly this season, has thrown the fastball 55.3 percent of the time at 92.0 MPH, despite a 2.0 MPH drop in velocity this season...below is Baseball Savant's breakdown of Pineda's pitches and usage in 2019:

TOMORROW'S STARTER - MARTÍN PÉREZ, LHP [SEASON: 5-1, 3.11 ERA ; CAREER: 48-50, 4.55 ERA]

Pérez will be on the bump tomorrow, marking his seventh start this season after being dealt the loss May 12 vs. Detroit, snapping a five-game winning streak...allowed three runs on four hits over 5.0 IP in a 3-5 defeat at Target Field... left the game with a left foot contusion in the fifth inning after getting hit by a Castellanos line drive... will be making his 20th career start against the Mariners and 10th at T-Mobile Park...owns a 7-5 lifetime record with a 3.38 ERA (109 IP, 41 ER) with 41 walks and 73 strikeouts...the last time he faced the Mariners came September 28 of last season where he allowed two runs on one hit over 1.2 innings pitched as a member of the Texas Rangers.

CAREER NOTES

- Spent the entire 2018 season on the Injured List, recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on right elbow.
- Appeared in four minor league games in 2018, allowing two runs over 12.0 innings pitched.
- Was shut down due to right knee discomfort suffered while throwing a bullpen in late August.
- Struck out 207 batters over 175.2 innings pitched in 2016, setting the fifth-lowest innings total for a pitcher who recorded 200+ strikeouts in American League history.
- Was an AL All-Star in 2011 as a member of the Seattle Mariners, posting a 3.03 ERA (113.0 IP, 38 ER) with 113 strikeouts and an opponents average of .198 in the first half, and finished the year fifth in the AL Rookie of the Year voting.
- In 2011, he became one of 27 rookie pitchers in the Expansion Era (1961-present) to throw at least 171.0 innings and strikeout 173 or more batters, and first since Daisuke Matsuzaka (Boston, 2007).
- Was signed by Seattle as a 16-year-old undrafted free agent December 12, 2005.
- He owns a farm in his native Dominican Republic, where he raises chickens in addition to growing a number of crops.
