THE TWINS: After completing their seven-game homestand with a record 4-3 (2-2 vs. the Tigers over the weekend and 2-1 over the Angels this week), the Twins began their seven-game roadtrip with a win over the Mariners last night...the Twins will continue the trip tonight with the second of four in the Pacific Northwest...following this series, the Twins will travel to Anaheim for three against the Angels from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 19 of their last 27, 15 of their last 21 and 11 of their last 16.

TWINS START ROAD RIGHT: The Twins beat the Mariners last night at T-Mobile Park by a score of 11-6...Michael Pineda (3-3) was the starter and winner, allowing three runs on five hits in 7.0 innings, with no walks and six strikeouts...the offense recorded 16 hits, four from C.J. Cron and three from Eddie Rosario...the Twins hit four home runs: Max Kepler (9), Cron (10), Jason Castro (7) and Byron Buxton (3).
ROSTER MOVE: The Twins announced today that they have placed designated hitter Nelson Cruz on the 10 -day Injured List with a left wrist strain (retroactive to May 14)...Cruz has hit .270 (34-for-126) with seven home runs, nine doubles and 22 RBI over 35 games with the Twins this season...to replace Cruz on the 25 -man roster, the Twins have recalled infielder Luis Arraez from Triple-A Rochester...Arraez was recently promoted to Rochester after hitting . 342 ( 50 -for-146) with a 415 on-base percentage at Double-A Pensacola...in three games at Triple-A, Arraez went 5 -for-14, hitting safely in all three games....ver parts of six minor league seasons with the Twins, Arraez hit a combined . 331 (455-for-1376) over 356 games... signed out of Venezuela as an international free agent in 2013, Arraez is looking to make his major league debut.
M'S and TC's: The Twins and Mariners are playing the second of seven games this season (3 games at Target Field June 11-13)...last night's win snapped a five-game losing streak to the Mariners.
玉 C.J. Cron has homered in three straight against Seattle...he is hitting . 304 (21-for-69) with nine RBI and 12 runs scored in his last 18 vs. the Mariners.
$\Phi$ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .320 (95-for-297) with 21 doubles, 18 home runs, 43 RB and a . 942 OPS in 90 career games vs. the Mariners....he has hit safely eight straight games against Seattle, hitting 387 (12-for-31) during that span
$\Phi$ Miguel Sanó is hitting .329 ( 25 -for-76) with seven doubles, eight home runs, 16 RBI, 15 walks, a 440 on-base percentage and a 1.203 OPS in 22 career games against the Mariners.
क Eddie Rosario is hitting .352 (19-for-54) with four doubles, one triple, five home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.127 OPS in 16 career games against Seattle... he has multiple hits in each of his last three games vs. the M's.

MARGO GOING GOOD: Marwin Gonzalez enters today with a season-long eight-game hitting streak, hitting . 345 (10-for-29) with two home runs, five RBI, five walks and a 1.043 OPS during the streak...his career-high is 13, done July 15-August 3, 2016 with Houston...in

'SOTA POP: The Twins have homered in 11 straight games, their longest streak of the season...it marks their longest stretch since homering in 16 straight from September 1-17, 2017 ...the Twins have hit 80 home runs, third most in baseball, trailing Seattle (87) and Houston (83) $\Phi$ The Twins have homered in 34 of 43 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 21 of 43 games, going 16-5 in those games...they are on pace to hit 301 home runs, which would pass the club record of 225, done in 1963.
$\Phi$ The Twins have a home run-per-game ratio of 1.86 , third best in baseball, trailing Seattle (1.89) and Houston (1.89)
C.J. CRUSH: C.J. Cron hit his 10th home run last night....he now has double digit homers in each of his six seasons in the big leagues.. he needs one home run to reach 100 for his career...in his last nine games, he is hitting . 405 ( 15 -for-37) with one double, four home runs, eight RBI, a 1.220 OPS and three four-hit games.

REMEMBERING HARMON: On this day in 2011, Twins legend Harmon Killebrew passed away at age 74 in Scottsdale, AZ after being diagnosed with esophageal cancer....Killebrew played 21 seasons for the Twins/Senators franchise, from 1954-1974...he was the 1969 AL MVP and was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1984...Killebrew is the club's all-time leader in home runs (475), RBI (1,325), walks $(1,321)$ and games $(1,939)$.

- He is making his seventh start and 10th appearance of the season.
- He is making his 135 th career start and 151 st career appearance.


LAST START: Was the starter and loser, May 12 vs. Detroit opposite Daniel Norris, allowing three runs on two home runs over just 5.0 IP in a $5-3$ Tigers victory....marked his shortest outing as a starter this season, but he did compile seven strikeouts...snapped his winning streak at five games, his longest since a seven-game stretch from August 9-September 8, 2017 (with Texas)... the two home runs allowed matched his total from the previous eight outings (five starts).

## LET'S GET IT STARTED:

- In six starts this season, is $4-1$ with a 2.13 ERA ( $38.0 \mathrm{IP}, 9 \mathrm{ER}$ ), $9 \mathrm{BB}, 34 \mathrm{SO}$ and a .213 opponents average (29-for-136)...five of the six starts have been at least 6.0 IP, with four of them being quality starts.
- Since joining the rotation on April 15 , Pérez ranks tied for fifth in baseball in wins (tied with Berríos and Gibson, trailing only Odorizzi, Germán, Verlander and Woodruff), is tied for 11th in innings pitched and 13th in ERA.
- Pérez reached a couple of milestones in his start on May 6, eclipsing 800.0 career innings pitched while also recording his 500th strikeout, becoming just the 19th Venezuelan-born major leaguer to reach the 500 -strikeout mark.
- Made three relief appearances prior, pitching to a 7.56 ERA ( $8.2 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{ER}$ ) on 11 hits, nine walks and 12 strikeouts with a 1-0 record.

AGAINST THE MARINERS: Is making his first start and appearance against the Mariners this season...in 21 career games ( 19 starts) against Seattle, he owns a $7-5$ record with a 3.38 ERA (109.1 IP, 41 ER ), 41 walks and 73 strikeouts...has seen the M's more than any other opponent in baseball, due to his extensive time as a starter for the Texas Rangers.

- In his last start here in Seattle, Pérez struggled with his command as he allowed five runs (two earned) on one hit and a career-high five walks in just 1.2 innings pitched on September 28 of last year, suffering a 12-6 loss.
- Has a career 3.83 ERA ( $47.0 \mathrm{IP}, 20 \mathrm{ER}$ ) in 10 games (9 starts) at T-Mobile Park, but is just 2-4 in those outings.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Enters tonight 2-0, 4.08 ERA (17.2 IP, 8 ER) in four games (two starts) away from Target Field...last threw away from home on May 6 in Toronto when he tossed 7.0 shutout innings and set a career-high with nine strikeouts...coming into that start, he owned a $6.75 \mathrm{ERA}(10.0 \mathrm{IP}, 8 \mathrm{ER}$ ) on the road...by comparison, he has gone 3-1, 2.51 ERA (28.2 IP, 8 ER) in five games (4 starts) at home this season.

REVERSE SPLITS: Pérez has posted an opponent batting average of 223 (33-for-148) with 11 extra-base hits to right-handed batters this season while lefties are hitting . 304 (7-for-23) with no extra-base hits...for his career righties have hit . 295 and lefties have hit .2444...below is a breakdown of how he has used each pitch depending on handedness this season entering today's start:

- His 515.1 innings since 2016 are the sixth-most among American League lefties.
- Battled through injury in 2018 after breaking his non-throwing arm in the offseason after being charged by his pet bull.
- According to Inside Edge, opponents had a groundball rate of 67.3 percent (37/55) against

Pérez's changeup in 2018, the highest in Major League Baseball with at least 80.0 IP .

- Made three starts at three different stops on rehab assignment last season, Single-A Hickory, Double-A

Frisco and Triple-A Round Rock, going 2-0, 0.52 ERA ( $17.1 \mathrm{IP}, 1 \mathrm{ER}$ ).

- Led the Rangers in wins (13-career high), starts (32) and innings (185.0) in 2017, while setting a career-best in strikeouts (115).
- His career-high 198.2 IP in 2016 were the sixth-most by a Texas pitcher age 25-or-younger and the most since José Guzmán in 1988.
- Went $10-6$ with a 3.62 ERA ( 50 ER in 124.1 IP) in 2013, ranking tied for first among American League rookies in wins, second in ERA and third in both starts (20) and quality starts (11).
- Was named Rangers Nolan Ryan Minor League Pitcher of the Year after combining to go 6-8,
2.90 ERA (37 ER in 114.2 IP ) with 119 strikeouts in 27 games ( 19 starts).
- Entered 2008 as the youngest player in the Northwest League and was rated by Baseball America as the second-best prospect in the NWL, fifth-best in the Rangers' organization.
