**THE TWINS:** After completing their seven-game homestand with a record 4-3 (2-2 vs. the Tigers over the weekend and 2-1 over the Angels this week), the Twins began their seven-game roadtrip with two wins over the Mariners...the Twins will continue the trip tonight with the third of four in the Pacific Northwest...following this series, the Twins will travel to Anaheim for three against the Angels from Monday-Wednesday...the Twins have won 20 of their last 28, 16 of their last 22 and 12 of their last 17.

**PÉREZ ROLLS TO TWINS FOURTH STRAIGHT:** The Twins beat the Mariners last night by a score of 7-1...Martín Pérez (6-1) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on five hits in 6.2 innings pitched...the offense recorded 10 hits, two from Ehire Adrianza, Marwin Gonzalez and Max Kepler...Adrianza hit his third home run of the season, a solo shot off Marco Gonzales in the third inning...the Twins went 4-for-8 with runners in scoring position.

☞ Twins have won four straight, their season long, done four times this season...their last five-game win-streak came at the end of last season, winning six straight to finish the year.

**TWINS-MARINERS:** The Twins and Mariners are playing the third of seven games this season (3 games at Target Field June 11-13)...the Twins are looking to win three straight vs. the Mariners for the first time since May 27-29, 2016.

☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .306 (22-for-72) with five home runs, nine RBI and 14 runs scored in his last 19 vs. the Mariners.

☞ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .321 (97-for-302) with 21 doubles, 18 home runs, 43 RBI and a .940 OPS in 91 career games vs. the Mariners...he has hit safely nine straight games against Seattle, hitting .389 (14-for-36) during that span.

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .313 (25-for-80) with seven doubles, eight home runs, 16 RBI, 15 walks, a .421 on-base percentage and a 1.146 OPS in 23 career games against the Mariners.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .352 (19-for-54) with four doubles, one triple, five home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.127 OPS in 16 career games against Seattle...he has multiple hits in each of his last three games vs. the M's.

**OUR RUNS ARE BETTER THAN YOUR RUNS:** The Twins have a run differential of +63, scoring 240 runs and holding opponents to 177...it marks the second best in the American League, behind Houston (+89), and third best in baseball (Los Angeles-NL - +64)...by comparison, in the AL Central, Cleveland is at 0, Chicago is at -37, Detroit is at -86 and Kansas City is at -37.

**MARGO STREAKING:** Marwin Gonzalez enters today with a season-long nine-game hitting streak, hitting .353 (12-for-34) with two home runs, five RBI, five walks and a 1.009 OPS during the streak...his career-high is 13, done July 15-August 3, 2016 with Houston...in his last 13 games, since May 2, Gonzalez is hitting .365 (19-for-52) with a .969 OPS after starting the season hitting .159 (13-for-82) with a .477 OPS.

**'SOTA POP:** The Twins have homered in 12 straight games, their longest streak of the season...it marks their longest stretch since homering in 16 straight from September 1-17, 2017...the Twins have hit 81 home runs, third most in baseball, trailing Seattle (87) and Houston (84).

☞ The Twins have homered in 35 of 44 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 21 of 44 games, going 16-5 in those games...they are on pace to hit 298 home runs, which would pass the club record of 225, done in 1963.

**'PEN PALS:** The Twins are 26-1 when leading after six innings...the Twins have gone 13-for-14 in save opportunities for a 92.9% success rate, the best in baseball...of the eight relievers the Twins currently have in their 'pen, five have ERA's at 2.00-or-less: Blake Parker (1.17), Taylor Rogers (1.47), Ryne Harper (1.50), Mike Morin (1.50) and Matt Magill (2.00)...the eight relievers combined have thrown 91.1 innings for the Twins with a 1.97 ERA and a .215 opponents batting average.

☞ Twins relievers have walked just 59 batters this season, sixth fewest in baseball, third fewest in the American League.

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1962, Bob Allison and Harmon Killebrew hit grand slams in the first inning to lead the Minnesota Twins to a 14-3 victory over Cleveland...in 1969, Rod Carew stole second base, third, and home plate during the third inning of an 8-2 loss to Detroit...Carew pulled off the trifecta against the battery of Mickey Lolich and Bill Freehan and became the first player in 28 years to steal three bases in sequence in the same inning...Cesar Tovar also stole two bases in the game.

### BERRÍOS NOTES FROM REMARKABLE BY INSIDE EDGE:

☞ Has thrown his curveball 25.1% of the time (46/183) when he's behind in the count this season -- 4th highest among qualified SPs in MLB; League Avg: 9.2%.

☞ Opponents have a chase percentage of 52.2% (71/136) against Berríos with two strikes this season -- 2nd highest in MLB among starting pitchers with at least 21 IP; League Avg: 39.0%.

☞ Has allowed six stolen bases this season -- tied for 7th most in MLB.

**LAST START:** Berríos suffered his second loss of the year on May 23 vs. the Angels after allowing five runs on a career-high 12 hits, and three walks with three just strikeouts over 5.2 innings... this start snapped a streak of eight straight starts of 6.0+ innings, tying the longest of his career...the loss also snapped a six game winning streak.

• His three strikeout performance marks the fewest since July 4, 2018 at Milwaukee where he sat down three batters...out of his 80 career starts, he has struck out three or fewer batters in just 17 of those starts...since making it to the show in 2016, he owns a 8.78 SO/9 ratio which ranks first among Twins starters in that time span.

**AGAINST SEATTLE:** This will be Berríos' fourth start against the Mariners, going 1-2 with a 4.05 ERA (20.0 IP, 9 ER) over his previous three starts...his most recent start was May 27, 2018 when he suffered the loss after throwing 7.1 innings and surrendering two runs on eight hits, walking one and striking out eight while allowing a home run...his lone win came on June 15, 2017, his first start against the Mariners, went 8.0 innings and allowed just two runs on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts...currently has a two game-losing streak against Seattle, stemming back to April 7 of last season...he is looking to earn his first career road win against the Mariners.

**DELIVERING QUALITY:** Berríos is tied for second in the American League with seven quality starts (tied for fourth-most in baseball), while eight out of his nine starts have gone at least 6.0 innings (including four 7.0+ inning efforts).

• His seven quality starts through his first eight marks the best start of his career...in 2018 he had three through his first eight, in 2017 he recorded six and in 2016 he had one quality start.

**LEADERBOARD LOVE:** Berríos leads Twins starters in innings pitched (59.0), strikeouts (54), quality starts (7) and SO/BB ratio (4.91), while he is second behind Odorizzi (1.06) in WHIP (1.08).

• Among American League starters, Berríos is tied for second in quality starts (7) and is tied for second in wins (6).

**HOT STREAK:** Since September 28, 2018, Berríos' is 7-2 with a 2.86 ERA (66.0 IP, 21 ER) with 15 walks and 63 strikeouts over 10 total starts...has lasted 6.0+ innings in nine of those starts over that stretch, the longest by a Twin since Ervin Santana did so for 11 straight starts from April 3-May 29, 2017...his 63 strikeouts are 10th most in the AL...only Domingo German of the New York Yankees has more wins in the AL over that stretch (8) and his seven wins are second most in baseball.

**ROAD WOES:** In 42 career road starts, Berríos is 13-17 with a 5.05 ERA over 224.1 innings...of the 61 home runs Berríos has surrendered in his career, 43 have been at opposing ballparks as opposed to 18 at home...owned a 3-7 away record in 2018 with a 4.85 ERA (85.1 IP, 46 ER).

• However, has a 2-1 record with a 3.12 ERA (26.0 IP, 509 ER) in four road starts this year and has lasted 6.0+ innings in each outing.

• In just one career start at T-Mobile Park that came May 27, 2018, he is 0-1, 2.45 ERA (7.1 IP, 2 ER) with one walk and eight strikeouts.

**PITCH SELECTION:** José is throwing his curveball this season at a 34.0 percent usage rate...in 2018 he threw it 30.4 percent of time, 30 percent in 2017 and 21.6 in 2016...he has thrown a total of 864 pitches on the year with 52.0 percent of those landing in the strike zone...below is the breakdown of his 2019 pitch arsenal, according to Baseball Savant:

- Became 21st pitcher in Twins history to reach the 200-strikeout mark (202 in 2018).
- Named to 2018 AL All-Star team, threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the All-Star Game.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with Kyle Gibson (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33, and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Pitched for Team Puerto Rico in the 2017 World Baseball Classic, going 1-0, 8.10 ERA (6.2 IP, 6 ER) with two walks and 10 strikeouts.
- Made MLB debut April 27, 2016 vs. Cleveland.
- Named Twins second best prospect entering 2016, as well as best curveball, best changeup, and best control in Twins system by *Baseball America*.
