THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 3-0 to start their seven-game roadtrip...the Twins will play the four-game series finale this afternoon then travel to Anaheim for a three-game series with the Angels...the Twins have won 21 of their last 29, 17 of their last 23 and 13 of their last 18.

TWINS GET OFFENSIVE IN SEATTLE: The Twins beat the Mariners last night by a score of 18-4...José Berríos was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing four runs on eight hits in 4.2 innings pitched...Austin Adams made his Twins debut, pitching 2.0 scoreless innings with one hit allowed and four strikeouts...the Twins offense recorded 19 hits, including six home runs, two from both Jonathan Schoop and C.J. Cron...Miguel Sanó and Byron Buxton each added a homer-a-piece.

☞ The Twins hit six home runs last night, already the fifth time this season they've hit five or more homers in a game...they are the first team in MLB history to have five such games before the start of June.

☞ 18 runs scored yesterday marked the highest this season and tied the Dodgers for the most runs scored in a game this season (March 30 vs. ARZ)...Minnesota raised its run differential to plus-77, which trails only the Astros (plus-93)...they have scored 258 runs in 45 games, their highest total in their first 45 games of any season in franchise history (includes time as Washington Senators)...the previous high was 245 set by the 1925 Senators, who were also shutout just once in their first 45 games.

☞ Twins recorded 11 extra-base hits last night, marking the second time this season with 11 XBH...their high is 13, done on April 20 at Baltimore in Game 2 of the double header.

TWINS-MARINERS: The Twins and Mariners are playing the fourth of seven games this season (3 games at Target Field June 11-13)...the Twins are looking to win four straight vs. the Mariners for the first time since winning five straight July 30-August 28, 2010.

☞ C.J. Cron is hitting .321 (25-for-78) with seven home runs, 13 RBI and 17 runs scored in his last 20 vs. the Mariners.

☞ Marwin Gonzalez is hitting .325 (100-for-308) with 22 doubles, 18 home runs, 43 RBI and a .944 OPS in 92 career games vs. the Mariners...he has hit safely 10 straight games against Seattle, hitting .405 (17-for-42) during that span.

☞ Miguel Sanó is hitting .310 (26-for-84) with seven doubles, nine home runs, 18 RBI, 16 walks, a .416 on-base percentage and a 1.154 OPS in 24 career games against the Mariners.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .367 (22-for-60) with four doubles, one triple, five home runs, 12 RBI and a 1.113 OPS in 17 career games against Seattle...he has multiple hits in each of his last four games vs. the M's.

MARGO STREAKING: Marwin Gonzalez enters today with a season-long 10-game hitting streak, hitting .375 (15-for-40) with two home runs, five RBI, five walks and a 1.032 OPS during the streak...his career-high is 13, done July 15-August 3, 2016 with Houston...in his last 13 games, since May 2, Gonzalez is hitting .379 (22-for-58) with a .989 OPS after starting the season hitting .159 (13-for-82) with a .477 OPS.

☞ Only Manny Machado and Andrelton Simmons have hitting streaks longer, both at 11.

HOMER HAPPY: The Twins have homered in 13 straight games, their longest streak of the season...it marks their longest stretch since homering in 16 straight from September 1-17, 2017...the Twins have hit 87 home runs, tied with Seattle for the most in baseball.

☞ The Twins have homered in 36 of 45 games this season and have hit multiple home runs in 22 of 45 games, going 17-5 in those games...they are on pace to hit 313 home runs, which would pass the club record of 225, done in 1963.

☞ The Twins have collected 5+ home runs in five games this season, a major league-high...to put it into perspective, only two other teams have done so while 14 teams have yet to notch one such game.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2008, in a 7-6 Twins victory over the Royals, rookie Bobby Korecky recorded his first major league win with 1.2 innings of scoreless relief...more notably, he hit a single, the first Twins pitcher ever to get a hit outside an Interleague contest since the enactment of the designated hitter rule in 1973.

TWINS ML WEEKLYS: Single-A Ft. Myers first baseman Lewin Diaz and Single-A Cedar Rapids right-handed pitcher Andrew Cabezas have been named Twins minor league Player and Pitcher of the Week...Diaz played in six games for the Miracle, hitting .333 (9-for-27) with one double, three home runs, six RBI and a 1.037 OPS...Diaz, 22, was signed out of Santiago de los Caballeros, Dominican Republic in July of 2013...Cabezas made the start on Wednesday vs. Quad Cities, pitching 7.0 shutout innings with one hit allowed, no walks and nine strikeouts...Cabezas, 22, was drafted by the Twins in the 18th round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft from the University of Miami.

THIS AND THAT:

☞ Eddie Rosario has gone 20 consecutive at-bats without a strikeout, fourth-longest stretch in baseball behind Cincinnati's José Peraza (29), Atlanta's Brian McCann (22) and St. Louis' Kolten Wong (22).

☞ Twins hitters have homered 34 times in 353 PAs (9.6%) with the pitcher behind in the count this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: 5.4%.

☞ Twins hitters have 12 home runs on changeups this season -- most in MLB.

☞ Twins hitters have a Well-Hit Avg. of .262 (79/301) against LHP this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: .171.

☞ Twins hitters have an OPS of .901 (883 PAs) on the road this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: .745.

☞ Twins runners have stolen 0 bases against LHP this season -- tied for fewest in MLB.

☞ Jorge Polanco is batting .423 (33-for-78) on outside pitches this season -- best in MLB; League Avg: .236

LAST START: Lasted just 5.2 innings pitched on Tuesday against the Angels, but held them to just three runs (all in the top of the sixth inning) as the Twins earned the 4-3 win, in large part due to 3.1 stellar innings from their bullpen in relief of Gibson...held the Halos hitless through the first turn around the order before a leadoff single by Tommy La Stella put an end to any thoughts of a no-hit bid...kept Los Angeles off the board until the sixth, when Gibson began to lose some control as the inning went: walk, RBI double, single, wild pitch, strikeout, RBI single, single before being lifted for Ryne Harper, who stranded the runner on first...exited with 88 pitches, 50 strikes, one out shy of qualifying for his second consecutive quality start.

AGAINST THE M's: The right-hander is making his 10th career start against the Mariners, first this season...owns a career line of 4-2 with a 3.38 ERA (53.1 IP, 20 ER) against Seattle...only faced the M's once last season, back on April 5 in Minneapolis, allowing two runs (one earned) with seven hits and three strikeouts over just 4.1 innings pitched...in Seattle, Gibson has earned a 2-1 record with a 3.00 ERA (24.0 IP, 8 ER) with 13 strikeouts in four starts, with his last start here coming on June 8, 2017, when he yielded just one run on five hits and three walks with four strikeouts over 6.0 innings pitched in a 2-1 Twins victory...out of the 14 Mariners who saw the field that day, only three are still affiliated with the organization, (Dan Altavilla is currently pitching for Double-A Arkansas, Christian Bergman is currently pitching for Triple-A Tacoma and Kyle Seager is currently on the 60-day Injured List).

KEEPING THINGS CONSISTENT: Gibson enters tonight's start tied for the fifth-most starts (157, with Boston's Chris Sale) and the eighth-highest innings pitched total (920.1) in the American League since the beginning of 2014...he also ranks first in opponents grounding into double plays (123, most in baseball), 13th in wins (56) and 16th in strikeouts (701).

MAY FLOWERS: Kyle owns a career record of 7-7, 3.43 ERA (133.2 IP, 51 ER) with 45 walks and 107 strikeouts in the month of May...his 3.43 career ERA and his .249 opponents batting average are both his monthly lows...he went 0-2, 3.75 ERA (36.0 IP, 15 ER) with four home runs, 14 walks and 36 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .237 average in six May starts last season, but is 2-1, 3.24 ERA this May.

FUN WITH STATCAST: So far through 2019, Gibson has seen the most success with his slider, as opponents are hitting just .140 (6-for-43) against it, and 25 of his 45 strikeouts have come via the slider (51.8 whiff percentage)...conversely, batters have seen the most success against his curveball, going 4-for-12 with two singles and two home runs, with an average exit velocity of 92.0 against the hook and an wOBA of .501 (weighted on-base average).

THE SHERIDAN STORY: Gibson, along with catcher Jason Castro, are proud to support The Sheridan Story, an organization dedicated to fighting child hunger in Minnesota...the innovative organization serves more than 6,500 kids in over 200 schools - with the aid of strong community partnerships... Kyle will donate \$100 for every Twins win while Jason will contribute \$250 per victory...coming into today's start, Gibson is set to donate \$3,000.

- Named 2018 Charles O. Johnson Award for Most Improved Twin, also Mike Augustin "Media Good Guy" award.
- Since the start of 2014 has induced 123 ground ball double plays, the most in baseball...teammate Martín Pérez is third with 111.
- Finished 2018 with 32 starts; along with José Berríos (32) and Jake Odorizzi (32), they became the first trio of Twins with 30-plus starts in the same season since 2007 (Johan Santana - 33, Carlos Silva - 33 and Boof Bonser - 30).
- Won 50th career game August 11 at Detroit, allowing one run on seven hits in 7.0 innings.
- Recorded double-digit win totals four times in career (13 in 2014, 11 in 2015, 12 in 2017 and 10 in 2018).
- Was given the 2015 Joseph W. Haynes Award for Twins pitcher of the Year as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA.
- His 2.85 ERA pre-ASG in 2015 was the fourth-lowest for a Twins starter since 1992 with a minimum of 80.0 IP (Liriano - 1.83 in 2006, Santana - 2.75 in 2007, Radke - 2.77 in 1998).
- In 2014, his first full season in the majors, became one of three pitchers in Twins history to win each of their first three games while posting a sub-1.00 ERA.
